HB 3546 By Representatives BENTZ, MCKEOWN; Representatives BARKER, ESQUIVEL, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, KENNEMER, KOMP, KRIEGER, PARRISH, SMITH, VEGA PEDERSON, WHISNANT, Senators GIROD, HANSELL, KRUSE, OLSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS (at the request of Oregon Cattlemen's Association) - - Relating to habitat projects by cattle producers; declaring an emergency.

4-22(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Finds and declares that Baker, Crook, Harney, Lake and Malheur Counties are qualitatively different and unique sage grouse habitat, making counties separate and distinct class for purposes of levying state tax assessment.

HB 3547 By Representatives GILLIAM, BARKER, CLEM - Relating to political consulting by people affiliated with the Legislative Assembly; declaring an emergency.

Requires member of Legislative Assembly to file statement of paid political activity with Secretary of State if member, or immediate family member of member, serves as paid candidate campaign consultant.

(at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for State Board of Massage Therapists) - Relating to therapeutic touching.
