HB 3464 B-Eng.	HHC		5/28/2015	Greenlick
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Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to adopt rules regarding time frames within which a pregnant medical assistance recipient, reimbursed under fee-for-service, needs general or specialty dental care. Specifies services to be covered and that the fee-for-service time frames are to be the same as pregnant recipients in coordinated care organizations and dental care organizations. Directs OHA to report to the Legislative Assembly no later than December 1, 2016. Establishes January 1, 2016 as the operative date. **Senate Amendment Clarifies time frame to be prescribed for recipients reimbursed under fee-for-service. Clarifies time frames must be consistent with pregnant population enrolled in coordinated care organizations and dental care organizations. Removes the requirement that a recipient receive dental screening within 30 days.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; nays, 1--Thomsen.)

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Abolishes unfunded higher education loan, scholarship and grant programs. Combines fund accounts for alternative student loan program, scholarships for foster youth, and Nursing Services Program to allow for consolidated accounting. Separates statutes regarding scholarships for foster youth and scholarships for dependent children of deceased and disabled public safety officers. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Removes specific requirements that current or former foster children must meet in order to be awarded a scholarship by the HECC. The amendment also removes language regarding award amounts and inserts language permitting the HECC to determine the award amounts based on funds that are made available for the award year.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 1 -- Shields; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

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Increases registration and tonnage fees for distribution, labeling and registration of various soil enhancing products. Increases product evaluation fee for soil enhancing products. Revises descriptions of soil enhancing products and updates statutory language consistent with national

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model. (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

Abolishes Fish and Wildlife Deferred Maintenance Subaccount. Transfers unobligated principal remaining in subaccount to State Wildlife Fund. (Committee Vote: Aye, 19; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Thomsen, Whitsett; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

HB 2879 A-Eng. **HRULES** **dpa PE, res** **5/29/2015** **Buehler**

Directs Board of Pharmacy (BOP) to adopt rules allowing licensed pharmacist to prescribe and dispense hormonal contraceptive patches and self-administered oral hormonal contraceptives to person who is at least 18 years of age or person under 18 years of age, if that person has evidence of previous prescription. Directs BOP to work in consultation with Oregon Medical Board, Oregon State Board of Nursing and Oregon Health Authority, with consideration of American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists guidelines, to develop standard procedures for prescribing contraceptives. Specifies that rules need to include: BOP-approved training program; requirement that patient use self-screening risk assessment tool prior to pharmacist prescribing contraceptive; that pharmacist advise and refer patient to patient's primary care practitioner upon prescribing and dispensing contraceptive; provides patient with written record of contraceptive prescribed and dispensed. Rules require pharmacists to ensure that patient has seen provider once every three years after initial prescription and prohibits pharmacist from requiring patient to schedule appointment prior to prescribing and dispensing contraceptive. Defines oral contraceptive patch. Applies all state and federal laws governing insurance coverage of prescription contraceptive drugs, devices and products to contraceptive prescribed by pharmacist. Establishes January 1, 2016 as operative date. Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

HB 3499 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **5/29/2015** **Gallegos**

Establishes advisory group to develop uniform budget coding requirements and reporting requirements. This advisory group on January 2, 2016. The State Board of Education is required to adopt rules related to uniform budget coding requirements no later than January 1, 2016.

House Amendment Repeals a one-time distribution language from the State School Fund for 2015-17 which was included in State School Fund bill (HB 5017) which passed earlier in the session. Current language provides for a similar permanent distribution that would include the funding for the 2015-17 biennium. (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

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Third Reading Of Senate Bills:*(Carried Over from Monday, June 01, 2015)***SB 390 A-Eng. HHS dp 5/21/2015 Piluso, Stark**

