**HB 4022 A-Eng VET dpa PE 02/14/2014 Matthews**  
 Creates Kelsey Smith Act requiring providers of radio communications service for cellular providers (cellular service) to provide cellular device location information for purpose of emergency response to situation involving risk of death or serious physical harm at request of law enforcement. Requires cellular service registered in Oregon or subject to Oregon jurisdiction, provide emergency contact information by June 15th each year or when information changes. Requires Office of Emergency Management (OEM) maintain database of cellular service emergency contact information for disclosure to public safety answering points (PSAPs) as specified. Requires OEM coordinate data collection with PSAPs and law enforcement and report to legislature biennially. Prohibits cause of action against cellular service complying in good faith. (Committee Vote: 6 - 0 - 1)

**HB 4023 A-Eng VET dpa PE res sub WM 02/14/2014 Huffman**  
 Permits dedication of "Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway" on portion of U.S. Highway 26 within Warm Springs Reservation. Allows 100 percent disabled veterans to pay discounted fee for annual medical marijuana cards.. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Ayes, 5 – Boone, Esquivel, Huffman, Witt, Matthews; Nays, 1 – Parrish)

**HB 4029 A-Eng RC dpa PE 02/14/2014 Kennemer, Fagan**  
 Authorizes owner of tract to withdraw from city if city is located within Metro and incorporated between January 1, 2000, and January 1, 2005; comprehensive plan and land use regulations were not acknowledged within four years after incorporation; and any portion of tract is on boundary of city and within one-half mile of another city. Establishes process that owner must go through to withdraw tract from city. Requires city to hold hearing on withdrawal within 30 days after receipt of written statement and to withdraw tract from city at or immediately after close of hearing. Provides for withdrawal without action by city if city fails or refuses to act. Prohibits city from annexing tract within 10 years following withdrawal. Authorizes any person who testified at hearing to seek judicial review of withdrawal by filing petition in Oregon Court of Appeals. Sunsets January 2, 2025. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 7 - 0 - 0)

**HB 4035 A-Eng JUD dpa PE 02/14/2014 Barker**  
 Allows a corrections officer employed by the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) to possess a weapon in the officer's personal vehicle when the vehicle is in a DOC parking lot if: (1) The officer is present in his or her official capacity; (2) He or she has a valid Oregon concealed handgun license; and, (3) The weapon is in a locked container, including the glove compartment or trunk, inside the vehicle. (Committee vote: Ayes, 7 – Barton, Cameron, Hicks, Krieger, Lininger, Williamson, Barker; Nays, 2 – Olson, Tomei)

**HB 4068 A-Eng JUD dpa PE 02/14/2014 Gomberg**  
 Allows a person with one violation or misdemeanor conviction for marijuana possession or one court diversion for marijuana possession to apply for a concealed firearm permit regardless of whether the conviction was in Oregon or in another state. Applies to license applications submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. (Committee vote: Ayes, 8 – Barton, Cameron, Hicks, Krieger, Lininger, Olson, Williamson, Barker; Nays, 1 – Tomei)

**HB 4086 A-Eng JUD dpa PE 02/13/2014 Tomei**  
 Makes certain records exempt from public disclosure when those records have personally identifiable information collected by a mass transit system. (Committee vote: 8-0)

**HB 4093 A-Eng JUD dpa PE 02/14/2014 Bentz**  
 Makes reports and agreements created for the purpose for sage grouse habitat protection exempt from public disclosure when those reports and agreements are voluntarily submitted to the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Forestry, or a soil and water conservation district. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 0)

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**HB 4102 A-Eng CPGE dpa PE Vega Pederson**  
 Prohibits public or private post-secondary educational institution from entering into contracts with financial firm to provide disbursement and management services of student financial aid funds unless the following requirements are met: clear and concise disclosure of fee schedule before the student agrees to use account offered by third-party financial firm; explanation of all methods available to student to access financial aid; ability for student to choose to receive financial aid through a paper check or electronic funds transfer; require paper check be sent or electronic funds transfer be initiated, at no cost to the student, within three business days of student's request; prohibit charging student a fee per transaction for making a debit or similar transaction using a debit or similar card provided by the third-party financial firm; and prohibit provision allowing revenue sharing. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 5 – Doherty, Keny-Guyer, Lively, Vega Pederson, Holvey; Nays, 4 – Johnson, Richardson, Smith, Thatcher)

