HB 3548 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives BARRETO, BUEHLER, DAVIS, ESQUIVEL, HACK, KENNEMER, KRIEGER, MCLANE, NEARMAN, OLSON, POST, SPRENGER, STARK, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, WILSON – Relating to elections.

Prohibits receiving compensation for collecting and returning ballots and assisting electors if compensation is based on number of ballots collected and returned or number of electors assisted.

HB 3549 By COMMITTEE ON RULES – Relating to pesticide control; declaring an emergency.

Requires State Forestry Department to collect and analyze information regarding sufficiency of existing legal requirements to protect certain areas in proximity to forestland from impacts due to application of pesticides by aircraft.
