<b><u>HB 2258</u></b>	<b>CPGE</b>	<b>dp</b>	<b>03/18/15</b>	<b>Buehler</b>
Clarifies that section of statute allowing insurers to use abstract of nonemployment driving record when determining rates applies only to personal insurance policies. Applies to insurance policies issued or renewed on or after effective date. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)				

<b><u>HB 2453-A</u></b>	<b>AGNR</b>	<b>dpa PE</b>	<b>03/18/15</b>	<b>Gorsek</b>
Requires organizers of large, commercial events on state forestlands to obtain permit from Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF). Defines “large commercial event” and “organizer.” Authorizes ODF to adopt rules establishing health and safety standards for events; consider environmental and resource impacts; charge permit fees covering permit review costs; and authorizes ODF refusal, suspension or revocation of permit under certain circumstances. Prohibits issuance of ODF permit that authorizes large, commercial event to continue for more than 120 hours in any 90-day period. Allows ODF to establish permit standards for buffering forest practices from large commercial events and changes threshold triggering permit requirement from 20 participants to 35 participants. Establishes maximum penalty of one year imprisonment and fine of \$6,250 or twice amount gained by offense, or financial penalty and imprisonment for violation of permit requirement. Establishes that certain violations are “Class A” misdemeanor. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2908-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **03/18/15**                      **Olson**

Brings Oregon law into compliance with HR 4980, the federal Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2015. Specifies ward may be placed with fit and willing relative as option for permanency plan. Requires local citizen review board in dependency cases to include in findings and recommendations the steps Department of Human Services has taken to ensure that substitute care provider of child or ward 16 years of age or older in permanency plan of "another planned permanent living arrangement" is following reasonable and prudent parent standard and providing ongoing opportunities for child to participate in age-appropriate or developmentally appropriate activities. Requires such description be included in six-month agency reports and in court's findings for continuation of substitute care. Defines "age-appropriate or developmentally appropriate activities." Defines "another planned permanent living arrangement." Defines "reasonable and prudent parent standard." Changes "independent living" to "successful adulthood." Requires inclusion of document describing rights and signed acknowledgment of copy of documents and explanation by ward within case plan. Declares emergency; effective on passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

Allows establishment of wildlife food plots on small tract forestland subject to reforestation requirements without affecting small tract forestland assessment. Restricts size of wildlife food plots to between 1 percent and 2.5 percent of total small forestland acreage depending upon total acreage enrolled. Directs State Board of Forestry (Board) to adopt rules and consult with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to identify vegetation capable of substantially contributing to wildlife nutrition. Requires that establishment of wildlife food plot and reforestation of location that ceases to be wildlife food plot, are forest operations requiring notice to State Forester. The measure, however, is necessary to achieve a balanced budget for the 2013-15 biennium. The measure is effective on passage. (Committee vote: 11-0-1)
