<u>HB 2023 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HHC</u>	Concur	6/2/2015	Keny-Guyer
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Directs hospitals to adopt and enforce discharge policies for individuals that have been treated for mental health treatment. Specifies criteria to be included in the policy. Sets July 1, 2016 as operative date. **Senate Amendment Modifies the definition of lay caregiver. Makes clarifications relating to coordinating care and transitioning patients. Requires documenting when scheduling follow-up appointments within 7-days of discharge cannot be met.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 28; excused, 2--Beyer, Olsen.)

<u>HB 2661 A-Eng.</u>	<u>HED</u>	Concur	6/2/2015	Komp
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Provides that school drills and instruction on safety threats include lockdown, lockout, shelter in place, and evacuation procedures. Requires tsunami drills and instruction in schools in tsunami hazard zones. Allows governing body of public body to hold executive session to consider matters relating to school safety. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. **Senate Amendment Specifies that tsunami drills and instruction be undertaken in schools in a tsunami hazard zone, rather than a coastal zone. Specifies that drills and instruction on safety threats include lockdown as well as lockout, shelter in place, and evacuation procedures. Expands drills and instruction to include students up to grade twelve. Revises ORS 192.660 to allow a governing body of a public body to hold an executive session to consider matters relating to school safety or a plan that responds to safety threats made toward a school.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 28; excused, 2--Beyer, Olsen.)

<u>HB 2255 A-Eng.</u>	<u>HRULES</u>	dpa PE, res	6/2/2015	Smith Warner
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Delays implementation of 11 to 1 ratio of nonsupervisory employees to supervisory employees until June 30, 2017. Establishes baseline ratio of nonsupervisory employees to supervisory employees during two-year delay. Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services (DAS) report quarterly on agency ratios. Specifies content of report. Requires DAS notify labor organizations when reports are available. Provides that if agency increases its ratio of nonsupervisory employees to supervisory employees during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, increase can be credited to years after delay ends, provisions sunset June 30, 2019. Requires

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DAS to convene work group to study and report on appropriate ratios of nonsupervisory employees to supervisory employees. Work group is required to report on, or before, start of 2017 legislative session. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **House Amendment Replaces original measure.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

HB 2734 C-Eng. **HREV** **dpa PE** **6/2/2015** **Read**

Authorizes local governments to create land bank authority. Provides land bank authority powers and responsibilities. Details authority and duties of land bank authority and composition of land bank authority board. Clarifies that the authority is to exist as a legal entity separate from the local government that created it. Adds purpose of authority and language related to board of directors. Clarifies that a local government may incur debt, including issuance of bonds, on behalf of an authority it creates and clarifies that all assets owned by the authority, income earned by assets, and bonds issued by the authority and their income are exempt from taxation by State of Oregon. Provides method for dissolution of authority. Requires member of land bank authority board to file statement of economic interest with Oregon Government Ethics Commission. Exempts land bank authority from liability of remedial action costs or for damages of any spill or release of oil or hazardous material at facility acquired by authority under certain conditions. **House Amendment The amendment defines the regular term of the board membership and puts limitations on it. It also deletes the part of the measure that deals with property tax abatement.**

HB 3246 A-Eng. **HREV** **dpa PE** **6/2/2015** **Vega Pederson**

Establishes exemption for qualifying new property or new improvements to property that increase energy efficiency of property or reduce greenhouse gas emissions from property. New or improvements to property must qualify for any form of tax relief or rate-payer incentives in Oregon or improvements to property must improve a property's home energy performance score. For commercial buildings, new or improvements to property must qualify as energy conservation measures. Specifies calculation for amount of exemption. Establishes exemption in most populous city of a county with population of 650,000 or more. To qualify for exemption, requires energy efficient improvements to be constructed or installed on property built before 2008. Specifies exemption not available to centrally assessed property and industrial property appraised by Department of Revenue. Requires application for first year of exemption to be made prior to construction or installation. Requires county to prescribe application forms and deadlines for filing application for exemption. Applies to property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2016. Applications for exemption may not be filed for tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2022. **House Amendment Replaces content of bill.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5; Nay, 4 --Bentz, Davis, Johnson, Whitsett)

 During the interim, the Oregon Board of Nursing established fees related to the awarding of Prescriptive Privileges (PP) for Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA) as authorized by SB 136 (2013). The fees established are \$75 for initial application, \$50 for renewal, and \$50 for the prescription monitoring program. (Committee Vote: Aye, 20; Nay, 1 --Girod; Exc., 3 --McLane, Whisnant, Thomsen)

