SB 1573 By Senator BEYER (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to boundary changes; declaring an emergency.

This measure has a fiscal impact statement.

Requires city whose laws require petition proposing annexation of territory to be submitted to electors to annex territory without vote upon receipt of petition for annexation submitted by all owners of land in territory provided territory is included within urban growth boundary of city or Metro and is, or will be, subject to acknowledged comprehensive plan of city, at least one parcel in territory is contiguous to city limits and proposal conforms to all other requirements of city's ordinances

SB 1601 By Senators BURDICK, FERRIOLI -- Relating to taxation of substances containing cannabinoids; prescribing an effective date.

Specifies that marijuana retailer may not collect tax from consumer of marijuana item if consumer is registry identification cardholder or designated primary caregiver who is purchasing marijuana item for registry identification cardholder.
