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HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2830-A **RCLUM** **dpa PE** **04/13/15** **Helm**
 Lengthens time period from 90 to 120 days for local government to take action on application for permit, limited land use decision, or zone change after remand based on final order of Land Use Board of Appeals. Removes requirement of written request to begin time period. Requires permit applicant to submit request in writing to county to proceed with application on remand and to begin 120-day period before final order required. Permits county to terminate application if county does not receive request within 180 days of effective date of final order or final resolution of judicial review. Permits extension beyond 120-day period up to 365 additional days if parties enter into mediation. Permits county to terminate application if matter is not resolved through mediation prior to expiration of 365-day extension. (Committee vote: 5-0-2)

HB 3021-A **HC** **dpa PE** **04/13/15** **Keny-Guyer**
 Increases insurers payment method transparency for providers. Establishes criteria for providers and insurers who choose to use virtual credit card payments or other payment options. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3056-A **CPGE** **dpa PE** **04/13/15** **Keny-Guyer**
 Allows State Mortuary and Cemetery Board to refuse to issue certificate of authority to operate crematorium, or suspend or revoke certificate, if board determines crematorium endangers public health and safety. Establishes that board must consider whether crematorium has met national industry standards for training and equipment. (Committee vote: Yeas: 6 - Buehler, Fagan, Holvey, McLain, Rayfield, Stark; Nays: 1 – Nearman)

HB 3132 **HC** **dp** **04/13/15** **Helm**
 Expands definition of “hospital facility” to include “behavioral treatment facility” and “family safety facility” for the purpose of allowing local authorities to issue conduit bonds for capital projects. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

HB 3308-A **HEDIW** **dpa PE** **04/13/15** **Gallegos**
 Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to convene work group to analyze and make recommendations on how to address disparities in higher education among traditionally marginalized, underserved and underrepresented communities. Requires work group to submit report detailing analysis and recommendations to interim legislative committees on higher education by September 15, 2015. Sunsets work group on December 31, 2017. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 5 - Gallegos, McKeown, Read, Reardon, Williamson; Nays: 4 - Hayden, Johnson, Nearman, Whisnant)

HB 3348-A **RULES** **dpa PE** **04/13/15** **Barnhart**
 Designates March 10 of each year as “Mighty Oregon” Day. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Barnhart, Gilliam, Hoyle, Kennemer, McLane, Nosse, Smith Warner, Wilson; Nays: 1 – Rayfield)

HOUSE BILLS:

HB 2211-A **BL** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Barton**
 Authorizes Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to impose civil penalty on service company for workers’ compensation claims processing violations revealed in annual audits. Specifies that Director may impose only one penalty for each separate violation by an employer, insurer or service company for deficiencies revealed in annual audits associated with claims processing performance. (Committee vote: 9-0-2)

HB 2350-A **BL** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Doherty**
 Updates and clarifies portions of Bank Act and related statutes. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-2)

HB 2426-A **VET** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Esquivel**
 Updates statutory authority and language for current 9-1-1 emergency systems consistent with modern communications technologies. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

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HB 2655-A **ED** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Gorsek**
 Directs State Board of Education to adopt specified standards related to student education records. Provides that parents and adult students have right to excuse student from statewide standardized summative assessment and that school districts must provide notice of that right to parents at beginning of school year. Mandates school district or public charter school shall provide notice of opt-out option. Mandates supervised study time for excused students. Mandates notice of information about summative assessments, including dates of assessments, class time required for administration of assessments, and information relating to assessment results, be sent to parents and adult students at least 30 days prior to administration of assessments. Details Department of Education process in case of school performance report being negatively impacted by individuals being excused from summative assessments. Sunsets portions of measure relating to reason for excuse after six years. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: Yeas: 7 - Barreto, Doherty, Frederick, Hack, McLain, Piluso, Wilson: Nays: 2 - Reardon, Sprenger)

HB 2681-A **HEDIW** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Komp**
 Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) and State Board of Education (SBE) to oversee work group on community college placement to include consideration of use of statewide summative assessment. Requires preliminary report to Legislative Assembly no later than February 1, 2016 and final report no later than September 15, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2687-A **AGNR** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Gomberg**
 Exempts person operating registered farm vehicle from law prohibiting carrying dog on external part of vehicle. Applies to offenses occurring on or after effective date. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 2797-A **BL** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Doherty**
 Requires subject employer to pay first installment of temporary disability compensation in workers' compensation claim within 14 days after employer has notice or knowledge of claim and of workers' disability if the medical provider authorizes the temporary disability compensation. (Committee vote: 9-0-2)

HB 3114-A **BL** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Kennemer**
 Allows injured worker to file workers' compensation claim within 90 days after health benefit plan rejects claim. Requires health benefit plan to pay benefits in accordance with terms, conditions and benefits of plan if workers' compensation claim is denied. (Committee vote: 9-0-2)

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HB 3375-A **ED** **dpa PE** **04/14/15** **Frederick**
 Revises and renames Minority Teacher Act of 1991. Changes references to educator employment goals as relative to percentage of students in district. Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to use federal reports on educator equity in certain monitoring activities. Mandates Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to require public teacher education programs to have plan to promote diverse educator output. Requires HECC and Oregon Education Investment Board (OEIB) to ensure implementation of plans. Removes school district-level plan requirements from measure, as introduced. Requires HECC and Education and Workforce Policy Advisor to report to Legislative Assembly each odd-numbered year. Replaces “technical assistance” with “guidance,” where appropriate. (Committee vote: 7-0-2)

HB 3382 **AGNR** **dp** **04/14/15** **Esquivel**
 Defines Willamette Valley Protected District (District). Extends sunset prohibiting general growing of canola in District from January 2, 2019 to July 1, 2019. Directs College of Agricultural Sciences (College) at Oregon State University to use field monitoring and research of canola to identify acreages on which canola can be grown within District. Allows State Department of Agriculture (Department) to authorize up to 500 acres of commercial growing of canola within District on acreage identified by College and in manner College has determined to be compatible with growing other crops. Allows Department to assess civil penalty up to \$25,000 against person who grows canola without authorization. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

HB 3487 **BL** **dp** **04/14/15** **Huffman**
 Requires licensed investigator to include name and license number in its advertisements. (Committee vote: 10-0-1)

HB 3495 **BL** **dp** **04/14/15** **Gomberg**
 Provides for employer and employee contributions to pension program and individual account program (IAP) of Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan to first be made for new members for wages attributed to services performed for the first full pay period following the six-month probationary period, without regard to when wages are considered earned for other purposes. (Committee vote: 9-0-2)

HB 3501 **BL** **dp** **04/14/15** **Hack**
 Revises voting requirements for certain actions related to formation or conversion of benefit company. (Committee vote: 10-0-1)

HCR 8-A **RULES** **Aa PE** **04/07/15** **Smith Warner**
Honoring the musical legacy of James Gilbert "Jim" Pepper. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

SENATE BILLS:

SB 85 **VET** **dp** **04/14/15** **Boone**
Permits local governments to provide financial assistance to property owners for seismic preparedness improvements. Specifies types of assistance and parameters of financial arrangements. Conditions financial agreements on written notice to, and consent of, any effected mortgages as specified. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

SB 927 **RULES** **dp** **04/14/15** **Smith Warner**
Modifies authority of metropolitan service district (METRO) to acquire or construct visitor-oriented facilities. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 5 - Barnhart, Hoyle, Nosse, Rayfield, Smith Warner: Nays: 3 - Kennemer, McLane, Wilson: Exc: 1 – Gilliam)

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
