## HOUSE BILLS

**HB 3526** By Representative KOTEK – Relating to Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program; declaring an emergency.

4-8(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program within Oregon Business Development Department for purpose of awarding grants to participants in Oregon Main Street Network and members of National Main Street Center for purposes of preservation-based community revitalization and economic development.

**HB 3527** By Representatives WEIDNER, NOSSE; Representative HACK – Relating to Task Force on Lysosomal Storage Disorder Screenings; declaring an emergency.

4-8(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Lysosomal Storage Disorder Screenings to study feasibility of and barriers to pilot project using certain screening technologies.

**HB 3528** By Representative POST – Relating to firearms.

4-8(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes requirement that state, during prosecution for unlawful transfer of firearm, prove defendant knew or should have known that recipient of transferred firearm was prohibited from possessing firearms.

**HB 3529** By Representative HOYLE, Senator ROBLAN – Relating to public education on wildlife; declaring an emergency.

4-8(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Wildlife Public Education Advisory Council to advise State Fish and Wildlife Director on public education about wildlife.

**HB 3530** By Representative HOYLE – Relating to vision care providers.

4-8(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits specified terms imposed on vision care provider by vision care insurance or vision care discount card.