Clarifies and defines terms associated with statutes outlining tenant and landlord relations. Specifies new permissible fees, including those for pet waste clean-up. Clarifies definition of "rent" in relationship to housing assistance payments. Prohibits tenant from removing, obstructing or tampering with sprinkler head used for fire suppression. Clarifies process for fee assessments and applications by landlord. Grants fee exception for landlord and tenant from certain provisions. Requires landlord to provide emergency exit routes; outlines recourse. Lists circumstances where tenant not responsible for damage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Directs Department of Human Services (DHS) to assist families with a child who qualifies for home and community-based assistance in child's state of residence, who spends at least six weeks each year with parent who resides in Oregon, by sharing lists of community providers, contacting Medicaid in the child's state of residence, and providing documentation. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Modifies expungement statute. Prohibits offenders from seeking expungement for ten years if probationary sentence was revoked for non-compliance. Prohibits expungement of Assault 3 if victim was under 10 years of age at time of offense. Adds Class B felony possession of controlled substance offenses to list of expungable offenses. Allows one non-motor vehicle violation without re-tolling expungement period. Eliminates repetitive and duplicative language. **House Amendment Replaces "traffic violation" with "motor vehicle violation" to be consistent with original statute.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Nay, 1 --Sprenger)

Modifies charge, size, composition, and duties of Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission (Commission). Makes composition discretionary. Removes ex officio members. Permits Commission to appoint nonmembers to subcommittees. Removes requirement and functions of budget advisory committee. Requires Commission make specific recommendations as part of its long-term strategic plan. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Nay, 1 --Parrish)

Requires Water Resources Department (Department) to report to Eighty-first Legislative Assembly, no later than January 31, 2021, on pilot program allowing specified irrigation districts

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and water control districts to temporarily transfer water use to another location within district. Specifies water transferred under pilot project can only be used for irrigation. If any of specified districts are unable to participate, requires Department to publish notice of planned participation of another district in weekly notice and allow at least 20 days for public comment. Requires Department to annually publish notice of districts intending to use pilot project prior to commencement of irrigation season. Extends duration of pilot program from June 30, 2016 to January 2, 2022. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

SB 319 A-Eng. HEE **dp **5/22/2015** **Boone****

Requires proprietary authorization from Department of State Lands (DSL) to construct or operate ocean renewable energy facility in Oregon's territorial sea. Requires Director of DSL (Director) to adopt rules necessary to implement proprietary authorization program for ocean renewable energy facilities, including requirements for construction and operation; maximum period proprietary authorization could be issued; and provisions to coordinate with issuance of removal or fill permit. Authorizes Director to adopt by rule certain fees. Requires permit for removal or fill activities in territorial sea related to ocean renewable energy facility. Requires DSL to coordinate issuance of proprietary authorization decision and removal or fill permit decision for ocean renewable energy facility. Imposes civil penalties for violation of authorization requirements. Requires DSL to convene committee to assist evaluation of whether to establish general permit or general authorization for removal/fill permits for ocean renewable energy facilities used as components of research projects or demonstration projects that produce ocean renewable energy. Exempts ocean renewable energy facilities from regulation as hydroelectric projects under certain conditions. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

SB 472 A-Eng. HTED **dp **5/22/2015** **Huffman****

Increases, from 40,000 sets to 80,000 sets, the number of Pacific Wonderland vehicle registration plates that may be issued. Deletes provision requiring revenues from Pacific Wonderland plate surcharge allocation to Oregon State Capitol Foundation. Requires moneys to be used for establishing and maintaining an Oregon History Center at the State Capitol or the Oregon State Capitol Park. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

SB 521 HHC **dp **5/22/2015** **Keny-Guyer****

Permits coach to allow member of school athletic team or non-school athletic team to participate in athletic event or training after athletic trainer determines that member has not suffered concussion. Allows athletic trainer to consult with health care professional in making determination. Defines "health care professional." Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

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SB 672 A-Eng. **HHC** **dp** **5/22/2015** **Hayden**

Directs Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to appoint state dental director to oversee programs operated by OHA that increase access to oral health services. Requires dental director to study and make recommendations on improving oral health. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 714 A-Eng. **HTED** **dp** **5/22/2015** **Davis**

Prohibits motor vehicle manufacturers, distributors and importers from taking any adverse action against a motor vehicle dealer because the dealer sold a motor vehicle to a customer that subsequently exported the vehicle or resold it for export. Provides exceptions. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