SB 161 **HREV** **dp** **5/27/2015** **Whitsett**
 Allows county tax collector to electronically file warrants for delinquent property taxes on business personal property. Requires Secretary of State (SoS) to mark, hold, and index filed warrants in accordance with provisions of Universal Commercial Code (UCC). Requires tax collector to electronically file release or cancellation of warrants to SoS. Requires SoS to maintain public access to notices and cancellations. Allows SoS to charge fee for accepting electronic notices and allows county tax collector to add SoS fee to amount due on a warrant. Fee amount is not specified. Specifies tax collector must still properly record warrant. Provides that notice of warrant expires 10 years from date of filing, unless extended for additional 10 years with properly filed certificate of extension. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 3 --Johnson, Lininger, Read)

 Increase pilot registration fees from twelve to twenty-four dollars for initial registration and from twenty-four to forty-eight dollars for renewal registration. Raise aircraft registration fees for all classifications. Increase airport registration and renewal fees for all classifications. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Whisnant, Thomsen)

 Requires Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to study treating uniformed service members as residents for recreational licensing purposes and report to Legislature by September 15, 2016. Sunsets January 2, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

- SB 781 A-Eng.** **HVET** **dp** **5/27/2015** **Parrish**
 Exempts longstanding associations of current or former members of the Armed Forces, as specified, from operation of insurance code. Requires exempt associations provide certain documentation and records to the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS). Permits DCBS to require increase in capital or surplus. Requires specified notice issue with exempt associations' policies. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

- SB 206 A-Eng.** **HRCLUW** **dp** **5/28/2015** **McLane**
 Defines "determined claim" as water right in Upper Klamath Basin and established by order of determination certified by Water Resources Department (Department) Director. Establishes during period judicial review is pending determined claim is existing water right that may be leased and primary water right subject to temporary transfer. Stipulates lease and temporary transfer authority does not apply to water right that has been determined and established in order of determination that has been stayed and water right transfer that changes point of diversion upstream. Prohibits person from purchasing, leasing or accepting determined claim as gift for conversion to in-stream water right. Requires Department to deny, modify or revoke lease or temporary transfer of determined claim if it has or is likely to result in injury to another determined claim or water right or enlargement of determined claim. Sunsets Act January 2, 2026. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gomberg)

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SB 209 **HAGNR** **dp** **5/28/2015** **Gorsek**
 Requires Invasive Species Council (Council) to appoint State Invasive Species Coordinator (Coordinator). Establishes Coordinator as nonvoting, ex-officio member of Council. Clarifies 17 other Council members are authorized voting members. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 216 B-Eng. **HED** **dpa PE** **5/28/2015** **McLain**
 Adds Education Service Districts (ESDs) and state tribes to list of entities that shall receive funding from Oregon Department of Education (ODE) for specified purposes of Network of Quality Teaching and Learning (NQTL). Modifies purposes for which ODE distributes funding. Requires Oregon Education Investment Board (OEIB) to provide strategic direction to NQTL by convening advisory group to guide activities and expand implementation of effective practices. Modifies non-administrative costs and limits on administrative expenditures. Allows ODE to administer directly School District Collaboration Grant Program or enter into contract with nonprofit entity to administer program. Modifies criteria for awarding grants and potential amount that school districts may receive. Requires application from school district to participate in beginning teacher and administrator mentorship program to include description of priorities to be addressed by moneys received by school district for mentorship program. Requires mentorship program to include at least 75 to 90 hours of frequent contact between mentors and beginning teachers and administrators throughout school year. Allows additional allocation of up to \$50,000 if school has less than 1,500 Weighted Average Daily Membership. Defines acceptable uses of additional allocation. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Allows additional allocation of up to \$50,000 if school has less than 1,500 Weighted Average Daily Membership. Defines acceptable uses of additional allocation.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 248 **HAGNR** **dp** **5/28/2015** **Krieger**
 Authorizes State Forester to enter into and administer contracts for activities necessary or convenient for sales of timber from lands owned or managed by the State Board of Forestry or State Forestry Department which include, but are not limited to, timber harvesting and sorting, transporting, gravel pit development or operation, and road construction, maintenance or improvement. Exempts activity contracts from public contracting laws. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 534 **HRCLUW** **dp** **5/28/2015** **Huffman, Gilliam**
 Authorizes city and airport to enter into agreement pursuant to which the city provides sewer and water service to airport without requiring annexation, or consent to eventual annexation, to city of territory where airport is located. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gomberg)

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SB 709 B-Eng. **HED** **dpa PE** **5/28/2015** **Piluso**

