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**HOUSE BILLS:**

<a href="#"><u>HB 2174-A</u></a>	CPGE	dpa PE	03/09/15	Buehler
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Deletes requirement for Secretary of State to prescribe form of contract for conduct of municipal audits. Provides that audit reports are considered delinquent if municipal corporation has not filed with the Secretary of State by the deadline or extended deadline as specified. Directs governing body of municipal corporation whose audit report contains deficiencies to adopt a plan of action to address the deficiencies, and to file the plan of action with the Secretary of State. Requires Secretary of State to notify city or county if deficiencies exist which could result in withholding of state funds. Allows Secretary of State to direct certain state agencies to withhold 10 percent of specified state funds otherwise to be distributed to municipality if municipality fails to submit audit report. Requires Secretary of State to prepare annual report with information about timeliness of audit filings and deficiencies found for each municipal corporation and to submit report to appropriate legislative committee by March 1 of each odd-numbered year. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

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Includes Oregon nonprofit corporations as public employer for purposes of transferring certain public employees. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Barton, Doherty, Evans, Fagan, Holvey, Kennemer, Nosse, Weidner; Nays: 2 - Barreto, Heard; Exc: 1 - Esquivel)

<a href="#"><u>HB 2395-A</u></a>	WM	dp	03/09/15	Greenlick
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Extends hospital assessment from September 30, 2015 to September 30, 2019. Extends the repeal of the assessment statutes to January 2, 2024. Specifies that moneys related to one percentage point of the hospital assessment will be split, with half distributed to hospitals based on their achievement of performance metrics and the other half distributed to coordinated care organizations based on recommendations of the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) metrics and scoring committee. Directs OHA Director to reapply to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for any approval needed to continue federal financial participation and to notify Legislative Counsel upon receipt of federal approval or disapproval. Repeals sunset date of statutes related to mandatory reimbursement rates by coordinated care organizations to non-contracting hospitals. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 11-0-1)

Allows community colleges to award training certificates for noncredit courses and programs. Requires community colleges to ensure that new, noncredit courses for training certificates do not adversely impact other public or private post-secondary educational institutions. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)
- HB 2910**                              **CPGE**                              **dp**    **03/09/15**                              **Nearman**  
Repeals obsolete laws relating to agricultural experiment stations. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)
- HB 2911**                              **CPGE**                              **dp**    **03/09/15**                              **Nearman**  
Repeals obsolete laws related to courts and constables, damages for Y2K computer failures and enforcement of child support judgments. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)
- HB 2912-A**                              **CPGE**                              **dpa PE**    **03/09/15**                              **Nearman**  
Repeals obsolete laws related to transportation and motor vehicle laws. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

Repeals outdated and obsolete provisions and updates references related to human services programs. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)
- HB 3037-A**                              **RULES**                              **dpa PE**    **03/10/15**                              **Hoyle**  
Adds certain personal information about public employees and volunteers to that which is already exempt from disclosure under public records law. Requires certain personal information of home care workers, operators of child care facilities, exempt family child care providers, operators of adult foster homes and those who submitted voluntary information in confidence to public body be maintained confidentially and not disclosed pursuant to public records request, unless in custody of Oregon Judicial Department or Oregon Department of Transportation. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)
