SENATE BILLS

SB 236 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Oregon State Police) – Relating to the authority of the Department of State Police to enter into real property agreements; declaring an emergency.

(at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon Law Commission) – Relating to juvenile court records; declaring an emergency.

SB 561 By Senator GELSER; Senators BATES, BURDICK, DEMBROW, DEVLIN, EDWARDS, HASS, JOHNSON, MONNES ANDERSON, MONROE, PROZANSKI, RILEY, ROBLAN, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to suicide; declaring an emergency.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop plan for communication among local mental health authorities and systems to improve notifications and information-sharing when death suspected to be suicide involves individual 24 years of age or younger.

SB 752 By Senators KNOPP, EDWARDS – Relating to air quality regulation of biomass; declaring an emergency.
