HB 2330-A	JUD	concur	04/06/15	Barton
Allows converting business entities, limited liability corporations, nonprofit corporations and cooperative corporations to file written declaration stating location where plan of conversion is on file and stating that converting entity will provide any owner with a copy of the plan upon request and without cost in lieu of submitting plans to Secretary of State (SOS). Modifies documents required to be filed with SOS upon approval of plan to merge or share exchange. Requires written notice of dissenters' rights be delivered to all shareholders entitled to notice when corporate action creating dissenters' rights is authorized by written consent without meeting. Senate amendments Adds provisions to mergers and conversions for cooperative corporations similar to mergers and conversions for other types of business entities. (Senate vote: 30-0)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2184 **AGNR** **dp** **04/03/15** **Stark**
 Directs Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) and Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) to provide link from ODOT website to OPRD website for purpose of providing information about how to purchase day-use parking passes for state parks requiring pass. Directs OPRD to work with ODOT and other state agencies to provide certain information regarding purchase of day-use parking passes at ODOT field offices where applications for driver licenses or vehicle registrations are accepted. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2300-A **HC** **dpa PE** **04/02/15** **Buehler**
 Creates and specifies providers, methods and criteria by which a health care practitioner may offer to treat patient who has a terminal illness with an investigational product that is not approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration. Defines "terminal disease." States that insurers are not required to reimburse any cost associated with the treatment. Specifies that hospice care must be determined on a patient's overall prognosis, care or treatment goals. Specifies protections of waiver of liability for health care practitioners, health care facilities and professional organizations or associations that comply with the measure. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2305-A **HC** **dpa PE** **04/02/15** **Lively**
 Allows individuals who complete a polysomnographic program that combines education and training to apply for the polysomnographic technologist license. Clarifies that an individual that has met the required education and training, and who has obtained and maintained the nationally recognized credential, meets the prerequisites for licensure by the Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2414 **HS** **dp** **04/02/15** **Piluso**
 Allows Department of Human Services to add genetic siblings of adoptees to voluntary adoption search registry. Defines rules for addition of and search for minor siblings on registry. Allows sharing certain types of information electronically. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2473-A **HS** **dpa PE** **04/02/15** **Stark**
 Allows State Board of Licensed Social Workers to adopt rules on temporary licensure, including establishing fees. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2637-A **CPGE** **dpa PE** **04/03/15** **Lively**
 Makes material misrepresentations in commercial communications about mortgage credit products an unlawful trade practice. Prohibits person advertising mortgage credit products from knowingly omitting to identify self, or to state or represent that a connection exists between the advertiser and another person without that person's written agreement or consent. Requires advertisers to keep copies of all advertisements, including scripts and training materials, for 24 months. Makes failing to keep such records an unlawful trade practice for which the attorney general or district attorney may bring suit. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

HB 2670-A **HEDIW** **dpa PE** **04/02/15** **Buckley**
 Allows in-state tuition in specified circumstances for individuals who resided in Oregon but relocated due to position in military, government or humanitarian aid organization and subsequently served in military, government or humanitarian aid organization. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2694 **HS** **dp** **04/02/15** **Gallegos**
 Permits Department of Human Services (DHS) social workers to report suspected animal abuse or neglect as a function of their employment. Provides immunity for social workers acting in good faith. Applies retroactively. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3050 **EE** **dp** **04/02/15** **Lively**
 Modifies requirements for composition of boards of directors of regional air quality control authorities. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 3335-A **HEDIW** **dpa PE** **04/02/15** **Greenlick**
 Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to work with public universities to address problem of students who successfully complete two or more years of coursework and leave with no official recognition of academic accomplishments. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Gallegos, Hayden, Johnson, McKeown, Read, Reardon, Whisnant, Williamson; Nays: 1 - Nearman)
