**SB 237** Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Oregon State Police) – Relating to authority of designees of the Oregon State Athletic Commission.
