HOUSE BILLS

HB 2019 By Representatives KOTEK, HOYLE, Senators FERRIOLI, COURTNEY, ROSENBAUM (at the request of Governor Kate Brown) – Relating to the Oregon Government Ethics Commission; declaring an emergency.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands membership of Oregon Government Ethics Commission from seven members to nine members on July 1, 2016.

HB 2020 By Representatives KOTEK, HOYLE, Senators FERRIOLI, COURTNEY, ROSENBAUM – Relating to government ethics; declaring an emergency.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Alters definition of "public official."

Prohibits Governor, First Partner, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General and Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries from receiving money or other consideration for speaking engagement or presentation.

HB 3518 By Representative LIVELY – Relating to fiscal emergencies in units of local government; declaring an emergency.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires governing body of local government or special government body to notify Governor when local government or special government body is insolvent.

HB 3519 By Representative OLSON – Relating to employment benefits.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires employers to implement paid time off for employees.

HB 3520 By Representative KENNEMER (at the request of Common Sense for Oregon) – Relating to land use.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits local government from restricting industrial use of regionally significant industrial area without express written consent of affected landowners.

HB 3521 By Representative BUCKLEY – Relating to a week to celebrate independent media.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Designates third week in April of each year as Independent Media Week.

HB 3522 By Representative VEGA PEDERSON (at the request of Department of Environmental Quality) – Relating to water quality permit fees.

4-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies that Environmental Quality Commission may increase water quality permit fees by greater amount than provided for in statute if greater amount is legislatively approved.

HB 3523 By COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS – Relating to the State Library.

Reorganizes mission and governance of State Library.