SB 790 A-Eng. **HED** **dp** **5/22/2015** **Piluso**

Requires Department of Justice (DOJ) to encourage and support services, programs and curricula to educate and inform students in grades seven to twelve about domestic violence, to provide assistance to victims of domestic violence, and to prevent and reduce incidence of domestic violence. Requires school district boards to adopt policies that incorporate age-appropriate education about domestic violence into training programs for students in grades seven to twelve and school employees. Authorizes Department of Human Services to make grants to and enter into contracts with nonprofit organizations or public agencies for programs and projects designed to prevent, identify, and treat domestic violence. Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to adopt specified rules and provide school districts with posters in both English and Spanish providing toll-free hotline telephone number students may call for information and help. Requires school district boards to adopt policies requiring posting of signs in clearly visible locations on school campuses. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Requires each school district board to adopt child sexual abuse prevention instructional program for students in kindergarten to grade 12. Stipulates program elements. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 902 **HHC** **dp** **5/22/2015** **Keny-Guyer**

Reinstates statutes relating to requirements for community health improvement plans adopted by coordinated care organizations (CCOs) and their community advisory council which sunset on the convening of the 2015 Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 2 --Hayden, Weidner)

SB 905 A-Eng. **HHC** **dp** **5/22/2015** **Buehler**

Increases the Oregon Medical Board (OMB) from 12 to 13 members. Adds physician assistant or retired physician assistant to OMB. Requires selection from list of three to five candidates submitted by Oregon Society of Physician Assistants by February 1. Repeals Physician Assistant Committee. Staggers terms for board members by three years, instead of four. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Weidner)

Specifies that a certificate of authority is not required of an insurer with respect to wet marine and transportation insurance. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Adds emergency clause.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

SB 943 **HTED** **dp** **5/22/2015** **Lively**

Prohibits counties and districts from imposing a vehicle registration fee on vehicles registered to an employment address when the registered owner's residence is not in the same county as the employment address. Permits Department of Transportation to provide notice of vehicle registration renewal by means other than postal address upon request of the registered owner. Expands the types of vehicle registration plates that may be transferred to another vehicle. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

Clarifies authority of Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs (ODVA) to act without bond as fiduciary for veterans' benefits and receive payment of social security and supplemental security income benefits on behalf of qualifying veterans and their dependents. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

Makes certain veterans' and service members' personally-identifiable information exempt from disclosure, pursuant to public records request, when obtained and kept by Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs in performance of its functions. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Boone)

SB 263 B-Eng. **HEE** **dpa PE** **5/26/2015** **Reardon**

Makes changes to program elements that may be used by cities and counties to fulfill requirements to implement recycling programs. Authorizes local governments to assess fee on solid waste collection or disposal services to cover costs to local government for providing opportunity to recycle and implementing program requirements. Establishes requirements for education and promotion programs provided by city, county or metropolitan service district responsible for providing opportunity to recycle. Updates waste generation goals for calendar years 2025 and 2050 and subsequent years. Identifies specific voluntary recovery goals for certain counties. Allows Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) to revise goals under certain conditions. Directs EQC to develop and adopt alternative method for calculating recovery rates based on rate of energy savings achieved through recovery of materials. Authorizes EQC to adopt other alternative calculation methods under certain conditions. Reduces required frequency of statewide solid waste composition study to once every three biennia. Requires Department of Environmental Quality to conduct statewide survey of recovery rates for certain materials for calendar year 2020 and 2025 and report to Legislature if goals are not being met. **House Amendment Directs DEQ to include in 2019 report to Legislative Assembly an evaluation of costs of implementing multitenant recycling within urban growth boundary of cities with population of 4,000 or more that have not fully implemented multitenant recycling.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 1 --Weidner; Exc., 1 --Bentz)

Requires public employer of arresting officer to pay for qualified interpreter for person with disability upon arrest. Removes requirement that person with disability make verified statement and provide information in writing under oath, following arrest, as to inability to obtain qualified interpreter. Removes requirement that court make determination on means and ability of person with disability. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Requires petitioner in suit for marital annulment, dissolution or separation to disclose whether protective order exists between the parties in this state, or any other jurisdiction, as well as any other order restraining one party from contact with the other or the parties' minor children. SB 161 **HREV** **dp** **5/27/2015** **Whitsett**
 Allows county tax collector to electronically file warrants for delinquent property taxes on business personal property. Requires Secretary of State (SoS) to mark, hold, and index filed warrants in accordance with provisions of Universal Commercial Code (UCC). Requires tax collector to electronically file release or cancellation of warrants to SoS. Requires SoS to maintain public access to notices and cancellations. Allows SoS to charge fee for accepting electronic notices and allows county tax collector to add SoS fee to amount due on a warrant. Fee amount is not specified. Specifies tax collector must still properly record warrant. Provides that notice of warrant expires 10 years from date of filing, unless extended for additional 10 years with properly filed certificate of extension. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 3 --Johnson, Lininger, Read)

