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Directs Department of Transportation to make efforts to complete installation of median barriers between opposing lanes of travel on interstate highways where distance between lanes is 100 feet or less, except in segments designated for emergency access or when Department determines that such a barrier may create a safety or operational hazard. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 3 --Gorsek, Hack, McKeown)

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Requires Multnomah County, after reimbursements are made to county general fund for costs related to management and disposition of real property, to use proceeds acquired specifically by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens or by exchange for land originally acquired by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens, for: housing placement and support of youth and families with children; rental assistance and low income housing. Clarifies that counties' costs to determine boundaries are reimbursable. Makes explicit that Multnomah County may convey foreclosed properties to any governmental body if not needed for public use (ORS 271.330), and properties donated to government units or nonprofits for specified purposes (ORS 311.796). **Senate Amendment Requires Multnomah County, after reimbursements are made to county general fund for costs, to use proceeds acquired specifically by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens or by exchange for land originally acquired by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens, for: housing placement and support of youth and families with children; rental assistance and low income housing.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 24; nays, 5--Baertschiger Jr, Boquist, Girod, Thatcher, Whitsett; excused, 1--Burdick.)

Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to establish the Oregon Health Information Technology Program. Authorizes OHA to provide optional health information technology (HIT) services to support statewide healthcare and establish fees to cover cost of expanding HIT services. Allows OHA to participate in or fund HIT partnerships or collaborative. Establishes the Health Information Technology Oversight Council (Council) under the Oregon Health Policy Board (OHPB), changes appointment authority from the Governor to the OHPB, and modifies the role of the Council to provide strategic and policy recommendations. Expands OHA scope to include certain activities to support the Oregon HIT program. Clarifies procurement procedures. Requires that OHA submit annual report to the Legislative Assembly. Requires Department of Administrative Services to procure or supervise procurement of information technology for OHA. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Removes Oregon Health Authority (OHA) exemption to require Department of Administrative Services to procure or supervise procurement of OHA's information technology.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 28; nays, 2--Johnson, Thomsen.)

Updates and clarifies portions of Bank Act and related statutes. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Removes requirement for banks to apply and pay fee to Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to open new branches. Requires thirty-day notification requirement to DCBS for opening new branches. Enables DCBS Director to limit additional branches if new branches would adversely affect the banking institution's safety and soundness.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Removes outdated provisions and updates terminology related to teachers. Removes requirement that Superintendents of Education Service Districts have additional certification. Eliminates certain requirements for becoming approved educator preparation provider or approved educator preparation program. Eliminates certain requirements for licensure of out-of-state applicants. Removes specified approval requirements for certain contracts. Allows Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC) to take action reprimanding educator preparation program candidate if candidate engages in misconduct prior to completing program. Aligns language regarding membership to TSPC of private higher education representative appointee with language regarding public higher education representative appointee. Requires TSPC to adopt standards related to dyslexia education programs. Requires TSPC to report on adoption of standards to Legislative Assembly no later than October 1, 2016. **Senate Amendment Removes requirement that TSPC annually approve contracts entered into by school districts when hiring post-secondary faculty for specific short-term instructional assignments at high school level. Removes requirement contracts be approved annually by governing boards of post-secondary institutions and school district. Allows TSPC to take action reprimanding educator preparation program candidate if candidate engages in misconduct prior to completing program. Aligns language regarding membership to TSPC of private**

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higher education representative appointee with language regarding public higher education representative appointee. Permits Legislative Counsel to substitute references to 'teacher education institution' and 'teacher education program' with 'educator preparation provide' and 'educator preparation program' to harmonize and clarify law. (Senate Vote: Ayes, 27; nays, 2--Ferrioli, Whitsett; excused, 1--Burdick.)

Requires Access to Student Assistance Programs In Reach of Everyone (ASPIRE) programs annually provide financial aid instruction to high school students and make instruction available to their families. Allows instruction to be conducted in conjunction with existing ASPIRE programs. Requires instruction outline different types of loans available to students, potential use of individual development accounts (IDAs), and economic impacts of each type of loan. **Senate Amendment Requires programs also make financial aid instruction available to students' families.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Burdick.)

