**HB 2317-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/10/15**                      **Williamson**  
 Provides that prosecution for crimes of rape in the first degree, sodomy in the first degree, unlawful sexual penetration in the first degree and sexual abuse in the first degree may be commenced within 12 years after commission of offense. Specifies that if victim was minor at time of offense, prosecution may be commenced either within 12 years or before victim attains 30 years of age. Prescribes that bill applies to offenses committed before, on or after act, but that act does not operate to revive previously barred prosecutions. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Barker, Barton, Krieger, Lininger, Olson, Post, Sprenger, Williamson; Nays: 1 - Greenlick)

**HB 2889-A**                      **HS**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/10/15**                      **Piluso**  
 Directs Department of Human Services (DHS) to permit savings accounts and establish monitoring system for children 12 years or older in DHS’ custody, via rulemaking. Entitles children in care for six or more months to assistance establishing savings accounts. Prohibits DHS or other legal guardian, as defined, from establishing accounts on behalf of child. Allows DHS to monitor use of child’s money relating to state and federal benefits. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Buehler, Evans, Gallegos, Hayden, Keny-Guyer, Piluso, Stark, Taylor; Nays: 1 – Parrish)

**HB 2890-A**                      **HS**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/10/15**                      **Stark**  
 Directs Department of Human Services to provide for participation in extracurricular activities for children in its care, in coordination with agencies and foster parents. Defines “extracurricular activities.” Defines “reasonable and prudent parenting standards.” (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 3045**                      **ED**                      **dp**                                      **04/10/15**                      **Sprenger**  
Removes requirement that school district transfer moneys to other school district for student who attends public charter school in school district and is resident of other school district. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 3239**                      **BL**                      **dp**                                      **04/10/15**                      **Esquivel, Clem**  
Expands the definition of lender, for purposes of Beginning and Expanding Farmer Loan Program, to include: anyone selling agricultural land to a beginning farmer; an institution organized under the federal Farm Credit Act; and any other person or entity defined by the Oregon Business Development Department through administrative rule. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 11-0-0)

**HB 2423**                      **JUD**                      **dp**                                      **04/13/15**                      **Barton**  
Establishes that Department of Corrections (DOC) inmates serving life sentences for certain crimes are not eligible for earned time reduction in prison sentences. Eliminates certain earned time reductions available to inmates of DOC for completion of education credentials. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

Repeals January 1, 2016 sunset on Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB) designation as Oregon's Alcohol Tobacco and Firearm (ATF) certified gun relief authority. Authorizes PSRB to conduct relief hearings for persons found guilty except insanity for misdemeanors involving violence. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 2460-A**                      **RCLUM**                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/13/15**                      **Clem**  
Authorizes Department of State Lands (DSL) to establish and impose one-time application fee on person applying for easement to construct water, gas, electric, or communication service line, fixture or other facility on state land. Prohibits DSL from imposing application fee more than once per application for easement. Requires application for easement to include all crossing of state land within county. In case where easement is needed in area involving two counties, permits one application and limits DSL to one application fee. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 5-0-2)

**HB 2551-A**                      **HC**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Greenlick**  
 Requires covered entities (i.e., private health insurers, health care providers and health care clearinghouses) that are required to file an annual financial statement with the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to also file a protection of health information report demonstrating compliance with federal and state laws protecting individually identifiable health information. Specifies that the report can be a letter and outlines criteria. States the report is confidential. Requires that a health care facility submit a health information report to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) no later than 120 days following the close of each fiscal year. Requires OHA to prescribe the form for submitting the report. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 2578-A**                      **CPGE**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Barnhart**  
 Provides that individual in hospice program, or next of kin or representative of individual who has died, may terminate residential cable or telecommunications service contract without penalty. Allows provider of cable or telecommunications service to require documentation that individual is in hospice or has died. Allows Oregon Health Authority to impose civil penalty up to \$1,000 for violations. Applies to contracts entered into or renewed after effective date. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

**HB 2664-A**                      **CPGE**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Hoyle**  
 Subjects university with governing board, or not-for-profit organization or other entity controlled by university with governing board, to certain prevailing wage provisions of Public Contracting Code. Applies prevailing wage provisions of Public Contracting Code to agreements with private entity to construct, reconstruct, renovate or paint an improvement on real property owned by university with governing board or a not-for-profit that it controls. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 4 - Fagan, Holvey, McLain, Rayfield;  
 Nays: 3 - Buehler, Nearman, Stark)

**HB 2830-A**                      **RCLUM**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Helm**  
 Lengthens time period from 90 to 120 days for local government to take action on application for permit, limited land use decision, or zone change after remand based on final order of Land Use Board of Appeals. Removes requirement of written request to begin time period. Requires permit applicant to submit request in writing to county to proceed with application on remand and to begin 120-day period before final order required. Permits county to terminate application if county does not receive request within 180 days of effective date of final order or final resolution of judicial review. Permits extension beyond 120-day period up to 365 additional days if parties enter into mediation. Permits county to terminate application if matter is not resolved through mediation prior to expiration of 365-day extension. (Committee vote: 5-0-2)

**HB 3021-A**                      **HC**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Keny-Guyer**  
Increases insurers payment method transparency for providers. Establishes criteria for providers and insurers who choose to use virtual credit card payments or other payment options. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 3056-A**                      **CPGE**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Keny-Guyer**  
Allows State Mortuary and Cemetery Board to refuse to issue certificate of authority to operate crematorium, or suspend or revoke certificate, if board determines crematorium endangers public health and safety. Establishes that board must consider whether crematorium has met national industry standards for training and equipment. (Committee vote: Yeas: 6 - Buehler, Fagan, Holvey, McLain, Rayfield, Stark; Nays: 1 - Nearman)

**HB 3132**                      **HC**                      **dp**                      **04/13/15**                      **Helm**  
Expands definition of “hospital facility” to include “behavioral treatment facility” and “family safety facility” for the purpose of allowing local authorities to issue conduit bonds for capital projects. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 3308-A**                      **HEDIW**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/13/15**                      **Gallegos**  
Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to convene work group to analyze and make recommendations on how to address disparities in higher education among traditionally marginalized, underserved and underrepresented communities. Requires work group to submit report detailing analysis and recommendations to interim legislative committees on higher education by September 15, 2015. Sunsets work group on December 31, 2017. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 5 - Gallegos, McKeown, Read, Reardon, Williamson; Nays: 4 - Hayden, Johnson, Nearman, Whisnant)
