HOUSE BILLS

 $\underline{{\bf HB}\, {\bf 2021}}$ Sponsored by Representative MARSH -- Relating to clean energy; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Public Utility Commission to study laws related to clean energy and provide results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

HB3298 Sponsored by Representative REYNOLDS, Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to early medical release from prison; declaring an emergency; providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies procedures for early medical release of adult in custody from prison.

<u>HB 3299</u> Sponsored by Representative DRAZAN -- Relating to elections; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits individual from collecting and returning ballot of another individual, subject to specified exceptions.

<u>HB 3300</u> Sponsored by Representative NEARMAN -- Relating to mandatory payments to labor organizations by public employees.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes authority of public employer and labor organization to enter into fair-share agreement.

<u>HB 3301</u> Sponsored by Representative NEARMAN -- Relating to publication of notice of a hearing regarding a proposed rule.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes local government to publish notice of public hearing regarding proposed rule on agency's website instead of in newspaper of general circulation.

HB 3302 Sponsored by Representative RESCHKE -- Relating to a tax credit for contributions to workforce training organizations; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates income or corporate excise tax credit for contributions to workforce training organizations.

<u>HB 3303</u> Sponsored by Representative NOBLE (at the request of Oregon State Police Officers Association)
-- Relating to patrol trooper staffing levels for Department of State Police troopers.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of State Police to maintain staffing level of at least 15 patrol troopers per 100,000 residents of this state, beginning January 1, 2030.

HB 3304 Sponsored by Representative WILLIAMS -- Relating to state highways in rural communities; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to conduct study regarding impact of department's state highway regulations on rural downtown districts.

<u>HB 3305</u> Sponsored by Representative POWER -- Relating to diesel fuel.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits retail dealer, nonretail dealer or wholesale dealer from selling petroleum diesel for use in motor vehicle on or after specified dates.

<u>HB 3306</u> Sponsored by Representatives MEEK, ZIKA --- Relating to charges in lieu of security deposit.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows landlord and tenant to agree to recurring charge in lieu of security deposit.

<u>HB 3307</u> Sponsored by Representative SMITH G -- Relating to intergovernmental agreements; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Clarifies that intergovernmental entity may seek to obtain any benefits from any public or private entity that any unit of local government or American Indian tribe that is party to intergovernmental agreement may seek to obtain.

<u>HB3308</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS -- Relating to fire prevention in the wildland-urban interface; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Forestry Department to develop and maintain comprehensive statewide map of wildfire risk, including boundaries of wildland-urban interface within state.

<u>HB3309</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS -- Relating to the Emergency Board.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands membership of Emergency Board.

<u>HB 3310</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (at the request of Tyke Crocker) -- Relating to pretrial detainees.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires each county to have facility jointly managed by sheriff and community mental health director to house and treat individuals with behavioral health disorders or intellectual or developmental disabilities who are in custody of county sheriff pending trial.

<u>HB 3311</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS -- Relating to correctional facility staffing plans.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes correctional facility staffing committee within each Department of Corrections facility.

HB3312 Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Kevin Cameron) -- Relating to unlawful trade practices.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

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Prohibits mailed solicitation for payment of fee in exchange for assistance with filing annual report with Secretary of State unless mailing contains specified disclosures.

<u>HB 3313</u> Sponsored by Representative CLEM -- Relating to regional housing needs analysis.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Land Conservation and Development to study issues relating to regional housing needs analysis and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

<u>HB 3314</u> Sponsored by Representative CLEM -- Relating to building in areas affected by wildfires.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Housing and Community Services Department to study issues relating to building in areas affected by wildfires and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

<u>HB 3315</u> Sponsored by Representative CLEM -- Relating to building in areas affected by wildfires.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Housing and Community Services Department to study issues relating to building in areas affected by wildfires and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

HB 3316 Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Kristen Wilson) -- Relating to use of deadly physical force against adult in custody.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits use of deadly physical force against adult in custody by corrections officer or other official employed by Department of Corrections unless officer or official reasonably believes use of deadly physical force is necessary for self-defense against imminent threat of death.

<u>HB3317</u> Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Kevin Mannix) -- Relating to a property tax exemption for farm machinery; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts from ad valorem property taxation machinery and equipment used to compress and bale harvested straw, hay, grass or other plants.

<u>HB3318</u> Sponsored by Representative CLEM -- Relating to use of land; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts dog training facilities from state structural specialty codes.

<u>HB 3319</u> Sponsored by Representative HUDSON -- Relating to light pollution; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Department of Energy, in consultation with Department of Land Conservation and Development, to study light pollution and provide results of study in report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

<u>HB3320</u> Sponsored by Representative REYNOLDS (at the request of Paul Terdal) -- Relating to investigations of complaints concerning violations of the Insurance Code; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study and make recommendations concerning changes to Insurance Code that address managing, investigating and enforcing violations identified in complaints against person that is subject to Insurance Code.

