**HB 2219-A**                      **HS**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Nathanson**  
 Directs Department of Human Service (DHS) to convene application consolidation workgroup for human services programs. Requires report to Legislature by September 15, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 2341-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Williamson**  
 Authorizes court to order extradition costs when defendant is found in violation of probation after leaving state in violation of probation. Directs fees collected for extradition to be placed in "Arrest and Return Account." (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2349-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Lininger**  
 Modifies information required in petition for appointment of professional fiduciary. Requires inclusion of investment credentials and securities licensing information for individual responsible as, or acting on behalf of, professional fiduciary. Requires disclosure of revenue sharing and method of fee determination. Requires annual accounting to court to include total compensation that investment advisers or brokers, other than professional fiduciary, charged or received for investment management. Includes acknowledgment that professional fiduciary will make all investments in accordance with the Uniform Prudent Investor Act. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2394-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Olson**  
 Requires Oregon State Lottery Commission to notify Department of Human Services of prize recipient's name, Social Security number, and other identifying information, within seven days of paying Lottery prize of \$1,250 or more. Declares emergency; effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 2557-A**                      **JUD**                      **dp**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Greenlick**  
 Authorizes court to set aside findings of guilty except for insanity. Establishes criteria and process. Adds Psychiatric Security Review Board, Department of Human Services, and Oregon Health Authority to certain definitions that apply to expunction of juvenile case records. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2561-A**                      **HEDIW**                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Greenlick**  
 Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to evaluate best method for overseeing public universities to ensure that at least one minority applicant is interviewed when hiring head coach or athletic director. Requires consultation with representatives of one National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) institution and one non-NCAA institution. Directs HECC to evaluate disparities in hiring female head coaches and athletic directors and identify most effective means of correction. Requires HECC to report results of evaluation during 2016 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Gallegos, Hayden, Johnson, McKeown, Read, Reardon, Whisnant, Williamson Nays: 1 - Nearman)

**HB 2597-A**                      **ED**                                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Buckley**  
 Requires that notice of truancy delivered to truant student must state that parent has right to request Individualized Education Program (IEP) evaluation meeting, or review for student already on IEP. Further requires truancy proceedings, including but not limited to those that lead to legal citation against parents by school administrator, to be paused until conclusion of IEP request made. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 2845-A**                      **CPGE**                                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Nearman**  
 Establishes conditions under which person may sell guaranteed asset protection waiver in connection with sale or lease of motor vehicle. Specifies conditions under which purchaser may cancel or creditor may terminate guaranteed asset protection waiver. Requires person who sells guaranteed asset protection waiver in connection with retail sale of motor vehicle to insure waiver with reimbursement insurance policy. Provides conditions for reimbursement insurance. Makes violation subject to private right of action under the Unlawful Trade Practices Act. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

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**HB 2847-A**                      **ED**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Johnson  
McKeown**

Requires ASPIRE programs to annually provide financial aid instruction to high school students and their families, including different types of loans available to students attending post-secondary institutions of education and economic impact of each type of loan. Indicates that instruction should be in conjunction with the existing ASPIRE programming. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2973-A**                      **HEDIW**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Whisnant**

Directs public universities to work toward providing four-year affordable, fixed-cost baccalaureate degrees and community colleges to assist them. Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to analyze available options for affordable degrees and report findings to 2016 Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 3031-A**                      **CPGE**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Fagan**

Requires that caller using automatic dialing and announcing device must provide, within first 10 seconds, method for subscriber being called to notify caller via a single signal or code that subscriber does not wish to receive future calls. Requires caller using automatic dialing and announcing device to exclude from call list subscribers who notified caller of wish not to receive future calls. Allows prosecuting attorney to require person believed to have information about unlawful robocalls to testify and provide evidence as part of investigation. Applies to calls made on or after January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

**HB 3039-A**                      **ED**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Frederick**

Allows district school board to enter into partnership for purpose of acquiring, leasing or improving real property for educational purposes. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 3156-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/06/15**                      **Williamson**

Provides that collection of child support may be suspended upon change in custody if collection would impair ability of obligor with physical custody of children to provide support. Adds grounds for objection on factual basis of suspension. Removes requirement that obligee not object to suspension of enforcement prior to terminating enforcement. Makes clarifying changes. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

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**HB 3158**                      **JUD**                      **dp**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Williamson**

Repeals requirement that later-issued child support judgment, when two child support judgments involve same obligor, same child, and same period, be entered before January 1, 2004. Makes clarifying changes. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 3159-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Williamson**

Specifies that when debt is created by presentation of dishonored check on behalf of obligor, the amount of money specified on the check is owed by all. Further clarifies that the state may collect in any circumstance from the obligor, but only from the withholder or other issuer if that party presented the check. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 3257**                      **EE**                      **dp**                                      **04/06/15**                      **Helm**

Extends sunset on collection of certain moneys from electric companies or Oregon Community Power for purposes related to low-income electric bill payment assistance from January 2, 2016 to January 2, 2018. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

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
