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PROPOSITIONS AND MOTIONS:

(Possible Consideration of Senate Amendments)

HB 4133 B-Eng **RULES** **concur** **03/06/2014** **Barnhart**
 Directs Legislative Counsel (LC) and Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ) to review statute laws and identify those that are outdated, obsolete, or duplicative of other laws. Authorizes LC, in consultation with DOJ, to prepare measures for odd-numbered year regular session to repeal or amend statutes so identified. Requires report explaining reason for statutory modification to accompany each measure and be included in legislative record. Requires required report be distributed to Senators and Representatives and otherwise made available to public at least 90 days prior to start of legislative session at which measure is to be considered. Sunsets on January 2, 2018. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **Senate amendments remove limitations on amendments on measures drafted under this Act. Requires required report for prepared measures be distributed to Senators and Representatives and otherwise made available to public at least 90 days prior to start of legislative session at which measure is to be considered.** (Senate vote: 30-0)

HB 4138 B-Eng **REV** **concur** **03/06/2014** **Vega Pederson**
 Modifies the method of corporate apportionment of business income for interstate broadcasters. Defines terms. Changes the basis of apportionment from viewing audience to the gross receipts from Oregon domiciled customers. Applies to tax years 2014 through 2016. Requires the Legislative Revenue Officer to produce a report on the impact and utilization of the policy change. Requires that the report be presented to the Legislature by January 1, 2017. **Senate amendments add language to clarify that the bill does not change who is affected by this method apportionment. Changes the sunset date from January 1, 2020 to January 1, 2017. Changes the reporting requirement date from January 1, 2019 to January 1, 2017.** (Senate vote: 30-0)

HOUSE BILLS:**(Requires Rule Suspension)****HB 4018** B-Eng WM dpa PE 03/05/2014 Buckley

Allows the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to participate in the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) and to impose a fee on educational institutions in the Oregon that elect to join SARA through the HECC. In addition, the bill transfers the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development (CCWD) to the HECC, establishes a task force to develop recommendations for integrating CCWD into HECC, and changes the schedule by which Eastern Oregon University, Southern Oregon University, Western Oregon University and the Oregon Institute of Technology may convert to local governing boards. Transfers responsibility for analyzing biennial performance reviews prepared by the Engineering and Technology Industry Council (ETIC) from the Oregon University System (OUS) to the Chief Education Officer and the Oregon Education Investment Board (OEIB). Responsibility for ETIC is transferred to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) on March 15, 2016, when OEIB is scheduled to sunset. Staff and the funding for the staff overseeing the expenditure of ETIC funds will be retained by OUS/Chancellor's Office through the end of the 2013-15 biennium. OEIB will have to enter into an agreement with OUS/Chancellor's Office to establish authority over these positions. The bill was amended to provide a one-time appropriation of \$14.8 million General Fund to OEIB from funds originally appropriated to OUS for ETIC. Information provided to the committee indicated that OEIB and HECC are not necessarily the long term home for the ETIC mission, but they are considered the best temporary home for the program as all options are explored for the next biennium. Please note: Has Budget Report.**SENATE BILLS:****(Requires Rule Suspension)****SB 1514** A-Eng WM dp 03/05/2014 Unger

Increases the county share of recreational vehicle fee funding from 35% to 40% for the remainder of the 2013-15 biennium. The measure takes effect upon passage. The impact is an increase in revenue to counties of \$1,121,258. Of this amount, 90%, or \$1,009,132 is a direct revenue transfer from Parks to the counties. The remaining 10%, or \$112,126, is awarded as grants. The revenue estimate is developed by the Department of Transportation and reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Department. The change will require Parks to shift revenues between budget structures. 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SB 1515 A-Eng RULES dpa PE 03/05/2014 Holvey
 Expands list of prior violations that prohibit individual from becoming paid circulator. Amends time period paid circulator's criminal records check is valid. Permits name of candidate nominated for more than one district office to appear on ballot more than once. Permits elector who submitted ballot in unsigned return identification envelope to remain on active voter registration rolls. Resolves discrepancy regarding day on which challenged ballot records may be released to public. Resolves certification date discrepancy for write-in ballots. Limits prohibition on electioneering to business hours. Permits person to show person's own marked ballot to another person. Declares emergency, effective on passage. SB 1542 B-Eng WM dp 03/05/2014 Gallegos
 Requires the Home Care Commission to establish and administer the Private Pay Consumer program to enable private individuals to purchase in-home care services from the Commission through the Home Care Registry. The bill directs the Home Care Commission to create a subcommittee of the commission to define and establish new classifications of in-home care workers. Ensures that the state incurs no liability for the cost of home care services purchased by private payers through the program by specifying that if revenue generated by private pay consumer payments are insufficient to pay the costs of home care services, the commission may modify the payment rate. In addition, if the modifying the payment rates will not generate sufficient revenue, the commission may suspend the program following 30 days advance written notice to private payers and home care workers participating in the program. The bill requires the private pay program to be implemented by July 1, 2015; and operational by January 1, 2016. The bill contains an emergency clause, and is effective on passage. SB 1582 B-Eng WM dp 03/05/2014 Nathanson
 Authorizes money from the Oregon Medical Insurance Board (OMIP) account to fund the Temporary Medical Insurance Pool (TMIP). Defines terms relating to Oregon Transitional Reinsurance Program (OTRP) to align the program with expected changes to the federal reinsurance program. Establishes various OTRP coinsurance rates based on varying circumstances such as the national coinsurance rate. Extends eligibility for OTRP payments to claims incurred by high-risk individuals who enroll by the end of the initial 2014 open enrollment. Authorizes the use of any remaining balance from premium assessments established under ORS 743.951 and 743.961 to fund the Temporary Medical Insurance Program (TMIP).
