Amends the allowable uses of moneys appropriated to the Oregon Business Development Department for distribution to the City of Madras.

HB 2651 Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to fees charged in connection with consumer finance loans for purchasing motor vehicles.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits a person from charging as the sum of specified fees more than \$150 or one half of one percent of the amount of a consumer finance loan made for the purpose of purchasing a motor vehicle or one half of one percent of cash sale price of the motor vehicle.

<u>HB 2652</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to intercollegiate sports.

Requires a public university to submit any proposed change in affiliation with an athletic association, conference or organization with authority over intercollegiate sports to the appropriate legislative committees for review.

Establishes the emergency veterans housing program within the Housing and Community Services Department.

<u>HB 2655</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a strategic housing stipend pilot program.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to develop a housing stipend pilot program to provide housing stipends to individuals to move to a city where their labor is expected to benefit economic development of the city.

Prohibits the Public Utility Commission, municipal electric utilities, electric cooperatives and people's utility districts from setting a maximum amount of cumulative generating capacity for solar net metering systems that is allowed to be interconnected.

<u>HB 2657</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to building codes applicable to essential facilities; prescribing an effective date.

Permits the Building Codes Structures Board to adopt licensing standards for performing structural masonry in essential facilities.

<u>HB 2658</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to conditions of development.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits cities or counties from conditioning a permit or zoning change on the development of an improvement project that has already been financed, planned or approved.

<u>HB 2659</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Oregon Vehicle Industry Board; declaring an emergency.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes the Oregon Vehicle Industry Board.

<u>HB 2660</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to trip permits.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows vehicle dealers to issue recreational vehicle trip permits that are valid for 30 consecutive days if the vehicle is bought by a person

who does not reside in Oregon and does not intend to title the vehicle in Oregon

<u>HB 2661</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to petroleum contamination; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes the Task Force on Containment of Petroleum Contamination.

<u>HB 2662</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to law enforcement agencies.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs a municipal law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over a population of at least 350,000 to staff patrol vehicles with a minimum of two officers.

<u>HB 2663</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to motor vehicles.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits a vehicle dealer to issue temporary registration permits for motor vehicles that do not have proof of compliance with pollution control equipment requirements.

 $\underline{{\rm HB}\,2664}$ Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to housing for veterans.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs the Department of Veterans' Affairs to establish and administer a program to acquire and manage residential properties for the benefit of veterans who are experiencing, or are at risk of experiencing, housing instability.

<u>HB 2665</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the establishment of Central Oregon University; prescribing an effective date.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Central Oregon University as a separate public university, distinct from Oregon State University.

<u>HB2666</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to pretrial detainees; declaring an emergency.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires each county to have a facility jointly managed by the sheriff and community mental health program director to house and treat individuals with behavioral health disorders or intellectual or developmental disabilities who are in the custody of the county sheriff pending trial.

<u>HB2667</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to servicemembers.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates the crime of criminal defamation of a servicemember.

<u>HB 2668</u> Sponsored by Representative OSBORNE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to search and rescue.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires certain private persons, before engaging in search and rescue efforts, to make specified disclosures to the family of the missing person and to notify county sheriffs.

HB 2669 Sponsored by Representatives RUIZ, FRAGALA, Senator GORSEK; Representatives ANDERSEN, EVANS, SOSA, Senators CAMPOS, FREDERICK, PATTERSON, WEBER (Presession filed.) -- Relating

to part-time faculty at community colleges; declaring an emergency.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires community colleges to pay part-time faculty at the same rate, on a per-hour basis, as the community college pays full-time faculty to prepare for and teach a course.

HB 2670 Sponsored by Representative MCINTIRE; Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to education for children with a traumatic brain injury.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Broadens the description of what constitutes a traumatic brain injury for determining when a child is considered a child with a disability for purposes of qualifying for special education.

Modifies the procedure for the expunction of certain juvenile records.

Directs the Department of Human Services to establish an Exceptional Home Care Worker Certification program.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies that the laws governing the storage of the personal property of homeless individuals applies to personal property removed from a public camping site.

 $\underline{{\bf HB}\,{\bf 2697}}$ Sponsored by Representative SCHARF (Presession filed.) -- Relating to traffic stops.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Repeals the limitation on police officers initiating traffic stops for certain offenses related to vehicle lighting.

HB 2698 Sponsored by Representative RUIZ, Senator GORSEK; Senator WEBER (Presession filed.) -- Relating to homeownership goal; declaring an emergency.

1-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes a statewide goal for homeownership.

Expands restrictions on post-legislative service activities to prohibit receiving money or other consideration for advocacy on behalf of a public or private entity for changes in policy or funding for public or private sector programs or entities.

- HB 2728 Sponsored by Representative NERON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to member data under the Public Employees Retirement System; prescribing an effective date.

<u>HB 2883</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to technology support structures; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Department of Land Conservation and Development to conduct a study on methods to mitigate the impact of technology support structures on the aesthetics of certain areas.

<u>HB 2884</u> Sponsored by Representative EVANS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to returning hatchery fish.

Requires the State Department of Fish and Wildlife to annually assess the effects of provisions related to the disposition of hatchery-produced fish carcasses and report the results to committees of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources.

Restricts the number of personnel records concerning faculty members that a community college may maintain.
