HOUSE BILLS

HB3514 By Representatives BARRETO, HACK, Senator HANSELL; Representatives BUEHLER, ESQUIVEL, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, WHITSETT, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, JOHNSON, KNOPP, OLSEN, ROBLAN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT – Relating to tax credit in compensation for wolf depredation; prescribing an effective date.

4-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Repeals sunset of tax credit for compensation for loss of livestock due to wolf depredation.

HB3515 By Representatives BARRETO, HACK, Senator HANSELL; Representatives BENTZ, BUEHLER, ESQUIVEL, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, WHITSETT, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, JOHNSON, KNOPP, OLSEN, ROBLAN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT – Relating to listing of gray wolf as threatened or endangered species; declaring an emergency.

4-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits State Fish and Wildlife Commission from including gray wolf on list of threatened or endangered species.

HB3516 By Representative NATHANSON, Senator DEMBROW; Representatives HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, READ, WHISNANT, Senators GIROD, KNOPP, RILEY, ROBLAN – Relating to oversight of programs offering academic degrees.

4-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires each school obtaining approval from Higher Education Coordinating Commission to offer academic degree to annually obtain bond or letter of credit demonstrating school is financially sound and capable of fulfilling commitments to students.

HB3517 By Representatives KENY-GUYER, GREENLICK; Representative GILLIAM – Relating to improving the health of Oregonians; declaring an emergency.

4-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to provide medical assistance, within available funds, to low income children residing in Oregon if necessary to move toward goals of Legislative Assembly expressed in law and to improve health of Oregon communities.

SENATE BILLS

SB 83 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Education and Workforce Development) – Relating to teacher training; declaring an emergency.

1-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

1-20 Referred to Education.

3-24 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

3-30 Recommendation: Do pass with amendments. (Printed A-Eng.)

4-1 Third reading. Carried by Roblan. Passed. Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Gelser.

This measure has minimal fiscal impact, no statement issued.

Establishes supervised clinical practice experience requirements for applicants for initial teaching license.

SB 671 By Senator HANSELL, Representative BARRETO; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BATES, BOQUIST, GIROD, JOHNSON, MONNES ANDERSON, MONROE, ROBLAN, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS, Representatives HUFFMAN, MCLANE, RAYFIELD, SMITH – Relating to property conveyances to the City of Pendleton.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

2-19 Referred to Rules.

3-24 Public Hearing and Work Session held.
