<u>HB 2195 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HHS</u>	Concur	5/20/2015	Keny-Guyer
<p>Requires Multnomah County, after reimbursements are made to county general fund for costs related to management and disposition of real property, to use proceeds acquired specifically by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens or by exchange for land originally acquired by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens, for: housing placement and support of youth and families with children; rental assistance and low income housing. Clarifies that counties' costs to determine boundaries are reimbursable. Makes explicit that Multnomah County may convey foreclosed properties to any governmental body if not needed for public use (ORS 271.330), and properties donated to government units or nonprofits for specified purposes (ORS 311.796). Senate Amendment Requires Multnomah County, after reimbursements are made to county general fund for costs, to use proceeds acquired specifically by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens or by exchange for land originally acquired by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens, for: housing placement and support of youth and families with children; rental assistance and low income housing. (Senate Vote: Ayes, 24; nays, 5--Baertschiger Jr, Boquist, Girod, Thatcher, Whitsett; excused, 1--Burdick.)</p>

<u>HB 2412 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HED</u>		5/20/2015	Doherty
<p>Removes outdated provisions and updates terminology related to teachers. Removes requirement that Superintendents of Education Service Districts have additional certification. Eliminates certain requirements for becoming approved educator preparation provider or approved educator preparation program. Eliminates certain requirements for licensure of out-of-state applicants. Removes specified approval requirements for certain contracts. Allows Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC) to take action reprimanding educator preparation program candidate if candidate engages in misconduct prior to completing program. Aligns language regarding membership to TSPC of private higher education representative appointee with language regarding public higher education representative appointee. Requires TSPC to adopt standards related to dyslexia education programs. Requires TSPC to report on adoption of standards to Legislative Assembly no later than October 1, 2016. Senate Amendment Removes requirement that TSPC annually approve contracts entered into by school districts when hiring post-secondary faculty for specific short-term instructional assignments at high school level. Removes requirement contracts be approved annually by governing boards of post-secondary institutions and school district. Allows TSPC to take action reprimanding educator preparation program candidate if candidate engages in misconduct prior to completing program. Aligns language regarding membership to TSPC of private higher education representative appointee with language regarding public higher</p>				

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education representative appointee. Permits Legislative Counsel to substitute references to 'teacher education institution' and 'teacher education program' with 'educator preparation provide' and 'educator preparation program' to harmonize and clarify law. (Senate Vote: Ayes, 27; nays, 2--Ferrioli, Whitsett; excused, 1--Burdick.)

Requires Access to Student Assistance Programs In Reach of Everyone (ASPIRE) programs annually provide financial aid instruction to high school students and make instruction available to their families. Allows instruction to be conducted in conjunction with existing ASPIRE programs. Requires instruction outline different types of loans available to students, potential use of individual development accounts (IDAs), and economic impacts of each type of loan. **Senate Amendment Requires programs also make financial aid instruction available to students' families.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Burdick.)

[HB 2974 B-Eng.](#) [HRULES](#) Concur 5/20/2015 Lininger

Requires Legislative Assembly to hold public hearings throughout state prior to proposing congressional or legislative reapportionment plan. Requires Legislative Assembly or Secretary of State, to extent practicable, to hold five public hearings after reapportionment plan is proposed but before plan is adopted. Requires hearings to be held either throughout state or with use of videoconferencing technologies. **Senate Amendment Removes Secretary of State from requirement for at least 10 public hearings prior to proposing legislative or congressional redistricting plan. Requires that of, at least, 10 public hearings prior to proposing legislative or congressional redistricting plan, one hearing is held in each of the congressional districts and to extent practicable, one hearing is held in each of the congressional districts after plan is proposed.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 28; nays, 1--Girod; excused, 1--Burdick.)

