PROPOSITIONS AND MOTIONS:

(Possible Consideration of Senate Amendments)

HB 2485-A **REV** **04/08/15** **Barnhart**

Clarifies that refund made for correction in property taxes owed resulting from appeal is made to individual who filed the appeal. Aligns time limitation for property tax refunds with time limitation for roll corrections (five years). Authorizes refund due to proration of taxes for destroyed or damaged property and clarifies refund is made to applicant of the proration. Extends certain property tax rules currently applicable to manufactured structures to floating homes. Increases threshold for cancelling delinquent property taxes from five to ten dollars, aligning with current threshold for refunds. Takes effect 91 days following adjournment sine die. Amends Enrolled Senate Bill 611 (2015) to require qualifying capital investment in communication infrastructure to enable company to offer communication services, including the capacity to provide, at least, approximately one gigabit per second symmetrical service. Modifies exemption time period to be the period during which an owner maintains and operates the qualified project. **Senate amendments: Modifies SB 611 capacity requirement language of capital investment exemption. Requires infrastructure of qualifying project to enable the company to offer communication services, including the capacity to provide, at least, approximately one gigabit per second symmetrical service, to a majority of the residential customers of the company's broadband services. Modifies exemption time period. Exemption granted to be the period during which an owner maintains and operates the qualified project.** (Senate vote: 30-0)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 3031-A **CPGE** **dpa PE** **04/06/15** **Fagan**

Requires that caller using automatic dialing and announcing device must provide, within first 10 seconds, method for subscriber being called to notify caller via a single signal or code that subscriber does not wish to receive future calls. Requires caller using automatic dialing and announcing device to exclude from call list subscribers who notified caller of wish not to receive future calls. Allows prosecuting attorney to require person believed to have information about unlawful robocalls to testify and provide evidence as part of investigation. Applies to calls made on or after January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

HB 3039-A **ED** **dpa PE** **04/06/15** **Frederick**
 Allows district school board to enter into partnership for purpose of acquiring, leasing or improving real property for educational purposes. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)
Please note: Has minimal fiscal impact, no statement issued.

HB 3156-A **JUD** **dpa PE** **04/06/15** **Williamson**
 Provides that collection of child support may be suspended upon change in custody if collection would impair ability of obligor with physical custody of children to provide support. Adds grounds for objection on factual basis of suspension. Removes requirement that obligee not object to suspension of enforcement prior to terminating enforcement. Makes clarifying changes. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3158 **JUD** **dp** **04/06/15** **Williamson**
 Repeals requirement that later-issued child support judgment, when two child support judgments involve same obligor, same child, and same period, be entered before January 1, 2004. Makes clarifying changes. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3159-A **JUD** **dpa PE** **04/06/15** **Williamson**
 Specifies that when debt is created by presentation of dishonored check on behalf of obligor, the amount of money specified on the check is owed by all. Further clarifies that the state may collect in any circumstance from the obligor, but only from the withholder or other issuer if that party presented the check. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3257 **EE** **dp** **04/06/15** **Helm**
 Extends sunset on collection of certain moneys from electric companies or Oregon Community Power for purposes related to low-income electric bill payment assistance from January 2, 2016 to January 2, 2018. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2038-A **RCLUW** **dpa PE** **04/07/15** **Huffman**
 Defines terms. Specifies landowner is not liable for any personal injury, death or property damage arising from use of land for purposes of aviation activity, unless owner intentionally causes injury, death or property damage. Does not apply to owner of public airstrip; owner of private airstrip if owner is contacted by operator before beginning of aircraft's flight, owner provides permission to use land, and gross negligence by owner causes injury, death or property damage related to aircraft's flight; or if owner imposes a charge for use of land for aviation purposes. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

HB 2131 **REV** **dp** **04/07/15** **Vega Pederson**
 Makes Ad valorem property taxes a security pledge for bonded indebtedness, and the property tax levy subject to a lien. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2148-A **REV** **dp** **04/07/15** **Davis**
 Exempts permanent improvements located on federal land held in trust for federally recognized Indian tribe or tribe member from state and local property taxes, fees, charges and assessments. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Barnhart, Bentz, Davis, Johnson, Lininger, Read, Smith Warner, Vega Pederson Nays: 1 - Whitsett)

HB 2660-A **JUD** **dpa PE** **04/07/15** **Olson**
 Allows court discretion in ordering ignition interlock device (IID) in driving under the influence of intoxicants (DUII) diversion case if defendant submitted to chemical test of his or her breath or blood with result less than .08 percent by weight and the chemical test detected presence of alcohol only. Reorganizes fee and license suspension portions of IID laws. (Committee vote; Yeas: 6 - Barker, Greenlick, Krieger, Lininger, Olson, Williamson; Nays: 3 - Barton, Post, Sprenger)

HB 3042 **RULES** **dp** **04/07/15** **Boone**
 Designates April 14 of each year as Honorary Artists of Oregon Day. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 3104-A **TED** **dpa PE** **04/07/15** **McKeown**
 Authorizes rural ports to acquire and operate telecommunications and infrastructure facilities. (Committee vote: 5-0-2)

HB 3466-A **JUD** **dpa PE** **04/07/15** **Williamson**
 States that release criteria for defendant charged with sex crime or crime constituting domestic violence must include prohibition on contact or attempted contact with victim, either directly or through third party. Provides that when defendant charged with sex crime or crime involving domestic violence, court must enter order prohibiting contact or attempted contact with victim, either directly or through third party, while defendant is in custody. Contains exemption for defense attorney or defense attorney agent other than defendant. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3469 **JUD** **dp** **04/07/15** **Barton**
 Increases penalty for crime of strangulation if defendant knows victim is pregnant. Makes crime a Class C felony, with maximum punishment of five years imprisonment, \$125,000 fine or both. Expands types of previous convictions that elevate assault in the fourth degree to from Class A misdemeanor to Class C felony. (Committee vote: Yeas: 7 - Barker, Barton, Krieger, Lininger, Olson, Post, Williamson; Nays: 1 – Greenlick; Exc: 1 – Sprenger)

HB 3476 **JUD** **dp** **04/07/15** **Lininger**
 Creates privilege in civil, criminal, administrative and school proceedings for certain communications between victims seeking services related to sexual assault, domestic violence or stalking and qualified victim advocates and services programs. Prohibits disclosure of confidential communications without consent of victim. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)
