<u>SB 324-A</u>	EE	dp	03/03/2015	Vega Pederson
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Repeals sunset on provisions related to low carbon fuel standards. Makes adoption of rules by Environmental Quality Commission (Commission) on low carbon fuel standards mandatory. Extends date by which standards to reduce average amount of greenhouse gas emissions per unit of fuel energy of fuels by 10 percent below 2010 levels to year 2025 or later date if Commission determines extension is appropriate. Authorizes use of liquefied petroleum gas to meet low carbon fuel standard. Removes requirement for Commission to issue exemptions and deferrals to mitigate cost of complying with low carbon fuel standards based on comparisons of fuel costs with Petroleum Administration for Defense District (PADD) 5 region costs. Requires Commission to adopt rules for managing and containing costs of compliance with standards, including but not limited to ensuring people may obtain and trade credits for fuels used as gasoline or diesel substitutes. Requires Commission to exempt person who imports less than total of 500,000 gallons of gasoline and diesel in calendar year. Directs Commission to prohibit fuels containing bio diesel from being considered alternative fuel unless biodiesel meets specified standards. Exempts fuel that is demonstrated to have been used in certain motor vehicles used primarily for construction, watercraft, and railroad locomotives. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote Yeas: 5 - Boone, Helm, Holvey, Reardon, Vega Pederson Nays: 4 - Bentz, Heard, Johnson, Weidner)

<u>SB 324-B</u>	EE (Minority) dpa PE	03/03/2015	Bentz/Johnson
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Makes legislative findings on state policy to reduce carbon emissions. By June 30 each year, directs Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) to determine commercial availability of ethanol in Oregon, adopt standard for quality and percentage of ethanol by volume that must be blended with gasoline to be sold or offered in state during next calendar year, and notify dealers. Requires annual standard to ensure compliance with existing statutory standards and prioritize use of commercially available ethanol with lowest greenhouse gas emissions attributable to ethanol throughout its lifecycle and at level that maximizes use of commercially available ethanol in Oregon for calendar year. Prohibits sale or offer for sale of gasoline that does not meet standard. By June 30 each year, directs ODA to determine commercial availability of biodiesel and other renewable diesel in Oregon, adopt standard for quality and percentage of biodiesel and other renewable diesel by volume that diesel fuel must contain to be sold or offered for sale in state during next calendar year, and notify dealers. Requires annual standard to ensure compliance with

existing statutory standards and prioritize use of commercially available biodiesel and other renewable fuels with lowest greenhouse gas emissions attributable to fuels throughout their lifecycle and at level that maximizes use of commercially available biodiesel and other renewable diesels in Oregon for calendar year. Prohibits sale or offer for sale of diesel fuel that does not meet standard. Directs ODA to adopt labeling standards for biodiesel and other renewable diesel. Exempts from standard motor vehicles not designed primarily to transport persons or property that are operated on highways only incidentally and used primarily for construction work. Authorizes Public Utility Commission (PUC) to require payment of public purpose charge funds into Carbon Reduction Technology Research and Development Fund (Fund). Stipulates if PUC requires funds to be paid to non-governmental entity and into Fund, payments must be equal. Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop, maintain and manage consortium created for purpose of promoting and advancing research and development of carbon reduction technologies related to transportation fuels. Requires consortium to include representatives of University of Oregon, Portland State University and Oregon State University. Directs consortium to establish grant program and facilitate programs at member universities. (Signed by Bentz/Johnson)

HB 2610-A **HS** **dpa PE** **02/26/14** **Gallegos**
Specifies jurisdiction over safety and health inspection standards for agricultural workforce housing. Defines circumstances and procedure to obtain abatement and refund of applicable property taxes for July 1, 2014 through July 1, 2016. Takes effect 91st day after *sine die*. (Committee vote: 7-0-2)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2230 **VET** **dp** **02/27/15** **Nathanson**
Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) notify Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs (ODVA) upon receipt of self-identified information from veteran or active service member. Restricts notification to name and address. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

HB 2377 **CPGE** **dp** **02/27/15** **Nearman**
Prohibits person from soliciting, requesting or otherwise inducing another person to provide personal information by impersonating a third person, without the third person's knowledge, authorization and consent. Creates exceptions for law enforcement and lawful investigators. Punishes violation as unlawful trade practice. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

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HB 2383 **CPGE** **dp** **02/27/15** **Stark**
 Requires people soliciting purchase of business opportunities by telephone to make certain disclosures before completing transaction. Defines business opportunity. Becomes operative 91 days after effective date. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

HB 2445-A **RCLUW** **dpa PE** **02/27/15** **Witt**
 Authorizes State Department of Agriculture (department) director to provide notice of quarantine areas by newspaper of general circulation in the quarantine area and by one or more additional methods. Eliminates mandate to department to declare hazard and establish control area in response to existence of eastern filbert blight. Eliminates references to Grade B milk. Authorizes department director to choose method for making noxious weed information available. Expands definitions dealing with plant pests, infections, and infestations. Amends definition of “certificate of analysis” as it pertains to biodiesel. Eliminates requirement that department give fuel dealers notice of threshold biodiesel production capacity. Repeals requirement that department study and monitor ethanol production. Repeals obsolete statutes providing for participation in defunct Interstate Compact on Pest Control. Modernizes language. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

HB 2467-A **CPGE** **dpa PE** **02/27/15** **Buehler**
 Allows the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to adopt rules regulating penalties, fees, and charges imposed on certain withdrawals from individual deferred annuity policies. Becomes operative January 1, 2016, and applies to contracts entered into on or after operative date. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

HB 2476 **CPGE** **dp** **02/27/15** **Fagan**
 Allows Department of Administrative Services, with approval of Governor, to adopt by rule uniform policies and procedures affecting multiple state agencies, commissions and boards. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2487 **REV** **dp** **03/02/15** **Bentz**
 Requires correction of maximum assessed value resulting from assessor changes in property square footage to be proportional to change in real market value of property resulting from the changes in property square footage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2567-A **BL** **dpa PE** **03/02/15** **Williamson**
 Allow distillery licensee to buy bulk distilled liquor from, and sell to, another distillery licensee for purpose of blending and manufacturing. Allows distillery licensee to pour tastings of products approved for sale by Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) and manufactured in Oregon by distillery licensee or another distillery licensee. Allows more than one distillery licensee to use same premises at same time for conducting tastings. Deletes requirement that liquor for tastings be purchased from the OLCC. Allows retail outlet agent to sell only liquor manufactured in Oregon and approved for sale by OLCC. Allows retail outlet agent to sell, at retail, liquor manufactured by another distillery retail outlet agent. Expands activities allowed under special events distillery license for the tasting, sales by the glass, or bottle sales of liquor manufactured in Oregon. Expands where special events can be held to include the distillery. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 11-0-0)
