<u>HB 2193 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HEE</u>	Concur	5/28/2015	Holvey
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Defines "energy storage system" as technology capable of retaining energy, storing energy for period of time and delivering energy after storage. Defines "electric company" as company that sells electricity to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers. Specifies that, subject to authorization by Public Utility Commission (PUC), electric companies are directed to procure one or more qualifying energy storage system with capacity to store at least five megawatt hours of electricity on or before January 1, 2020. Restricts total capacity of storage system procured by one company to less than one percent of company's 2014 peak load; authorizes PUC to waive limit under specified circumstances. Permits PUC, in consultation with Oregon Department of Energy, to waive energy storage limit if one or more electric utilities, as defined in ORS 757.600, participates in procuring and sharing benefits and costs of storage system. Allows energy company to recover in rates all cost prudently incurred in procuring one or more energy storage systems. Directs PUC to adopt, no later than January 1, 2017, guidelines for submittal of proposals by energy companies. Directs energy companies to submit to PUC, no later than January 1, 2018, one or more proposals for developing project that includes one or more energy storage systems. Establishes proposal requirements and PUC evaluation criteria. Prohibits PUC from using, or allowing use of, information and analyses submitted with proposal to be used for other purpose and, to protect information, directs PUC to determine procedures under which person may view information and analyses and adopt protective order that includes reasonable restrictions requested by utility. Directs PUC to report to interim legislative committees related to energy by September 15, 2016 and September 15, 2018. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **Senate Amendment Changes definition to electric company to company that sells electricity to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers. Permits PUC, in consultation with Oregon Department of Energy, to waive energy storage limit if one or more electric utilities as defined in ORS 757.600, participates in procuring and sharing benefits and costs of storage system.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 17; nays, 12--Baertschiger Jr, Boquist, Ferrioli, Girod, Hansell, Knopp, Kruse, Olsen, Thatcher, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters; excused, 1--Devlin.)

Provides exemption from public records request of personal information of individuals certified or licensed by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training. Includes current and past licensees or certificate holders. Exempts residential address and telephone number, personal cellular numbers, personal email addresses, driver license numbers, emergency contact information, Social Security numbers, and dates of birth from disclosure. Exempts personal information of civil code enforcement officers from public records requests unless public interest requires disclosure. Requires code enforcement officer make request. Permits civil code enforcement officers to request records kept by Oregon Department of Transportation that contain officers' home address to instead contain address of public agency employing officer. Declares emergency; effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Provides absolute exemption to personal information of individuals certified or licensed by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training maintained by Department. Includes current and past licensees or certificate holders. Exempts residential address and telephone number, personal cellular numbers, personal email addresses, driver license numbers, emergency contact information, Social Security numbers, and dates of birth from disclosure. Declares emergency, effective on passage.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 27; nays, 3--Baertschiger Jr, Boquist, Hass.)

Includes Oregon nonprofit corporations as public employer for purposes of transferring certain public employees. **Senate Amendment Retains right of employers to negotiate sources of funding for employee's salary. Clarifies that "transfer" does not include the transfer of an employee from a nonprofit corporation to a nonprofit corporation.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 19; nays, 11--Baertschiger Jr, Ferrioli, Girod, Hansell, Knopp, Kruse, Olsen, Thatcher, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters.)

Adjusts school food and beverage nutritional standards to comply with federal food and beverage nutritional standards. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. **Senate Amendment Clarify that nutritional standards explicitly apply to students, rather than teachers, administrators, or other school personnel.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; nays, 1--Thatcher.)

Changes name of Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development Account to Office of Community Colleges and Workforce Development Account. Transfers rulemaking authority and designation as recipient of appropriations from Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development to HECC. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. **Senate Amendment Provides for the transfer of specified unexpended balances between the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development and HECC.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 27; nays, 3--Ferrioli, Thatcher, Thomsen.)

Revises the membership of the Oregon Council on Health Care Interpreters to include a health care interpreter. Prohibits the use of the title "Oregon certified health care interpreter" without specific requirements. Clarifies qualifications and certification requirements. Modifies health care data reporting requirements. Changes references to Oregon Health Policy and Research to Oregon Health Authority. Modifies qualifications for Public Health Officer. Removes references to Blue Mountain Recovery Center. Aligns references relating to screening interviews and treatment programs for alcohol and drug diversion programs. **Senate Amendment Resolves statutory conflict. Repeals section regarding health care workforce database with information to be collected from professional licensing boards.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; nays, 1--Thomsen.)

Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Allows Oregon Mortuary and Cemetery Board to require inclusion in its embalmer examination any question and examination prepared by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examination Boards.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Provides discretion to state agency in assigning liquidated and delinquent account to private collection agency when debt is owed by estate and agency has received notice that estate has closed. Declares emergency; effective July 1, 2015. **Senate Amendment Changes entity receiving notice of closed estate from Department of Revenue to state agency.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Requires both public and private electric and gas utilities to report on processes available to mitigate termination of specified residential customers' service for failure to pay during peak usage, by November 1, 2015. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Requires each electrical cooperative, municipal utility, and people's utility district to report to their respective governing body instead of to Oregon Department of Energy.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 24; nays, 6--Baertschiger Jr, Boquist, Girod, Thatcher, Thomsen, Whitsett.)

Requires public universities to give eligible veterans and servicemembers, and their dependents, enrollment priority over other students. Permits community colleges to establish priority enrollment system. Provides minimum requirements for priority enrollment system. Applies to new and continuing students on or after September 15, 2016. **Senate Amendment Extends priority enrollment to include veterans' and servicemembers' dependents.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Directs Secretary of State to conduct audit related to use of statewide standardized tests in public schools developed by multistate consortium. Provides that audit must gather information on fiscal, administrative, and educational impacts. Requires Secretary of State to submit report on audit to interim legislative committees and Superintendent of Public Instruction no later than September 15, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Requires audit gather information on fiscal, administrative, and educational impacts of statewide summative assessments on public schools. Requires audit identify potential problems with other performance measurement systems that could occur with implementation of statewide summative assessments, and make recommendations for improving assessment processes, effects, and outputs. Requires Secretary of State additionally submit report to Superintendent of Public Instruction.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Requires contracting agencies provide as material condition of public contract that contractor remain certified as disadvantaged, minority, women or emerging small business enterprise (MWESB) during entire term of contract if contract was awarded on basis of contractor's certification. Requires contractors include similar provision in subcontracts. Requires contracting agency to verify certification status of contractor or subcontractor during entire term of contract, and provides that contracting agency may terminate contract, require contractor to terminate subcontract, or pursue remedies for breach of contract if contractor or subcontractor does not retain certification. Makes exception for emerging small businesses that no longer qualify because of growth in employees or gross receipts. Provides that Oregon Business Development Department may independently impose civil penalty up to \$5,000 for each violation of certification requirement if contracting agency does not impose civil penalty. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **Senate Amendment Resolves conflicts**

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with **Senate Bill 584**. (Senate Vote: Ayes, 30.)

Requires local governments to approve applications necessary to develop needed housing, if applications are consistent with comprehensive plan and applicable land use regulations. Requires local governments allow amendment of applications not consistent with comprehensive plan or applicable regulations. Requires local government deny applications not able to be made consistent via amendment or conditions. Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC) to order local government, state agency or special district to take action necessary to bring its comprehensive plan, land use regulations, limited land use decisions or other land use decisions into compliance if its approval standards, conditions and procedures are subjective, or discourage needed housing through unreasonable cost or delay. **Senate Amendment Requires local governments to approve applications necessary to develop needed housing, if applications are consistent with comprehensive plan and applicable land use regulations. Requires local governments allow amendment of applications not consistent with comprehensive plan or applicable regulations. Requires local government deny applications not able to be made consistent via amendment or conditions.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Boquist.)

Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to adopt rules regarding time frames within which a pregnant medical assistance recipient, reimbursed under fee-for-service, needs general or specialty dental care. Specifies services to be covered and that the fee-for-service time frames are to be the same as pregnant recipients in coordinated care organizations and dental care organizations. Directs OHA to report to the Legislative Assembly no later than December 1, 2016. Establishes January 1, 2016 as the operative date. **Senate Amendment Clarifies time frame to be prescribed for recipients reimbursed under fee-for-service. Clarifies time frames must be consistent with pregnant population enrolled in coordinated care organizations and dental care organizations. Removes the requirement that a recipient receive dental screening within 30 days.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; nays, 1--Thomsen.)

Requires each school obtaining approval from Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to offer academic degree to obtain bond or letter of credit annually demonstrating school is financially sound and capable of fulfilling commitments to students. Establishes requirements for bond and letter of credit. Specifies calculation formula for amount of bond or letter of credit. Grants student right to bring claim against school, bond or letter of credit if student suffers monetary loss due to school's failure to provide educational services. Establishes process for Commission to place school or program on probation or to revoke approval for school to offer academic degrees. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Adds emergency clause, effective on passage.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Boquist.)

