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HOUSE BILLS:

<u>HB 3104-A</u>	TED	dpa PE	04/07/15	McKeown
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Authorizes rural ports to acquire and operate telecommunications and infrastructure facilities. (Committee vote: 5-0-2)

<u>HB 3466-A</u>	JUD	dpa PE	04/07/15	Williamson
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States that release criteria for defendant charged with sex crime or crime constituting domestic violence must include prohibition on contact or attempted contact with victim, either directly or through third party. Provides that when defendant charged with sex crime or crime involving domestic violence, court must enter order prohibiting contact or attempted contact with victim, either directly or through third party, while defendant is in custody. Contains exemption for defense attorney or defense attorney agent other than defendant. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

<u>HB 3469</u>	JUD	dp	04/07/15	Barton
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Increases penalty for crime of strangulation if defendant knows victim is pregnant. Makes crime a Class C felony, with maximum punishment of five years imprisonment, \$125,000 fine or both. Expands types of previous convictions that elevate assault in the fourth degree to from Class A misdemeanor to Class C felony. (Committee vote: Yeas: 7 - Barker, Barton, Krieger, Lininger, Olson, Post, Williamson; Nays: 1 - Greenlick; Exc: 1 - Sprenger)

<u>HB 3476</u>	JUD	dp	04/07/15	Lininger
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Creates privilege in civil, criminal, administrative and school proceedings for certain communications between victims seeking services related to sexual assault, domestic violence or stalking and qualified victim advocates and services programs. Prohibits disclosure of confidential communications without consent of victim. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 2128 **REV** **dp** **04/08/15** **Barnhart**
 Establishes personal liability of lessee for property taxes, when the property is leased from an exempt federal, state or local government. Provides counties with means of collecting unpaid taxes from a person and their real and personal property. Requires county clerk to immediately issue writs of attachment on application by tax collector or district attorney for the county as plaintiff. Applies to property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2015. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2129 **REV** **dp** **04/08/15** **Bentz**
 Allows taxpayer to petition county assessor for correction in maximum assessed value of property for the current tax year upon demonstrating that new property or improvement to property added to the tax roll in a prior tax year did not exist as of the assessment date for that prior tax year or any subsequent tax year. Requires assessor to correct maximum assessed value of property for current tax year in manner determined by assessor. Correction must reflect, in a manner determined by assessor, removal of the new property or improvements. Requires property constituting an integral part of the land or improvements that has been continuously in existence since the prior tax year and was not included in any assessment for prior tax years to be considered new property or new improvements to property. Applies to property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: Yeas: 7 - Barnhart, Bentz, Johnson, Lininger, Read, Smith Warner, Vega Pederson; Nays: 2 - Davis, Whitsett)

HB 2474-A **AGNR** **dpa PE** **04/08/15** **Gorsek**
 Prohibits veterinary facilities from offering services related to veterinary medicine, surgery or dentistry unless facility registers with Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board (Board) and designates licensed veterinarian to ensure facility is in compliance with rules adopted by Board. Requires Board to adopt rules and specify fees for registering and renewing veterinary facility licenses and establish health and safety standards for veterinary facilities. Creates rules advisory committee and details committee membership. Authorizes Board to inspect facilities to ensure compliance with rules and suspend or revoke registration for failure to comply. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2525-A **HEDIW** **dpa PE** **04/08/15** **Witt, Komp**
 Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to convene work group to assess information available to students related to credits required for baccalaureate degree. Requires HECC to determine feasibility and cost of implementing transfer credit valuation system for all public universities and community colleges in Oregon. Directs HECC to submit report to Legislative Assembly no later than July 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

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HB 3001-A **REV** **dpa PE** **04/08/15** **Esquivel**
 Allows application for determination of real market value and assessed value of property destroyed or damaged between January 1 and July 1 to be filed on or before December 31. Applies to property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2014. Repeals redundant provision of law. Requires applications filed after the later of August 1 of the current year or the 60th day following the date on which the property was damaged or destroyed, but still filed prior to December 31, to be accompanied by a late filing fee in amount equal to greater of \$200 or one-tenth of one percent of the real market value of property to which application relates. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 3044-A **ED** **dpa PE** **04/08/15** **McLain**
 Requires public charter school to notify district school board of other school district and of sponsor school district if public charter school uses real property in other school district for school or for facility to provide instruction. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2440-A **BL** **dpa PE** **04/09/15** **Esquivel**
 Allows claimant to be eligible for unemployment insurance benefits when outside the local labor market for purpose of applying for employment within the local labor market. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 11-0-0)

HB 2559-A **EE** **dpa PE** **04/09/15** **Greenlick**
 Prohibits person conveying fee title to real property from including in instrument provision prohibiting installation and use of solar panels on residential lots. Declares provision in declaration or bylaws of planned community or condominium prohibiting owner from installing or using solar panels as void and unenforceable; specifies owner is person who owns roof or other exterior portion of building or improvement on which solar panels would be installed. Allows owner of record of property to file petition to remove such provision. (Committee vote: Yeas: 5 - Boone, Helm, Holvey, Reardon, Vega Pederson; Nays: 4 - Bentz, Heard, Johnson, Weidner)

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HB 2605-A **HC** **dpa PE** **04/09/15** **Nosse**
 Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to convene a stakeholder work group to consider modifying the standard for rate review process. Specifies issues to be reviewed. Directs DCBS to make a preliminary decision to approve, disapprove or modify a rate filing; to notify the insurer of preliminary decision; and to make public the preliminary decision. Establishes a grievance process if insurer does not agree with decision and specifies that DCBS is to issue an order of the decision no later than 30 days following preliminary decision, and outlines how the order shall be processed. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)