 Increase pilot registration fees from twelve to twenty-four dollars for initial registration and from twenty-four to forty-eight dollars for renewal registration. Raise aircraft registration fees for all classifications. Increase airport registration and renewal fees for all classifications. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Whisnant, Thomsen)

Exempts longstanding associations of current or former members of the Armed Forces, as specified, from operation of insurance code. Requires exempt associations provide certain documentation and records to the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS). Permits DCBS to require increase in capital or surplus. Requires specified notice issue with exempt associations' policies. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

SB 206 A-Eng. **HRCLUW** **dp** **5/28/2015** **McLane**

Defines "determined claim" as water right in Upper Klamath Basin and established by order of determination certified by Water Resources Department (Department) Director. Establishes during period judicial review is pending determined claim is existing water right that may be leased and primary water right subject to temporary transfer. Stipulates lease and temporary transfer authority does not apply to water right that has been determined and established in order of determination that has been stayed and water right transfer that changes point of diversion upstream. Prohibits person from purchasing, leasing or accepting determined claim as gift for conversion to in-stream water right. Requires Department to deny, modify or revoke lease or temporary transfer of determined claim if it has or is likely to result in injury to another determined claim or water right or enlargement of determined claim. Sunsets Act January 2, 2026. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gomberg)

Requires Invasive Species Council (Council) to appoint State Invasive Species Coordinator (Coordinator). Establishes Coordinator as nonvoting, ex-officio member of Council. Clarifies 17 other Council members are authorized voting members. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 216 B-Eng. **HED** **dpa PE** **5/28/2015** **McLain**

Adds Education Service Districts (ESDs) and state tribes to list of entities that shall receive funding

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from Oregon Department of Education (ODE) for specified purposes of Network of Quality Teaching and Learning (NQTL). Modifies purposes for which ODE distributes funding. Requires Oregon Education Investment Board (OEIB) to provide strategic direction to NQTL by convening advisory group to guide activities and expand implementation of effective practices. Modifies non-administrative costs and limits on administrative expenditures. Allows ODE to administer directly School District Collaboration Grant Program or enter into contract with nonprofit entity to administer program. Modifies criteria for awarding grants and potential amount that school districts may receive. Requires application from school district to participate in beginning teacher and administrator mentorship program to include description of priorities to be addressed by moneys received by school district for mentorship program. Requires mentorship program to include at least 75 to 90 hours of frequent contact between mentors and beginning teachers and administrators throughout school year. Allows additional allocation of up to \$50,000 if school has less than 1,500 Weighted Average Daily Membership. Defines acceptable uses of additional allocation. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Allows additional allocation of up to \$50,000 if school has less than 1,500 Weighted Average Daily Membership. Defines acceptable uses of additional allocation.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Modifies provisions to allow students who are not residents of school district to attend school in school district. Modifies criteria district school board may consider when deciding whether to admit non-resident student. Modifies criteria district school board may use to prioritize students if number of students seeking admission exceeds imposed limitations. Allows priority to be given to students who attended public charter school in district for at least three consecutive years, completed highest grade offered by charter, and did not enroll in and attend school in other district following completion of highest grade offered by public charter. Allows district school board to revoke consent for nonresident students for failure to comply with minimum standards for behavior or attendance. Specifies requirements for length of time for which consent is given to nonresident

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students. Prohibits specified advertising. Requires district school board to give consent to student whose legal residence changes to different school district during summer prior to school year, to enable student to complete school year following summer in school district. Allows district school board to request information or give consent to student in event of hardship of student, as determined based on rules adopted by State Board of Education. Requires each individual involved in preparation of food at establishment for distribution to have successfully completed food handler training program. Requires food establishment to maintain and make available to Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) upon request, records of annual sales and types of food produced for at least three years. Authorizes ODA to require food establishment be licensed under statutes addressing sanitary regulations for food and food establishments if establishment refuses to comply with ODA rules that establishment be constructed and maintained in clean, healthful and sanitary conditions.
