PROPOSITIONS AND MOTIONS:

(Possible Consideration of Senate Amendments)

HB 4022 B-Eng VET concur **02/25/2014** **Matthews**
 Creates Kelsey Smith Act requiring providers of radio communications service for cellular providers (cellular service) to provide cellular device location information, or best available location information, for purpose of emergency response to situation involving risk of death or serious physical harm at request of law enforcement. Requires cellular service registered in Oregon or subject to Oregon jurisdiction, provide emergency contact information by June 15th each year or when information changes. Requires Office of Emergency Management (OEM) maintain database of cellular service emergency contact information for disclosure to public safety answering points (PSAPs) as specified. Requires OEM coordinate data collection with PSAPs and law enforcement and report to legislature biennially. Prohibits cause of action against cellular service complying in good faith. **Senate amendments permit cellular service to provide call location information or “the best available location information.”** (Senate vote: 30-0)

HB 4114 B-Eng JUD concur **02/25/2014** **Gilliam**
 Authorizes courts to appoint volunteers to serve as protected person special advocates. Directs court to establish qualifications of persons serving as advocates, as well as standards and procedures to be used by advocates, prior to appointing volunteers. Specifies duties, responsibilities, and functions of volunteer advocates. Excludes financial institutions and trust companies who act as fiduciaries from oversight of advocate. Declares emergency; effective on passage. **Senate amendments exclude financial institutions and trust companies who act as fiduciaries from oversight of advocate.** (Senate vote: 29-0)

SENATE BILLS:

SB 1524 B-Eng HEWD dpa PE 02/21/2014 Gorsek
 Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to examine viability of program allowing students who graduated from high school in state to attend community college for specified period without paying tuition and fees. Specifies that HECC consider anticipated number of participants and annual cost, current capacity of community colleges, potential eligibility criteria and requirement for federal financial aid to be used first. Directs HECC to submit report to interim legislative committees on education no later than September 30, 2014. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 0)

SB 1537 A-Eng BL dp 02/21/2014 Doherty
 Specifies that a mutuel pool for live or previously held horse races may include amounts carried forward from the mutuel pool of previous races. Authorizes the Oregon Racing Commission to adopt rules to identify forms of mutuel wagering that race meet licensees may offer. Provides that devices used by race meet licensees to offer mutuel wagering in accordance with Commission rules are not considered slot machines or gray machines. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 9 – Barton, Fagan, Holvey, Kennemer, Matthews, Thompson, Weidner, Witt, Doherty; Nays, 2 – Freeman, Thatcher)

SB 1549 BL dp 02/21/2014 Thatcher
 Clarifies that statutory provisions regulating investigators do not apply to persons authorized to engage in public accountancy in Oregon. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 10 - 0 - 1)

SB 1558 A-Eng BL dp 02/21/2014 Witt
 Authorizes Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to pay compensation due to workers of members of certain decertified self-insured employer groups and to set standards, by rule, for proof of financial viability of self-insured employer and for insurance coverage retention and combined net worth of members of self-insured employer group. Prohibits certain group members and board members of groups from serving as the group administrator. Authorizes the Director to revoke certification of self-insured employer in default and for violation of rules. Authorizes the Director to take certain actions when a self-insured employer group is in default, is decertified, or cancels its certification. Modifies requirements for ending cash balance in the Workers' Benefit Fund. Requires each self-insured employer group to conduct a vote on the continuation of the group and to report the results of the vote to the Director by July 1, 2014. Instructs the Worker's Compensation Management-Labor Advisory Committee to conduct a study about modification of the ending balance requirement and report results to the Legislative Assembly. Designates effective date of April 1, 2014. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 10 – Fagan, Freeman, Holvey, Kennemer, Matthews, Thatcher, Thompson, Weidner, Witt, Doherty; Nays, 1 – Barton)

SB 1566 A-Eng HEWD dp 02/21/2014 Huffman

Declares state public policy to promote coordinated provision of education, employment, economic development, and job training services. Mandates inclusion of community colleges and public and private universities. Mandates that Governor appoint one member to State Workforce Investment Board who represents a local workforce investment board. Clarifies expectations delivery from state to agencies and local boards. Details requirements of local plan submitted to Governor. Describes appropriate labor market information activities. Assigns new duties to State Workforce Investment Board. Abolishes regional workforce committees. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: 9 - 0 - 0)

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