<u>HB3321</u> Sponsored by Representative HAYDEN -- Relating to listing the Oregon Volunteer Firefighters Association for donation by tax return checkoff; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes requirement that Oregon Volunteer Firefighters Association gather signatures in order to be eligible for individual income tax return checkoff contribution.

<u>HB 3322</u> Sponsored by Representative HAYDEN -- Relating to producing food in planned communities; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows production of food in planned community by lot owners and their tenants.

<u>HB 3323</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS -- Relating to the selection of directors for the school district in which the State Capitol is located.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that directors of district school board of Salem-Keizer School District must be nominated and elected by zone.

HB 3324 Sponsored by Representative EVANS -- Relating to the Oregon Vehicle Industry Board; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon Vehicle Industry Board.

HB 3325 Sponsored by Representative RUIZ -- Relating to rental property inspections; prescribing an effective date

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Rental Property Inspections.

HB3326 Sponsored by Representative RUIZ -- Relating to murals.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits local governments from charging fee to review application for mural and limits grounds for application denial.

<u>HB3327</u> Sponsored by Representatives LEIF, KROPF --- Relating to housing assistance for victims; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends sunset for authorization to Department of Justice to assist victims of domestic violence and sexual assault with housing needs until January 2, 2024.

HB3328 Sponsored by Representatives SMITH DB, CLEM -- Relating to funding of State Department of Fish and Wildlife; prescribing an effective date; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Imposes additional personal income tax.

HB 3329 Sponsored by Representative SMITH DB (at the request of former Representative Wayne Krieger) -- Relating to public order.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases penalties for crime of disorderly conduct in the second degree when crime committed during violent or disorderly assembly.

<u>HB 3330</u> Sponsored by Representative SMITH DB (at the request of former Representative Wayne Krieger -- Relating to a natural resource credit against estate tax; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Reduces required size of real property and percentage of value of adjusted gross estate necessary for real property to qualify for natural resource property credit against estate tax, where real property is forestland or forestland homesites.

HB 3331 Sponsored by Representative SMITH DB -- Relating to disbursals to the City of Portland; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits state agencies from disbursing moneys to City of Portland to pay for costs, losses or damages resulting from certain public demonstrations occurring in city.

<u>HB 3332</u> Sponsored by Representative SMITH DB -- Relating to the provision of politically neutral education.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires public schools to take special care to ensure that instruction is provided in neutral manner that focuses on academic subject matter and does not advocate personal views of educator.

<u>HB 3333</u> Sponsored by Representative SMITH DB -- Relating to the Department of Corrections.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Corrections to develop release matrix with goal of maintaining annual average population of 12,000 adults in custody.

<u>HB 3334</u> Sponsored by Representative POWER, Senator TAYLOR -- Relating to early childhood; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Early Learning Division to develop plan to coordinate provision of services to children who are in early childhood and to report on plan to appropriate interim committee of Legislative Assembly.

HB 3335 Sponsored by Representative MEEK; Representatives BYNUM, LEIF, PHAM, RUIZ, SALINAS, Senators FREDERICK, JAMA -- Relating to housing; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes Housing and Community Services Department to grant moneys to nonprofit organization for ADU community pilot programs that develop accessory dwelling units for income-eligible homeowners and that are available for lease by income-eligible tenants.

HB 3336 Sponsored by Representatives NATHANSON, NERON; Representative LIVELY, Senator FREDERICK -- Relating to education assessments; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to conduct study on education assessments administered in this state and to report results of study to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.

<u>HB 3337</u> Sponsored by Representatives NATHANSON, SALINAS, NERON; Representatives HUDSON,

MCLAIN, Senator FREDERICK -- Relating to waiver of academic assessments; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to request waiver of federal academic assessment requirements for 2020-2021 school year.

HB 3338 Sponsored by Representatives NATHANSON, NERON; Representative LIVELY, Senator FREDERICK -- Relating to education accountability measures.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to develop accountability measures related to indicators of school quality and student success.

<u>HB 3339</u> Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON; Representative WITT -- Relating to railroadhighway grade crossing safety.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits willfully obstructing, blockading, interfering with or preventing use of railroad-highway grade crossing for longer than 10 consecutive minutes.

HB 3340 Sponsored by Representative HOLVEY (at the request of FHL Bank Des Moines) -- Relating to federal home loan bank rights with respect to insurer-members under Oregon delinquency proceedings; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that court may not stay or prohibit federal home loan bank from exercising rights to collateral pledged by insurer-member that is subject to delinquency proceeding.

