HOUSE BILLS

HB3486 By Representatives KENY-GUYER, GREENLICK; Representative NOSSE, Senators KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON – Relating to prescription drugs.

3-11(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires manufacturer of prescription drug with annual wholesale acquisition cost of \$10,000 or more, or with wholesale acquisition cost of \$10,000 or more per course of treatment, to file annual report with Oregon Health Authority on costs associated with prescription drug for previous calendar year.

HB3487 By Representative HUFFMAN – Relating to advertisements for licensed investigators; declaring an emergency.

3-11(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires licensed investigator to include investigator's name and license number in all advertisements for investigator's services.

HB3488 By Representatives ESQUIVEL, DOHERTY, KENNEMER – Relating to prohibitions on payments required under instruments that condition a transfer of an interest in real property.

3-11(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts specified instruments that condition transfer of fee simple interest in real property from prohibition on fee, commission or other payment to declarant or other person upon transfer of interest in real property.

HB3489 By Representative BOONE, Senator ROBLAN (at the request of Pacific NorthWest Economic Region) – Relating to applicants for registration as professional engineers.

3-11(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying to waive fundamentals of engineering examination and practical engineer's examination requirements for professional engineer registration applicant who has held professional engineer registration or license in another jurisdiction for specified period.

SB 4 By Senator COURTNEY (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to the definition of "animal rescue entity".

advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Health Care and Human Services) – Relating to payment for health services; declaring an emergency.

(at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Oregon Youth Authority) – Relating to apprenticeship programs in Oregon Youth Authority institutions; declaring an emergency.

SB 364 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Judiciary) – Relating to the classification of marijuana offenses; declaring an emergency.

Requires court to consider marijuana offenses committed before July 1, 2013, to be classified as if conduct occurred on July 1, 2013, when determining if person is eligible for order setting aside conviction.

SB 533 By Senator EDWARDS, Representative WHISNANT; Senators HANSELL, KNOPP, Representatives BARKER, HUFFMAN, LIVELY – Relating to authority to proceed at a stop light.

Provides that peace officer may enter motor vehicle and impound animal when peace officer is authorized by law and has probable cause to believe animal is being subjected to certain criminal offenses.