Brings Oregon law into compliance with HR 4980, the federal Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2015. Specifies ward may be placed with fit and willing relative as option for permanency plan. Requires local citizen review board in dependency cases to include in findings and recommendations the steps Department of Human Services has taken to ensure that substitute care provider of child or ward 16 years of age or older in permanency plan of "another planned permanent living arrangement" is following reasonable and prudent parent standard and providing ongoing opportunities for child to participate in age-appropriate or developmentally-appropriate activities. Requires such description be included in six-month agency reports and in court's findings for continuation of substitute care. Defines "age-appropriate or developmentally appropriate activities." Defines "another planned permanent living arrangement." Defines "reasonable and prudent parent standard." Changes "independent living" to "successful adulthood." Requires inclusion of document describing rights and signed acknowledgment of copy of documents and explanation by ward within case plan. Declares emergency; effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Makes technical corrections.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Requires Legislative Assembly to hold public hearings throughout state prior to proposing congressional or legislative reapportionment plan. Requires Legislative Assembly or Secretary of State, to extent practicable, to hold five public hearings after reapportionment plan is proposed but before plan is adopted. Requires hearings to be held either throughout state or with use of videoconferencing technologies. **Senate Amendment Removes Secretary of State from requirement for at least 10 public hearings prior to proposing legislative or congressional redistricting plan. Requires that of, at least, 10 public hearings prior to proposing**

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**legislative or congressional redistricting plan, one hearing is held in each of the congressional districts and to extent practicable, one hearing is held in each of the congressional districts after plan is proposed.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 28; nays, 1--Girod; excused, 1--Burdick.)

Prevents additional weights that can be claimed due to double counting, when the extended weighted Average Daily Memberships (ADMw's) of public charter schools and non-charter schools are calculated independently of each other. Specifies the way the State School Fund is distributed to a school district whose public charter school ceased to operate in the previous school year. Takes effect on July 1, 2015. **House Amendment Replaces the bill.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

Specifies that vehicle dealers may be exempted from weight-mile taxes when operating a vehicle owned or controlled by the dealer, the vehicle is displaying dealer plates, and is being operated for test driving purposes while unloaded. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to determine whether economic impact statement is feasible. Requires that statements include both direct and indirect effects on the Oregon economy. **House Amendment Specifies that Legislators making request must be members of either the House Revenue Committee or the Senate Finance and Revenue Committee. Gives Legislative Revenue Officer authority to decide on feasibility of request.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to prepare report consisting of tax credits that have a revenue impact of 10% or more greater than the original revenue impact estimate at time of enactment or amendment. **House Amendment Adds "proponent" to "sponsor" as possible source of policy purpose statement. Clarifies that most recent data should be used for analysis, not necessarily most recent year.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Clarifies that writ of execution for foreclosure suit is not required to include money award in all circumstances. Requires inclusion of declaration of amount of debt lien secures, and if plaintiff requests in complaint, money award against lien debtor. Provides clarifying language to distinguish between in rem (action taken directly against property, not the title of individual claimants) and real property. Requires sheriff to deliver proceeds from execution sale to court administrator. Permits judgment creditor in foreclosure to bid on foreclosed property at execution sale or ahead of time in writing with certain requirements. Mandates judgment creditor's bid may not exceed full amount owing on money award if judgment includes money award or amount declared in judgment when no money award is included. Applies to foreclosure suits commencing or pending on or after effective date. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Exc., 2 --Barton, Lininger)

Requires cost effectiveness as criteria to consider by Oregon Health Authority (OHA) or Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) with respect to alternative plan proposed in resolution. Requires 40 percent of residents to petition local board of health to initiate annexation proceedings to abate health hazard. Permits withdrawal of petition if a specified number of petitioners provide local board of health with alternative plan. Requires, if petition is withdrawn before OHA finds danger to public health exists, all proceedings be terminated. Requires, if petition is withdrawn after a danger to public health exists, alternative plan be evaluated. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Keny-Guyer)

Modifies definition of health benefit plan to include self-insured health plan offered through the Public Employees' Benefit Board or the Oregon Educators Benefit Board. Modifies health professional definition. Requires health benefit plan to provide coverage of a health service using synchronous two-way interactive video conferencing if it is safely and effectively being provided according to the accepted health care practices. Requires the technology being used meets all the state and federal privacy and security laws. Eliminates requirement that plan provide

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coverage if health service does not duplicate or supplant a health service available to patient in person; and deletes the originating sites requirement. Establishes that telemedicine coverage is subject to the reimbursement specified in the contract between the plan and healthcare professional. Applies to plans issued or renewed on or after January 1, 2016. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Keny-Guyer)

Directs the Governor to appoint the licensed pharmacy technicians for terms beginning on January 1, 2016. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Keny-Guyer)

Defines exceptions, including immunity for interactive computer services as they are defined by the Federal Communication Decency Act. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **House Amendment Adds an emergency clause. Defines immunity given to interactive computer services so that it mirrors the immunity given by the Federal Communications Decency Act.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)