Modifies provisions to allow students who are not residents of school district to attend school in school district. Modifies criteria district school board may consider when deciding whether to admit non-resident student. Modifies criteria district school board may use to prioritize students if number of students seeking admission exceeds imposed limitations. Allows priority to be given to students who attended public charter school in district for at least three consecutive years, completed highest grade offered by charter, and did not enroll in and attend school in other district following completion of highest grade offered by public charter. Allows district school board to revoke consent for nonresident students for failure to comply with minimum standards for behavior or attendance. Specifies requirements for length of time for which consent is given to nonresident students. Prohibits specified advertising. Requires district school board to give consent to student whose legal residence changes to different school district during summer prior to school year, to enable student to complete school year following summer in school district. Allows district school board to request information or give consent to student in event of hardship of student, as determined based on rules adopted by State Board of Education. Modifies information district school board may require prior to deciding whether to give consent. Allows district to offer same preferences for outgoing students as are offered for incoming students in case of interdistrict transfer. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Alters language to allow district to offer same preferences for outgoing students as are offered for incoming students in case of interdistrict transfer.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 138 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Evans**

Allows brewery-public house licensee to distribute malt beverage manufactured by licensee to other premises under same ownership and for export. Increases amount of malt beverage that brewery-public house licensee can sell at wholesale and distribute to licensees of Oregon Liquor Control Commission from 5,000 to 7,500 barrels. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 264 A-Eng. **HRCLUW** **dp** **5/29/2015** **McLane**

Authorizes Water Resources Department (Department) to participate in activities related to joint management entity responsible for overseeing implementation of Upper Klamath Basin Comprehensive Agreement consistent with agreement. Permits activities to include, but are not limited to, providing assistance in formation of Oregon tax-exempt nonprofit corporation to function as joint management entity; drafting and giving approval of articles of incorporation and bylaws; participating as voting member; and participating as member of technical team. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gomberg)

SB 272 **HBL** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Barton**

Modifies general powers of Oregon Board of Accountancy and provisions regulating accountants reflecting best practices and the Uniform Accountancy Act. Expands definition of "attestation services." Establishes Oregon Board of Accountancy Fund in State Treasury and continuously

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appropriates moneys in Fund to Board for administration and enforcement of laws regulating accounts. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 320 A-Eng. **HRCLUW** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Gomberg**

Exempts food establishments from statutes addressing sanitary regulations for food and food establishments if: establishment is located in residential dwelling; food prepared is baked or confectionary and does not contain marijuana; food is only sold to end user; food is not sold over internet; food is not potentially hazardous; food meets certain labeling requirements; and annual gross sales do not exceed \$20,000. Requires each individual involved in preparation of food at establishment for distribution to have successfully completed food handler training program. Requires food establishment to maintain and make available to Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) upon request, records of annual sales and types of food produced for at least three years. Authorizes ODA to require food establishment be licensed under statutes addressing sanitary regulations for food and food establishments if establishment refuses to comply with ODA rules that establishment be constructed and maintained in clean, healthful and sanitary conditions. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gomberg)

SB 370 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Doherty**

Allows certain death benefits to former spouse and dependent child as provided in judgement of annulment, divorce, or separation if vested member of Public Employees Retirement System or similar public employee retirement plan dies before retirement. Adds provisions to address divisions between member's spouse and former spouse. Applies to benefits of member who dies on or after effective date. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 2 --Barreto, Weidner; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 491 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Komp**

Directs Department of Administrative Services to establish a pay equity training program. Prohibits public contracting agency from contracting with bidder who employs 50 or more full-time workers on state contract exceeding \$500,000 unless the bidder possesses certificate indicating completion of pay equity training program offered through Department. Prohibits contractor from retaliating against employee who discusses compensation with another employee. Requires public contract include provision that contractor must comply with prohibition against discriminatory compensation and wage payments. Becomes operative on January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Nay, 1 --Weidner; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 515 A-Eng. **HCPGE** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Whisnant**

Directs the Department of Administrative Services to provide a method for users of the Oregon

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Transparency Website to offer suggestions regarding the website's form or content. Requires posting on Oregon Transparency Website of economic development information relating to the Oregon Product Investment Fund, the Beginning and Expanding Farmer Loan Program, the Oregon Innovation Council and Strategic Investment Program, as well as reports on certain tax expenditures. Requires posting of description of the process for requesting public records from public bodies. Authorizes local governments to post notices of public meetings. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

SB 552 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Nosse**

Establishes workplace protections for certain domestic workers, including overtime pay, periods of rest, paid vacation time and freedom from harassment. Directs Bureau of Labor and Industries to adopt rules to implement. Classifies violation as unlawful employment practice. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 2 --Barreto, Weidner; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 582 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Kennemer**

