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**HOUSE BILLS:**

**HB 2357-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **03/23/15**                      **Barker**  
 Modifies law enforcement defenses to crimes of unlawful possession of firearms and possession of firearm or dangerous weapon in public building or court facility. Provides law enforcement with protections afforded to concealed handgun license holders. Applies to both honorably retired and off-duty police officers. Specifies that bill only applies to parole and probation officers acting within scope of employment. Allows honorably retired police officers to cast artificial light from vehicle while in immediate presence of a firearm or bow and arrow. Permits law enforcement to operate snowmobile and all-terrain vehicle with loaded firearm or bow and arrow. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

**HB 2424-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **03/23/15**                      **Krieger**  
 Allows authorized staff member of Department of Corrections (DOC), State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision and Oregon Corrections Enterprises assigned to work in department building to store personal handgun and ammunition in vehicle if certain conditions are met. Defines “vehicle” to include motorcycle, passenger car, van or truck, as well as soft top convertible and jeep. Provides that department does not have duty to inspect or secure vehicles or parking areas, or determine staff compliance with law. Directs department to adopt written policies or rules to regulate possession and storage of personal handgun and ammunition. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

**HB 2628-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **03/23/15**                      **Lininger**  
 Disallows all filing fees, service fees and hearing fees in action for court’s stalking protective order even if additional relief sought. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

**HB 2886**                      **TED**                      **dp**                      **03/23/15**                      **Gorsek**  
 Provides clarification regarding who may participate in vehicle dealer auctions and who can display vehicles without holding a valid vehicle dealer certificate. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

 Establishes specific dates for elections on county, city and district measures that are not referred to people by county governing body, city governing body or district elections authority. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 6 - Barnhart, Hoyle, Kennemer, Nosse, Rayfield, Smith Warner; Nays: 2 - McLane, Wilson; Exc: 1 – Gilliam)

**HB 2969**                                      **BL**                                      **dp**    **03/23/15**                                      **Post**  
 Allows on-premises consumption of food and nonalcoholic beverages at certified smoke shops as long as food and beverages are not sold or offered by the shop. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-2)