Authorizes designation of enterprise zone, electronic commerce zone, electronic commerce city and reservation enterprise zone by zone sponsor or sponsors. Zone sponsor may be a city, county, port or tribal government. Designation of enterprise zone and boundary change of zone subject to determination by Oregon Business Development Department (OBDD) that certain statutory requirements are met. Requires submission of documentation to OBDD before designation, addition or change, and requires consultation with department. Eliminates numeric limit on number of enterprise zones that may be designated at any time. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die. **House Amendment Removes provision lowering minimum cost requirement for qualified property used in electronic commerce outside zone for electronic commerce.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5; Nay, 2 --Lininger, Whitsett; Exc., 2 --Read, Smith Warner)

Amends Disorderly Conduct statute. Elevates offense classification for those who falsely report hazardous substance, fire, explosion, catastrophe, or other emergency in all public buildings and court facilities to a Class A Misdemeanor for first offense, to a Class C Felony for each subsequent offense. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Sprenger)

Transfers administration and funding structure for Elderly Rental Assistance program from Department of Revenue to Oregon Housing and Community Services. Prescribes operative dates. Takes effect 91st day after sine die. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Clarifies and defines terms associated with statutes outlining tenant and landlord relations. Specifies new permissible fees, including those for pet waste clean-up. Clarifies definition of "rent" in relationship to housing assistance payments. Prohibits tenant from removing, obstructing or tampering with sprinkler head used for fire suppression. Clarifies process for fee assessments and applications by landlord. Grants fee exception for landlord and tenant from certain provisions. Requires landlord to provide emergency exit routes; outlines recourse. Lists circumstances where tenant not responsible for damage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Directs Department of Human Services (DHS) to assist families with a child who qualifies for home and community-based assistance in child's state of residence, who spends at least six weeks each year with parent who resides in Oregon, by sharing lists of community providers, contacting Medicaid in the child's state of residence, and providing documentation. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Modifies expungement statute. Prohibits offenders from seeking expungement for ten years if probationary sentence was revoked for non-compliance. Prohibits expungement of Assault 3 if victim was under 10 years of age at time of offense. Adds Class B felony possession of controlled substance offenses to list of expungable offenses. Allows one non-motor vehicle violation without re-tolling expungement period. Eliminates repetitive and duplicative language. **House**

**Amendment Replaces "traffic violation" with "motor vehicle violation" to be consistent with original statute.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Nay, 1 --Sprenger)

Modifies charge, size, composition, and duties of Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission (Commission). Makes composition discretionary. Removes ex officio members. Permits Commission to appoint nonmembers to subcommittees. Removes requirement and functions of budget advisory committee. Requires Commission make specific recommendations as part of its long-term strategic plan. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Nay, 1 --Parrish)

Requires Water Resources Department (Department) to report to Eighty-first Legislative Assembly, no later than January 31, 2021, on pilot program allowing specified irrigation districts and water control districts to temporarily transfer water use to another location within district. Specifies water transferred under pilot project can only be used for irrigation. If any of specified districts are unable to participate, requires Department to publish notice of planned participation of another district in weekly notice and allow at least 20 days for public comment. Requires Department to annually publish notice of districts intending to use pilot project prior to commencement of irrigation season. Extends duration of pilot program from June 30, 2016 to January 2, 2022. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

Requires proprietary authorization from Department of State Lands (DSL) to construct or operate ocean renewable energy facility in Oregon's territorial sea. Requires Director of DSL (Director) to adopt rules necessary to implement proprietary authorization program for ocean renewable energy facilities, including requirements for construction and operation; maximum period proprietary authorization could be issued; and provisions to coordinate with issuance of removal or fill permit. Authorizes Director to adopt by rule certain fees. Requires permit for removal or fill activities in territorial sea related to ocean renewable energy facility. Requires DSL to coordinate issuance of proprietary authorization decision and removal or fill permit decision for ocean renewable energy facility. Imposes civil penalties for violation of authorization requirements. Requires DSL to convene committee to assist evaluation of whether to establish general permit or general authorization for removal/fill permits for ocean renewable energy facilities used as components of research projects or demonstration projects that produce ocean renewable energy. Exempts ocean renewable energy facilities from regulation as hydroelectric projects under certain conditions. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

Requires moneys to be used for establishing and maintaining an Oregon History Center at the State Capitol or the Oregon State Capitol Park. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

Requires Department of Justice (DOJ) to encourage and support services, programs and curricula to educate and inform students in grades seven to twelve about domestic violence, to provide assistance to victims of domestic violence, and to prevent and reduce incidence of domestic violence. Requires school district boards to adopt policies that incorporate age-appropriate education about domestic violence into training programs for students in grades seven to twelve and school employees. Authorizes Department of Human Services to make grants to and enter into contracts with nonprofit organizations or public agencies for programs and projects designed to prevent, identify, and treat domestic violence. Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to adopt specified rules and provide school districts with posters in both English and Spanish providing toll-free hotline telephone number students may call for information and help. Requires school district boards to adopt policies requiring posting of signs in clearly visible locations on school campuses. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)
