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**PROPOSITIONS AND MOTIONS:**

**(Possible Consideration of Senate Amendments)**

<b><u>HB 4023</u></b>	<b>C-Eng</b>	<b>VETS</b>	<b>03/07/2014</b>	<b>Matthews</b>
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Permits dedication of “Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway” on a portion of U.S. Highway 26 within Warm Springs Reservation. States that private employers may prefer to hire and promote service members; veterans; surviving spouses of deceased veterans; and spouses of veterans totally disabled from enemy action or service-related accident. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate amendment strikes language related to a lottery game, of which proceeds were directed to benefit education and economic development for veterans.** (Senate vote: 30-0)

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Budget reconciliation bill that adjusts the state budget for 2013-15 biennium. Includes technical adjustments and actions approved by the Interim Joint Committee on Ways and Means. (Committee vote: Ayes, 11 – Barker, Frederick, Huffman, Jenson, Komp, Nathanson, Read, Smith, Tomei, Williamson, Buckley; Nay, 4 – Freeman, Hanna, McLane, Richardson)

<b><u>HB 5202</u></b>	<b>WM</b>	<b>dp</b>	<b>03/06/2014</b>	<b>Huffman</b>
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Ratifies fee changes approved by the Department of Administrative Services and adopted administratively by the Construction Contractors Board, the Department of Consumer and Business Services, and the Oregon Health Authority. The measure provides the enabling legislation necessary to approve fees adopted through Administrative Rule. (Committee vote: Ayes, 11 – Barker, Frederick, Huffman, Jenson, Komp, Nathanson, Read, Smith, Tomei, Williamson, Buckley; Nay, 4 – Freeman, Hanna, McLane, Richardson)

**HB 4110 C-Eng WM dpa PE 03/06/2014 Greenlick**  
 Prohibits insurer from denying reimbursement under health benefit plan for covered services provided to pre-adjudicated person in custody of a local supervisory authority. Requires insurer to reimburse local supervisory authority at no less than 115 percent of the Medicare rate for the services provided. Details specific rights and prohibitions of insurer related to reimbursements and services provided and prohibits a public body from paying plan premiums on behalf of a person in the custody of a local supervisory authority. (Committee vote: 15-0)

**HB 4144 A-Eng WM dpa PE 03/06/2014 Read**  
 Creates the Oregon Investment Department (OID) under the supervision of a director who is appointed by the Oregon Investment Council (OIC). The State Treasurer is to serve as vice chairperson of OIC until becoming chair on January 1, 2017. The Legislative in 2021 is to conduct a comprehensive review of the results of the implementation of this act. The measure is effective on passage with key provisions becoming operative on January 1, 2015. **HB 4157 A-Eng WM dpa PE 03/06/2014 Buckley**  
 Implements statutory changes necessary to support the legislatively approved budget and to clarify the application of statutes. This measure, relating to state financial administration, is not an appropriation bill and therefore does not include the appropriation of funds. The measure, however, is necessary to achieve a balanced budget for the 2013-15 biennium. The measure is effective on passage. (Committee vote: 15-0)

**SB 5701** A-Eng WM dp 03/07/2014 Smith  
 Adjusts two existing allocations of lottery revenues from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, and establishes one new allocation. (Committee vote: 15-0)

**SB 5702** A-Eng WM dp 03/07/2014 Read  
 Budget bill for Capital Construction projects. Establishes authority for the planning, design, and construction of projects with costs over \$1 million. Each project must be authorized by the Legislature. Some of the projects are funded with bond proceeds provided in Senate Bill 5703. (Committee vote: 15-0)

**SB 5703** A-Eng WM dp 03/07/2014 Kotek  
 Limits the maximum amount of bonds and third party financing agreements that may be issued and the amount of revenue state agencies may raise from such issuance. (Committee vote: Ayes, 14 – Barker, Frederick, Freeman, Hanna, Huffman, Jenson, Komp, McLane, Nathanson, Read, Richardson, Smith, Williamson, Buckley; Nays, 1 – Tomei)

**SB 1506** B-Eng WM dp 03/07/2014 Sprenger  
 Enables Oregon to join Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and establishes the State Council for Educational Opportunity for Military Children. In addition, the bill clarifies that Council members are volunteers. (Committee Vote: 14-0)

**SB 1559** B-Eng WM dp 03/07/2014 Huffman  
 Establishes the Oregon Liquor Control Modernization Task Force to evaluate the existing system for distributing and selling liquor, and to identify means of modernizing the system. The task force is required to report to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly by October 1, 2014. The measure also clarifies the ability of the enforcement division of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to access the Law Enforcement Data System for purposes of background checks related to license issuance. (Committee vote: 14-0)
