## SENATE BILLS

**SB 137** Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Business and Transportation) – Relating to applications of the prevailing rate of wage to certain public works projects; declaring an emergency.

This measure has minimal fiscal impact, no statement issued.

Changes definition of public works for purpose of applying prevailing rate of wage to include project that uses \$750,000 or more of funds of public agency for constructing, reconstructing, painting or performing major renovation on road, highway, building, structure or improvement of any type.

**SB 173** By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Kevin M. Hall) (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to firearms in public buildings.

Directs Housing and Community Services Department to submit report related to housing stabilization programs to interim legislative committees no later than July 1, 2016.

Prohibits law enforcement agency from obtaining by forensic imaging information from portable electronic device without warrant except when authorized by consent.

Requires Department of Human Services and its contractors to assist noncustodial parent, who resides in Oregon, in specified ways to obtain home and community-based services for nonresident child during child's visitation with parent for six weeks or more.

**SB 759** By Senators GELSER, WINTERS, KNOPP, JOHNSON, Representatives GALLEGOS, SPRENGER; Senators BOQUIST, DEVLIN, GIROD, HANSELL, KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON, OLSEN, ROSENBAUM, THOMSEN, Representatives BARTON, KENY-GUYER, OLSON, PILUSO, SMITH WARNER, VEGA PEDERSON – Relating to sexual assault at post-secondary institutions of education.

Requires public universities, community colleges and Oregon-based private universities and colleges to adopt written protocol for victims of sexual assault.

**SB 781** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to exemptions from the operation of the Insurance Code for certain associations; declaring an emergency.

Requires Department of Justice to encourage and support services, programs and curricula to educate and inform students in grades 7 through 12 about domestic violence.

**SB 840** By Senator BATES; Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives FREDERICK, GREENLICK (at the request of Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems) – Relating to persons with chronic mental illness; declaring an emergency.

Authorizes licensed independent practitioner to initiate or approve prehearing detention in hospital or nonhospital facility of person who is subject of civil commitment proceedings.
