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**SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS**

<b><u>HB 2762-A</u></b>	<b>EE</b>	<b>dpa PE</b>	<b>04/15/15</b>	<b>Nosse</b>
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Effective July 1, 2021, prohibits school district that provides breakfast or lunch at school site from using polystyrene foam plates, trays, food containers or food packaging. Allows school district to use polystyrene foam in meal service if district participates in recycling program for foam. Directs Department of Education to provide extension for school district able to show financial hardship experienced from complying with prohibition on use of polystyrene materials. Directs school district using polystyrene in meal service during 2014-2015 school year to establish plan to comply with measure. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

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Expresses policy position of state that regional transmission planning processes conducted for regions wholly or partly encompassing areas of state must adequately consider transmission of electricity from ocean renewable energy generated in Oregon’s territorial sea or within adjacent federal waters. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2277-A**                      **RCLUM**                      **dpa PE**    **04/20/15**    **Kotek**

Authorizes drainage districts to acquire, construct, reconstruct, repair, improve, or extend improvements to carry out purposes of Drainage District Act and requires board of supervisors of drainage district to hold public hearing, of which notice must be given 14 days in advance, before electing to engage in such activities. Authorizes drainage district board of supervisors to enact ordinances. Allows districts to charge fees for certain operations within district. Authorizes drainage districts to construct local improvements and form local improvement districts. Defines certain activities of drainage districts and improvement districts in counties with population over 700,000, within urban growth boundary or incorporated boundary as urban services and for purposes of sanitation, agriculture, and public health safety. Requires district to provide 10 to 21 days written notice to cities affected by ordinance. Prohibits district from imposing rates, fees, fines, or charges unless pursuant to intergovernmental or urban services agreement, except those rates, fees, fines, or charges levied against city as landowner. Requires district to consult, coordinate, and create agreements where certain conflicts may or do exist between two or more government units. Requires owner or operator of premises where flood control projects or other infrastructure is failing to submit plan and schedule for remedy to drainage district. Requires district to review plan and authorizes district board of supervisors to immediately take action if necessary to remedy failing infrastructure. Modifies definitions as applicable to Drainage District Act. Authorizes landowner that is not natural person to appoint designee to serve as representative. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

Changes membership of Oregon Innovation Council. Requires council to establish audit and accountability committee to monitor performance of council contracts. Revises responsibilities and reporting requirements. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2375-A**                      **CPGE**                      **dpa PE**    **04/20/15**    **Nathanson**

Requires state contracting agency to use solicitation template and contract form developed by the Attorney General and the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) as basis for all public procurements and contracts. Allows exception for unique procurements if agency receives approval from the Attorney General or DAS. Requires person conducting procurements for state agency to complete training or have professional experience. Requires DAS to establish training and experience requirements. Directs Secretary of State and State Treasurer to develop and use own forms and templates and establish training and experience standards for own staff conducting procurements or administering public contracts. Requires DAS to develop recommendations for promoting best practices, and to report to Legislative Assembly by November 30, 2015. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

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**HB 2412-A**                      **ED**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/20/15**                      **Doherty**  
Removes outdated provisions and updates terminology related to teachers. Removes requirement that Superintendents of Education Service Districts have additional certification. Eliminates certain requirements for becoming approved educator preparation provider or approved educator preparation program. Eliminates certain requirements for licensure of out-of-state applicants. Requires Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC) to adopt standards related to dyslexia education programs. Requires TSPC to report on adoption of standards to the Legislative Assembly no later than October 1, 2016. (Committee vote: 9-0-0)

**HB 2585-A**                      **EE**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/20/15**                      **Barnhart**  
Declares electric vehicle charging station to be personal property of owner of lot in planned community or unit in condominium unless different result is negotiated between parties. Clarifies that if owner of lot owns charging station, owner must obtain liability insurance policy if charging station is not hard-wired into electrical system and is not certified electrical product. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee vote: Yeas: 8 - Bentz, Boone, Heard, Helm, Holvey, Johnson, Reardon, Vega Pederson; Nays: 1 - Weidner)

**HB 2601-A**                      **JUD**                      **dpa PE**                      **04/20/15**                      **Smith Warner**  
Requires member of law enforcement agency possessing probable cause to believe custodial interference in the first or second degree, or kidnapping in the first or second degree, involving a child has occurred to notify Oregon State Police Missing Children Clearinghouse within 24 hours. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 8-0-1)

**HB 2831**                      **RCLUM**                      **dp**                      **04/20/15**                      **Helm**  
Defines terms. Modernizes language. On land zoned for exclusive farm use (EFU), prohibits property line adjustment resulting from subdivision or partition authorized by waiver so unit of land affected by adjustment is larger than two acres if unit is high value farmland, high value forestland, or within ground water restricted area; or five acres if unit is not high value farmland, high value forestland, or within ground water restricted area. (Committee vote: 6-0-1)

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**HB 2987**                      **CPGE**                      **dp**                                      **04/20/15**                      **Holvey**  
Removes requirement for contracting agency to reserve moneys for including green energy technology in constructing, reconstructing or renovating public building if contracting agency determines including green energy technology is not appropriate. Requires contracting agency to report to Department of Energy amount that would have been spent on green energy technology had contracting agency determined that including green energy technology was appropriate. Requires Department of Energy to report annually to Legislative Assembly on contracting agency compliance with reporting mandates. Declares emergency, effective on passage. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

**HB 3068-A**                      **EE**                                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/20/15**                      **Johnson**  
Directs Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to study and develop recommendations for legislation to reduce woodstove smoke. Identifies subjects to be evaluated in study. Directs DEQ to form work group to conduct study and requires work group include representatives of other state agencies, stakeholders, elected officials and others with expertise to inform study and represent urban and rural communities and different geographic regions of state. Requires DEQ to collaborate with specified agencies and consult with members of public from urban and rural communities, as well as different regions of state about preliminary findings and recommendations. Directs DEQ to submit initial report on preliminary findings and recommendations to legislative committee during 2016 regular session and final report on or before September 15, 2016. (Committee vote: Yeas: 7 - Bentz, Boone, Helm, Holvey, Johnson, Reardon, Vega Pederson; Nays: 2 - Heard, Weidner)

Modifies definition of "land use regulation" to include any law enacted, or rule adopted, solely for purpose of regulating farming practice that was allowed immediately prior to enactment or adoption. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)

**HB 3274-A**                      **RCLUM**                                      **dpa PE**                                      **04/20/15**                      **Wilson**  
Directs Oregon Business Development Department to conduct study on methods to expand broadband and telecommunications infrastructure in rural cities and counties. Requires study report to be submitted to interim legislative committees by December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee vote: 7-0-0)