Provides that credit union may pay directors and supervisory committee members of credit union reasonable compensation for directors' or committee members' services. Removes requirement to open a share account as a condition of membership. Allows persons within the field of membership to become member based upon the credit relationship or on payment of a membership fee. Repeals requirement that any credit union that provides membership to employees of State of Oregon include foster parents in its field of membership. Modifies the definition of "immediate family" for membership eligibility to include foster parents and legally-appointed guardians. Removes requirement for credit union to apply and pay fee to Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to open new branches. Requires thirty-day notification instead of application to Department for opening new branches. (Committee Vote: Aye, 9; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 675 B-Eng. **HCPGE** **dpa PE** **5/29/2015** **Holvey**

Eliminates requirement that bidder and proposer for public contract to a state or local contracting agency demonstrate responsibility by submitting signed affidavit that attests that bidder or proposer complied with tax laws of this state. Requires bidder and proposer for public contract with a local contracting agency to attest being current on state taxes. Becomes operative 91 days after effective date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Resolves conflicts with Senate Bill 491. Extends provisions of the measure eliminating requirement for bidders and proposers of public contracts to submit signed affidavit and provisions requiring bidders and proposers to attest to being current on state taxes to public contracts with state agencies.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Nay, 1 --Nearman)

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SB 922 A-Eng. **HCPGE** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Nearman**

Exempts, legal access providers that charge a fee to customers for the purpose of providing the customer with access to legal consultation and other legal services and that pays an administration fee to the attorney, from certain regulations. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7)

Prohibits retail sale of granulated alcohol. Limits wholesaling of granulated alcohol except for scientific, industrial, manufacturing and other purposes identified by Oregon Liquor Control Commission. (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Nay, 1 --Weidner; Exc., 2 --Esquivel, Heard)

SB 953 **HRCLUW** **dp** **5/29/2015** **Whitsett**

Establishes process by which future interests in specified properties in Klamath County may be extinguished. Permits existing future interest-holders to retain future interests by recording notice of intention to preserve future interest within six months of effective date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gomberg)

SB 3 B-Eng. **HJUD** **dpa PE** **6/1/2015** **Williamson**

Creates crime of endangering person protected by Family Abuse Prevention Act (FAPA) restraining order. Provides that if offender recklessly creates substantial risk of serious physical injury to protected person while violating restraining order at any time, or attempts to place protected person in fear of imminent physical injury, violation constitutes Class C felony. **House Amendment Restores language to measure as introduced.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 -Lininger)

SB 9 **HRULES** **dp** **6/1/2015** **Hoyle**

Directs Secretary of State Audits Division to conduct performance audit of state agency public records retention and disclosure practices, including analysis and recommendations on specified criteria. Requires submission of audit report to legislative entities and Governor on or before November 20, 2015. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 1 --Gilliam; Exc., 1 --McLane)

SB 397 B-Eng. **HJUD** **dpa PE** **6/1/2015** **Olson**

Establishes that when defendant participating in driving under the influence of intoxicants (DUI) diversion, provider who installed ignition interlock device (IID) must notify court or court's designee

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and district attorney or city prosecutor of negative report within seven business days. Defines "negative report" and allows Department of Transportation to further define "test violations" by rule. Requires that negative report notification must be in format prescribed by Department of Transportation. Provides that people may not have IID device removed unless they demonstrate 90 days without negative report. Allows person participating in diversion to petition court for removal of IID after six consecutive months without negative report. Allows department to remove ignition interlock device requirement from person's driving record as soon as practicable after receiving certificate memorializing 90 days without negative report. **House Amendment Removes portions regarding court or agency charging defendant additional fee to pay cost incurred by agency or organization in carrying out their duties. Provides that Sections 2-4, 7 and 8 and the amendments to ORS 813.602 by Section 5 apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of the act. Resolves conflicts with House Bill 2660 A without further substantive changes.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 1 --Barton; Exc., 1 --Lininger)

SB 493 A-Eng. **HHEDIW** **dpa PE** **6/1/2015** **Buckley**

Removes ability of Governor to disband university governing board or force university to take other action if university fails to make timely compliance with conditions established when State Board of Higher Education (SBHE) endorsed governing board. Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to report failure of university to meet conditions specified upon conditional endorsement to Governor, Legislative Assembly and governing board. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Requires HECC to report failure of governing board to meet conditions specified upon conditional endorsement to Governor, Legislative Assembly and governing board. Removes requirement for university that fails to comply with conditions to have governing board vote on whether to disband or retain governing board.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 8; Exc., 1 --Gallegos)

SB 825 B-Eng. **HJUD** **dpa PE** **6/1/2015** **Olson**

Grants defendants right to appear and testify in grand jury proceedings when the defendant has been arraigned on a felony allegation and is represented by counsel. Requires defense attorney to notify district attorney to exercise right. Authorizes the defendant to request an extension of time to testify before grand jury by up to five days.