Third Reading Of House Bills:

[HB 2150 B-Eng.](#) [HREV](#) dpa PE 5/20/2015 Sprenger

Prevents additional weights that can be claimed due to double counting, when the extended weighted Average Daily Memberships (ADMw's) of public charter schools and non-charter schools are calculated independently of each other. Specifies the way the State School Fund is distributed to a school district whose public charter school ceased to operate in the previous school year. Takes effect on July 1, 2015. **House Amendment Replaces the bill.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

[HB 2266](#) [HREV](#) dp 5/20/2015 Davis

Specifies that vehicle dealers may be exempted from weight-mile taxes when operating a vehicle owned or controlled by the dealer, the vehicle is displaying dealer plates, and is being operated

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for test driving purposes while unloaded. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

HB 2448 B-Eng. **HREV** **dpa PE** **5/20/2015** **Vega Pederson**

Modifies the conservation program by requiring owners of projects with a cost of at least \$1 million to enter into a performance agreement and receive annual recertification. Requires information to be included in the recertification application. Allows the Department of Energy to inspect such projects. Applies to certifications submitted on or after September 1, 2015 and to tax year 2015 and later. **House Amendment Removes the sunset extension.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

SB 5 **HTED** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Komp**

Designates portion of State Highway 126 between Florence and Eugene to be renamed as William Tebeau Memorial Highway. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Bentz, Davis, Hack)

SB 77 **HBL** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Barton**

Prohibits the formation or incorporation of a corporation sole in Oregon on or after effective date of measure. Grandfathers existing corporations sole, contingent upon renewing registration.

Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 11)

SB 120 A-Eng. **HTED** **dp** **5/20/2015** **McLain**

Directs the Land Conservation and Development Commission to adopt or amend rules relating to transportation improvements. Authorizes cities and counties to use highway mobility targets as a basis for proposing transportation improvements outside of that city or county. Directs Department of Transportation and Department of Land Conservation and Development to jointly report to the legislative committees on transportation by September 16, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Bentz, Davis, Hack)

SB 139 **HTED** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Lively**

Decreases Travel Information Council membership from 11 members to nine members. Eliminates requirement that an organization that wishes to serve cookies, coffee or other nonalcoholic beverages at roadside rest areas must submit a request to the Council by a specified date. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Bentz, Davis, Hack)

SB 142 A-Eng. **HTED** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Lively**
 Subjects vehicles owned by transportation districts, county service districts and intergovernmental bodies formed to provide public transportation to laws regulating motor carriers. Deregulates for-hire carriers of persons. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Bentz, Davis, Hack)

SB 192 A-Eng. **HTED** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Weidner**
 Directs the Parks and Recreation Department to convene a work group to examine options for allowing users of all-terrain vehicles to operate on state highways and to report findings of the work group to the appropriate committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2016. Sunsets December 31, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Gorsek, Hack, McKeown)

SB 270 A-Eng. **HTED** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Gorsek**
 Reallocates moneys between transportation projects funded by the Jobs and Transportation Act of 2009. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Bentz, Davis, Hack)

SB 468 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Holvey**
 Provides Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries with authority to issue warrant for unpaid amounts due resulting from final order or judgment. Allows 30 days from date that amount becomes due prior to issuing warrant. Requires warrant to include principal amount of debt, accumulated interest, and costs associated with recording or serving warrant. (Committee Vote: Aye, 10; Nay, 1 --Weidner)

SB 596 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Kennemer**
 Requires construction flagging contractor to hold construction flagging license issued by Construction Contractors Board. Requires contractor to be bonded and carry insurance. Specifies that flagging contractor license does not authorize licensee to engage in activities requiring license other than construction flagging. Establishes effective date of July 1, 2017. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9; Nay, 2 --Barreto, Esquivel)

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SB 601 A-Eng. **HJUD** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Greenlick**

Updates Oregon Consumer Identity Theft Protection Act. Requires notification to Attorney General of breach of security that affects more than 250 consumers. Makes violation of Act unlawful trade practice enforceable by prosecuting attorney. Expands definition of "personal information" to include data from automatic measurements of physical characteristics, health insurance policy numbers in combination with other unique identifiers, and any information about consumers' mental or physical health, medical history, or diagnosis or treatment. Expands use of last four digits of certain numbers to include passport number, financial account number, and credit card number. Exempts entities covered by Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) when copy of notice sent to consumers or federal regulators is also sent to Attorney General. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Sprenger)

SB 681 **HBL** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Nosse**

Includes intergovernmental entities in definition of "local government" for purpose of benefit plans offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board. (Committee Vote: Aye, 11)

SB 919 **HJUD** **dp** **5/20/2015** **Barton**

Amends Disorderly Conduct statute. Elevates offense classification for those who falsely report hazardous substance, fire, explosion, catastrophe, or other emergency in all public buildings and court facilities to a Class A Misdemeanor for first offense, to a Class C Felony for each subsequent offense. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Sprenger)

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
