## SENATE BILLS

**SB 1508** Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Business and Transportation) – Relating to Workers' Compensation Management-Labor Advisory Committee member term limits.

Provides that certain statutory provisions relating to eligibility of individuals who perform certain services for educational institutions for unemployment insurance benefits during period between two successive academic years or terms or established and customary vacation period or holiday recess do not apply to claim filed by individual who voluntarily left work with good cause.

(at the request of Joint Interim Committee on Information Management and Technology) -- Relating to materials that state contracting agencies must provide in connection with an information technology procurement; declaring an emergency.

**unemployment insurance benefits; declaring an emergency.**
