HB 3503 By Representatives WILLIAMSON, OLSON – Relating to offenders with minor children.

3-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Corrections to establish Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program in partnership with circuit courts, county community corrections agencies and Department of Human Services.

HB 3504 By Representative EVANS – Relating to a paid sick leave tax credit; prescribing an effective date.

Creates income tax credit for certain employers that are required to provide paid sick leave, with restrictions.

(at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Water Resources Department) - Relating to a pilot program for the temporary transfer of water use within a district.

(at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon State Bar Workers' Compensation Section) – Relating to notice of closure of workers' compensation claims; declaring an emergency.
