HB 2981	TED	dp	03/26/15	Bentz
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Directs Department of Transportation to erect and maintain a Fallen Hero roadside memorial sign for Specialist Mabry James Anders. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2930-A	HC	dpa PE	03/26/15	Keny-Guyer Kennemer
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Requires hospitals to adopt rules granting admitting privileges to Nurse Midwife Nurse Practitioners (NMNPs). Specifies that the adopted rules must include admitting privileges, be consistent with other medical staff privileges, permit NMNPs voting rights and address the governing of NMNPs credentialing. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2939-A	ED	dpa PE	03/26/15	Sprenger
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Prescribes salary calculation for substitute teachers in school district that has class schedule based on four-day week. Changes daily minimum salary multiplier to “1.125,” replacing “1.25.” Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 3082	HS	dp	03/30/15	Frederick
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Provides alternate definition of “low income” for purposes of property tax abatement for non-profit corporation relating to housing. Directs governing bodies to designate use of standard or alternative definition of “low income.” Allows governing bodies to change currently adopted definition of “low income.” Takes effect 91st day after sine die. Sunsets June 30, 2027. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

HB 2051-A **AGNR** **dpa PE** **03/30/15** **Krieger**
 Adjusts penalty for crime of criminal trespass in second degree in cases where trespass is related to hunting, angling, trapping or taking of wildlife. Establishes that criminal trespass in second degree is Class C misdemeanor if person has two or more convictions for such offense. Expands penalty for conviction of criminal trespass in second degree to include loss of privilege to apply for hunting or fishing license for period of two years. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2437-A **TED** **dpa PE** **03/30/15** **Gorsek**
 Authorizes the Oregon Business Development Department to enter into agreements for grants and other assistance including, but not limited to, direct purchase of goods or services related to entrepreneurial and industry development. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

HB 2629-A **HS** **dpa PE** **03/30/15** **Lininger**
 Directs rental property owners to provide one year notice of loan maturity and changes in rent assistance to tenants, local housing authority and relevant Oregon Housing and Community Services divisions. Prescribes required method of making notification. Specifies notice requirements. Sets penalty for failure to notify. Directs property owners inform tenants entering into rental agreement less than one year before loan maturity. Makes explicit owner's rights to evict tenants consistent with current statute. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

HB 2850-A **CPGE** **dpa PE** **03/30/15** **Huffman**
 Prohibits insurer from issuing individual long term care insurance policy before receiving either written designation of full name and residential address of at least one person, in addition to applicant, to whom insurer may send notice of lapse due to failure to pay premium, or a written waiver that applicant declines to designate another person. Requires insurance policy to provide for reinstatement of coverage within five months after lapse if insurer receives proof that policy holder was cognitively impaired or had loss of functional capacity before end of grace period for premium payments. Provides that notice of lapse of individual life, long term care or disability insurance policy is not effective unless insurer sends written notice to policy owner at least 30 days before lapse date. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

HB 2893 **BL** **dp** **03/30/15** **Davis**
 Permits financial institutions to conduct savings promotion raffle subject to specified conditions. Allows Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules regarding savings promotion raffles. Exempts savings promotion raffles from definition of gambling. Becomes operative January 1, 2016; declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 11-0-0)

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HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2208-A **RULES** **dpa PE** **03/31/15** **McKeown**
 Adds civil code enforcement officers to public officials who may request exemption from required disclosure under public records law of specified personal information. Defines “civil code enforcement officer.” Permits civil code enforcement officers to request that any driver or vehicle record kept by Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) containing, or is required to contain, eligible employee’s residence address, contain instead address of public agency employing eligible public employee. (Committee vote: 7-0-2)

HB 2326 **JUD** **dp** **03/31/15** **Krieger**
 Amends “conditional discharge” statute to authorize continued jurisdiction over defendant until final disposition. Prohibits dismissal until probation terms have been satisfied. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

HB 2420-A **JUD** **dpa PE** **03/31/15** **Greenlick**
 Requires community mental health director or designee to consult in all criminal cases with defendant who lacks capacity. Establishes that community mental health director or designee must determine whether community restoration services are available and provide findings to the court. Establishes that consultation must occur prior to commitment at state hospital for restoration. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

HB 2596-A **JUD** **dpa PE** **03/31/15** **Buckley,
Olson**

Modifies crime of “Invasion of Personal Privacy.” Defines terms. (Committee vote: 6-0-3)

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HB 3084-A **RCLUW** **dpa PE** **03/31/15** **Fagan,
Kennemer**

Defines terms. Requires filing with mayor and governing body, with a copy to Metro and Department of Land Conservation and Development, to withdraw tracts from City of Damascus. Requires a determination of absence of undue hardship on operation of city at time of request for withdrawal. Requires public hearing on withdrawal of tract occur 30 days after receipt of request for withdrawal and requires public notice of public hearing be posted 10 days after receipt of request for withdrawal. Details requirements of public notice. Authorizes City Council to make determination on withdrawal within 30 days after receiving testimony at public hearing. Details steps that occur if City Council decides to permit withdrawal or rejects withdrawal. Requires determination from City Council be made within 30 days or withdrawal is deemed complete. Identifies which organizations must be notified of changes to city boundaries. Prohibits reannexation of withdrawn tracts for a period of 10 years. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

HB 3085 **RCLUW** **dp** **03/31/15** **Fagan,
Kennemer**

Refers Act to people of City of Damascus for approval or rejection at next general election held throughout state. Requires a majority of voters voting on Act to approve law. Requires City of Damascus to surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist 60 days after election. Requires city to satisfy all outstanding legal debts and obligations and expend all moneys as provided by law and to convey all real property and tangible and intangible personal property to Clackamas County 30 days after election. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

SENATE BILL:

SB 342 **JUD** **dp** **03/31/15** **Post**

Revises statutes to maintain accuracy. Corrects punctuation and grammatical errors. Conforms language to legislative style. Removes obsolete references, standardizes terminology, and replaces references to abolished state agencies. Makes other nonsubstantive corrections. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

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
