Prohibits mental and social health providers from practicing conversion therapy if the recipient is under 18 years of age. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 6 - Buehler, Clem, Greenlick, Keny-Guyer, Lively, Nosse; Nays: 3 - Hayden, Kennemer, Weidner)

HB 2489 **REV** **dp** **03/13/15** **Bentz**
 Removes expiration of cigarette tax stamps following tax increases in January 2016 and January 2018. Limits distributor purchases of cigarette tax stamps in two months prior to each scheduled tax increase to no more than 150 percent of six-month average beginning May 1, 2015 through October 31, 2015 for tax increase scheduled in 2016 and six-month average beginning May 1, 2017 through October 31, 2017 for tax increase scheduled in 2018. Directs department of Revenue to determine six-month average purchase of tax stamps for each distributor. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2532-A **CPGE** **dpa PE** **03/13/15** **Witt**
 Requires lender, or agent or affiliate of lender, to provide summary of certain provisions in advertisements and communications intended to induce consumers to apply for or enter into reverse mortgage contract. Creates exceptions. Applies to reverse mortgage transactions occurring on or after January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0- 0)

HB 2534-A **AG** **dpa PE** **03/13/15** **Witt**
 Declares intent of Legislative Assembly to embody sporting ethic of fair chase as it relates to use of drones in pursuit of wildlife. Directs Fish and Wildlife Commission (Commission) to adopt rules prohibiting use of drones for pursuit of wildlife in angling; hunting; trapping; harassing, tracking, locating, or scouting wildlife; or interfering in act of person lawfully engaged in angling, hunting or trapping. Authorizes Commission to includes exemptions from prohibition for Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and its agents or contractors or if purpose is to benefit wildlife management or protect property. Defines “drone.” Stipulates nothing in the bill is meant to limit use of drones by person lawfully engaged in activities authorized under commercial fishing laws. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2579-A **RCLUW** **dpa PE** **03/12/15** **Barnhart**
 Authorizes domestic water supply districts to contract to provide services with cooperative corporations that supply water for domestic purposes. Stipulates that services provided to cooperative corporations are limited to administration or operation, including, but not limited to, infrastructure, maintenance, repair or replacement. (Committee vote: 5-0-2)

HB 2644 **JUD** **dp** **03/12/15** **Witt**

Allows claim against state for wrongful death when death occurred within course and scope of decedent’s employment, person responsible for death is convicted of murder or found guilty except for insanity, and decedent was not employed by public body at time of death. Applies only to claims based on crimes committed on or after May 1, 2012. Repeals ability to bring claim on January 2, 2017. Requires revived claim be brought within one year of effective date. Declares emergency; effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 6 - Barker, Barton, Krieger, Lininger, Olson, Sprenger; Nays: 1 – Greenlick; Exc: 2 - Post, Williamson)

HB 3041 **HC** **dp** **03/12/15** **Buehler,
Keny-Guyer**

Directs school districts to allow students to wear sun-protective clothing and sunscreen. Specifies that nonprescription sunscreen is not a medication. Declares an emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3062 **CPGE** **dp** **03/13/15** **Stark**

Exempts prepaid transportation cards from Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act and related statutes, and from provisions related to regulation of gift cards with expiration dates. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)