**HB 4103 A-Eng CPGE dpa PE Lively**  
 Requires lien claimant, when providing notice of foreclosure sale, to provide lien debtor and persons with security interest copies of records and documents that are evidence of the basis for the lien when the chattel is a motor vehicle, boat, or aircraft. Provides that failure to give lien debtor or persons with security interest notice of foreclosure sale is an unlawful trade practice under ORS 656.608. Deletes provision that allows security interest to remain attached to chattel sold at foreclosure sale when the lien claimant fails to provide notice of sale to the person with security interest. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Ayes, 8 – Doherty, Keny-Guyer, Lively, Richardson, Smith, Thatcher, Vega Pederson, Holvey; Nays, 1 – Johnson)

**HB 4107 A-Eng EE dpa PE 02/14/2014 Bentz**  
 Extends Alternative Fuel Vehicle Revolving Fund (Fund) program to certain private entities that operate a fleet of motor vehicles. Allows Department of Energy (DOE) to require private entity, public body or tribe that applies for loan from Fund to pay one-tenth of one percent of loan amount applied for or \$2,500, whichever is less. Stipulates that private entity, public body, or tribe applying for loan may be required to pay DOE for costs incurred with application if costs exceed application fee and DOE determines costs are incurred solely in conjunction with application. Extends to biennium beginning July 1, 2015 requirement that limits on total amounts of potential tax credits for all transportation projects be reduced by the total amount of potential tax credits auctioned under Oregon law. Extends range of applicable tax law by two years, from 2015 to 2017. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2015. Declares an emergency; effective upon passage. (Committee vote: Ayes, 8 – Bentz, Boone, Johnson, Lininger, Reardon, Smith Warner, Vega Pederson, Bailey; Nays, 2 – Weidner, Whitsett)

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**HB 4111 A-Eng TED dpa PE res sub WM 02/13/2014 Read**  
 Establishes the Public Infrastructure Commission to identify Oregon’s public infrastructure needs, review and examine tools available to provide funding for public infrastructure projects, research innovative financing tools, determine legal impediments, and receive determinations from the State Treasurer. Requires government entities preparing infrastructure projects with total capital expenditure exceeding \$50 million, of which at least \$20 million is awarded by the Legislative Assembly or a state agency, to submit a description of the proposed project to the State Treasurer in early stage of project planning. Specifies that the State Treasurer or a designee will screen the project to determine whether it would benefit from private capital and innovative procurement methods. Provides exceptions. Sunsets provisions on January 2, 2016. Directs the Governor and State Treasurer to appoint representatives to the West Coast Infrastructure Exchange. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 10 - 0 - 0)

**HB 4122 A-Eng CPGE dpa PE 02/14/2014 Nathanson**  
 Requires state contracting agencies and public corporations to obtain quality management services from a qualified contractor on information technology (IT) initiative exceeding \$5 million or if IT initiative meets three of more of specified criteria. Requires quality management services contractors to provide a copy of the report to the State Chief Information Officer (CIO), Director of Department of Administrative Services (DAS), and, as appropriate, the director of the state contracting agency, board or commission. Requires state contracting agencies and public corporations to consult with DAS Director and follow DAS policies and procedures to determine the extent of quality management services or preliminary quality assurance services required for an IT initiative. Allows state contracting agencies and public corporations to procure preliminary quality management services if the procurement meets standards described above or if it otherwise believes the preliminary quality assurance services will enable it to implement an IT initiative successfully. Provides exemption from requirement that state contracting agency not accept bid or proposal from a contractor that assisted in developing the specifications or solicitation documents for the bid or proposal for certain quality management services. Requires bidders and proposers to submit affidavit that attests the bidder or proposer has complied with state and local tax laws. Becomes operative July 1, 2014. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 0)

**HB 4143 A-Eng JUD dpa PE 02/14/2014 Read**  
 Authorizes court to order unclaimed class action settlement damages to be paid to Legal Aid Supplementary Account. Specifies interest from Account is to be distributed to Oregon State Bar for use in funding Legal Services Program. Specifies process for payment of damages. Declares emergency; effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 5 – Barton, Lininger, Tomei, Williamson, Barker; Nays, 4 – Cameron, Hicks, Krieger, Olson)

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
