<u>HB 4010</u>	BL	dp	02/05/2014	Barton
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Authorizes Employment Department to make public all decisions of the Employment Appeals Board. Applies to all decisions made before, on or after the effective date. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 11 - 0 - 0)

<u>HB 4042</u>	A-Eng EE	dpa PE	02/05/2014	Boone
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Adds renewable marine energy to types of energy for which availability of net metering is required. Stipulates that "territorial sea" be defined as it is currently in statute. Establishes that renewable marine energy can be located on "outer continental shelf" and that, if located on territorial sea or outer continental shelf, it is directly interconnected to the customer-generator's premises. (Committee Vote: 10 - 0 - 0)

<u>HB 4128</u>	RC	dp	02/04/2014	Clem
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Establishes that cities that require an election on question of annexation by city charter, ordinance or resolution must approve annexation by majority of votes in city as well as separate majority of votes in territory to be annexed if area to be annexed is 100 acres or more. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 4 – Davis, Thatcher, Unger, Clem; Nays, 1 – Holvey)

<u>HB 4008</u>	ED	dp	02/10/2014	Sprenger
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Revises calculations for State School Fund and School Improvement Fund as they apply to funding of programs for students in Youth Corrections Education and Juvenile Detention Programs. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2014. (Committee Vote: 8 - 0 - 1)

HB 4028 A-Eng HS dpa PE res sub WM 02/10/2014 Kennemer, Tomei
 Permits Oregon State Lottery to use existing dollars allocated for cost of administration to further state policy to minimize risks and mitigate harms of problem gambling. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 8 – Gallegos, Gelser, Gomberg, Keny-Guyer, Lininger, Olson, Whisnant, Tomei; Nays, 1 – Gilliam)

HB 4038 A-Eng HS dpa PE 02/10/2014 Nathanson, Whisnant
 Requires manufactured dwelling park owners provide written notice to park tenants and to Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS), of interest in selling park before marketing park for sale or considering offers. Specifies content of notice. Requires responsive written notice from tenants within ten days, if tenants wish to compete to purchase park. Specifies content of response. Permits tenants to request specified information during ten-day period. Requires owner provide requested information within seven days. Establishes parameters to permit limited sharing of confidential information. Requires tenants, within 15 days of receipt of requested information, to form or associate with entity capable of contracting and submit evidence of capacity to contract along with written offer. Requires commercially reasonable conduct of parties. Provides owner immunity from liability for minor failure to comply with notice or information requirements. Provides for tenant noncompliance. Permits tenants to seek injunctive relief for substantial owner noncompliance and the greater of damages or twice the rent of each tenant if owner fails to record affidavit prior to sale. Requires OHCS make specified information available to tenants of manufactured dwelling parks. Excludes other types of transfer of real property. Makes existing provisions that govern notice and transaction requirements between tenant associations or facility purchase associations for sale of a facility, applicable only to sale of a marina to a tenant association or marina purchase association. Makes other conforming and corrective modifications. Takes effect 91st day after sine die. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 1)

HB 4040 A-Eng HS dpa PE 02/10/2014 Tomei
 Requires Oregon State Lottery (Lottery) balance obligation to maximize net revenues with obligation to serve public good. Requires Lottery adopt comprehensive responsible gaming policy, integrating consideration of responsible play into retail operations and marketing practices. Requires Lottery consult with stakeholders to develop policy. Specifies content of policy. Requires annual report to appropriate legislative committees in cooperation with Oregon Health Authority. Specifies content of report. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 7 – Gallegos, Gelser, Gomberg, Keny-Guyer, Lininger, Olson, Tomei; Nays, 2 – Gilliam, Whisnant)

HB 4074 A-Eng HC dpa PE 02/10/2014 Jenson, Keny-Guyer
 Authorizes Board of Medical Imaging to waive specified licensing requirements for individual who meets certain criteria. Removes 10 year experience requirement and grants the Board discretion. Modifies definition of critical access to current rural hospital definition. Modifies current list of practitioners that can order medical imaging procedures. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 0)

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HB 4085 **HC** **dp** **02/10/2014** **Tomei**
 Modifies requirements for insurance coverage of colorectal cancer screening examinations. Applies to policies or certificates issued or renewed on or after effective date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 0)

HB 4090 **A-Eng** **ED** **dpa PE res sub WM** **02/10/2014** **Smith Warner**
 Allows Department of Education to award grants to encourage participation in summer meals and snacks programs. Increases maximum amount allowed for grants awarded to encourage participation in afterschool snack program. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 8 - 0 - 1)

HB 4126 **A-Eng** **EE** **dpa PE** **02/10/2014** **Smith**
 Allows consumer-owned utilities to use certain amount of unbundled renewable energy certificates to meet renewable portfolio standard under certain circumstances. Defines "electric utility" according to current statute. Directs Public Utility Commission (PUC) to study impact of allowing electric companies to offer voluntary renewable energy tariffs to non-residential customers. Requires PUC to use study to determine whether and under what conditions it is reasonable and in public interest to allow electric company to provide tariffs to non-residential customers. Establishes that if PUC determines to offer tariffs, that PUC may authorize electric company to file schedule that establishes rates, terms and conditions. Establishes that costs and benefits associated with tariff be borne by customer receiving services under tariff. Prohibits electric company from using electricity, pursuant to voluntary renewable energy tariff, to comply with requirements of statutory renewable portfolio standard. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 1)

HB 4131 **A-Eng** **TED** **dpa PE** **02/10/2014** **Lively**
 Allows a person who uses natural gas or propane as fuel in a motor vehicle to pay an annual special use license fee in lieu of a per-gallon tax. Takes effect July 1, 2015. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 1)
