HOUSE BILLS

HB3481 By Representative HOLVEY -- Relating to a severance tax on the harvest of timber; prescribing an effective date; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

3-9(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Imposes severance tax on harvest of timber from forestlands in Oregon to fund income tax credit for milling of logs in Oregon, income tax credit for production or collection of biomass, fire suppression, watershed enhancement programs and woodstove certification program, and for distribution to counties.

HB3482 By Representative HOLVEY -- Relating to pesticide application reporting; declaring an emergency.

3-9(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires state agency or local government to keep records of pesticide applications made by public applicator or public trainee employed by state agency or local government.

HB3483 By Representative GREENLICK -- Relating to solemnization of marriage.

3-9(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Adds secular organizations and parties to marriage to list of persons and entities authorized to solemnize marriages.

HB3484 By Representative MCLAIN -- Relating to donation of surplus revenue refunds; prescribing an effective date.

3-9(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies method by which taxpayers may donate surplus revenue refunds to funding of education.

SENATE BILLS

SB 254 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for State Department of Agriculture) -- Relating to annual fees for motor vehicle fuel metering devices; declaring an emergency.

1-20 Referred to Business and Transportation, then Finance and Revenue.

2-11 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

2-17 Recommendation: Do pass and be referred to Finance and Revenue by prior reference.

Increases fee on motor vehicle fuel metering instrument or device in accordance with graduated schedule.

SB 424 By Senator KRUSE (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to exceptions to the requirement to sell gasoline blended with ethanol.

1-20 Referred to Business and Transportation.

3-2 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

3-4 Recommendation: Do pass.

Second reading.

3-5 Third reading. Carried by Thomsen. Passed.

3-9(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

This measure has minimal fiscal impact, no statement issued.

Provides that retail dealer, nonretail dealer or wholesale dealer may sell or offer for sale gasoline that is not blended with ethanol if gasoline is for use in motorcycles.

SB 623 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION -- Relating to alcohol.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Referred to Business and Transportation.