<u>HB 3341</u> Sponsored by Representative MEEK -- Relating to the Legislative Assembly.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Policy and Research Director to study and make recommendations to Legislative Policy and Research Committee on ways to modernize operations of Legislative Assembly.

<u>HB3342</u> Sponsored by Representative MEEK -- Relating to the Legislative Assembly.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Policy and Research Director to study and make recommendations on legislator compensation, ability of legislators to maintain nonlegislative work during interim periods and ability of citizens to become legislators.

HB3343 Sponsored by Representatives SALINAS, CLEM; Representatives ALONSO LEON, DEXTER, HUDSON, LIVELY, MEEK, PHAM, POWER, REARDON, RUIZ, Senators FREDERICK, GOLDEN, JAMA -- Relating to campaign finance; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes limits on campaign contributions that may be accepted by candidates and political committees.

<u>HB 3344</u> Sponsored by Representatives NATHANSON, LIVELY -- Relating to retail sales agents.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies that required deposit to Oregon Liquor Control Commission of moneys from retail sale of distilled liquor by appointed agent is determined by retail sales in cash.

<u>HB3345</u> Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON (at the request of Dorothy Musgrove, Lee Bliven,

CareWorks of Lane County) -- Relating to long term residential care; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services to conduct study of staffing ratios of direct care staff to residents and factors that contribute to cost of care in long term residential facilities.

<u>HB 3346</u> Sponsored by Representative MEEK -- Relating to public participation in the Legislative Assembly.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Policy and Research Director to study and make recommendations to Legislative Policy and Research Committee on ways to enhance public participation in legislative process and public access to legislative process.

<u>HB 3347</u> Sponsored by Representative WITT -- Relating to Willamette River fishing endorsements.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes State Fish and Wildlife Commission to establish by rule annual and daily Willamette River salmon, steelhead and sturgeon recreational fishing endorsements.

<u>HB 3348</u> Sponsored by Representative WITT -- Relating to net metering.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases to three percent of historic single-hour peak load the cumulative amount of generating capacity from certain net metering facilities below which public utilities', municipal electric utilities', electric cooperatives' and people's utility districts' obligations to offer net metering to new customer-generators may not be limited.

<u>HB3349</u> Sponsored by Representative WITT -- Relating to criminal mischief.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases penalties for conduct constituting crime of criminal mischief when person has prior conviction for criminal mischief in any degree or commits crime while being aided by 10 or more other persons.

<u>HB 3350</u> Sponsored by Representative WITT -- Relating to education services provided to students with a disability; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prescribes requirements for providing education to student with disability during COVID-19 emergency.

HB 3351 Sponsored by Representative CAMPOS; Representatives DEXTER, GRAYBER, PHAM, Senator PATTERSON -- Relating to minimum wage rate.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes increase in statewide minimum wage rate beginning on July 1, 2022.

HB 3352 Sponsored by Representatives CAMPOS, SALINAS, ALONSO LEON, REYNOLDS; Representatives GRAYBER, HUDSON, PHAM -- Relating to access to health care.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Renames Health Care for All Oregon Children program as Health Care for All Oregon program and expands eligibility to adults who would qualify for Medicaid-funded state medical assistance program or for federal premium tax credits but for their immigration status.

<u>HB 3353</u> Sponsored by Representatives RAYFIELD, LEIF, WILLIAMS, Senator ANDERSON; Representatives

LEVY, MARSH, MEEK, MOORE-GREEN, MORGAN, SANCHEZ, SCHOUTEN, SMITH G, Senators FREDERICK, KENNEMER, LIEBER -- Relating to health care expenditures; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to seek federal approval of amendment to state Medicaid demonstration project to permit coordinated care organizations to use portion of global budgets to improve health equity, improve overall health of community or enhance payments to providers who advance health equity or provide services improving overall health of community and to allow such expenditures to be counted as medical expenses for purposes of required medical loss ratio.

<u>HB 3354</u> Sponsored by Representative NERON -- Relating to educator preparation program standards.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to adopt standards for educator preparation programs relating to evaluations of teacher candidates.

<u>HB3355</u> Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Senator James Manning, Jr.) - Relating to law enforcement officer identification; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies identification required on uniforms of law enforcement officers working in crowd management.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study public safety standards.

<u>HB 3357</u> Sponsored by Representative REARDON -- Relating to traffic offenses.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes duly authorized traffic enforcement agents to review and issue citations based on photographs taken by photo red light cameras.

<u>HB 3358</u> Sponsored by Representative PHAM -- Relating to rates of taxation on pass-through income; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Disallows elective reduced rates on certain pass-through income above threshold amount.

<u>HB 3359</u> Sponsored by Representative PHAM -- Relating to digital rights; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes Task Force on Digital Rights.
