HOUSE BILLS

HB 3490 By Representative BARTON – Relating to child support for child conceived as a result of rape.

3-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits court or administrator from entering or issuing judgment or order requiring payment of child support by one parent to another parent of child conceived as result of rape when parent to whom child support would otherwise have been paid is person who committed rape and parent who would be obligated to pay child support is person against whom rape was committed.

HB 3491 By Representative CLEM – Relating to pesticides; declaring an emergency.

Establishes Task Force on Pesticide Use Notification.

(at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Rural Communities and Economic Development) – Relating to patrolling by county law enforcement officials; declaring an emergency.
