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Clarifies statutory language regarding statute of limitations when person entitled to bring action is child or has disabling mental condition that bars person from comprehending rights person is otherwise bound to know. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **Senate Amendment Replaces "is insane" with "has a disabling mental condition that bars the person from comprehending rights that the person is otherwise bound to know."** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Girod.)

<u>HB 2764 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HBL</u>	Concur	6/8/2015	Holvey
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Modifies circumstances under which attorney fees may be awarded and amount of attorney fees in workers' compensation claims. Requires interest payment on compensable benefits, attorney fees and costs that are withheld pending an appeal. Allows attorney fees under certain circumstances for representation related to or before the Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services. Requires attorney fees awarded to be equitable in aggregate in relation to fees earned by attorneys for insurers or self-insurers. Directs Board to review attorney fees biennially. **Senate Amendment Removes penalties. Requires attorney fees be proportionate to benefit of injured worker if insurer unreasonably delays or refuses to pay attorney fees or costs and raises attorney fees cap from \$3,000 to \$4,000 in such cases. Expands circumstances in which attorney fee is assessed.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 18; nays, 11--Baertschiger Jr, Boquist, Ferrioli, Hansell, Knopp, Kruse, Olsen, Thatcher, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters; excused, 1--Girod.)

<u>HB 3248 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HCPGE</u>	Concur	6/8/2015	Fagan
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Requires public agency terminating contract with qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities (QRF) to require in new contract for same work that contractor must offer employment to employees of terminated QRF at wages and, for certain employees, with health benefits at least as favorable as under former contract. Permits public agency to procure products and services from source other than qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities under specified circumstances. Allows contracting agency to require QRFs to comply with applicable local ordinances governing labor standards and to disqualify from public contracts QRFs repeatedly violating local labor standard ordinances. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares

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emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Removes applicability of reemployment requirement on service contracts that expire. Clarifies that reemployment by new contractor is to be at wages and, for those with disabilities who work at least 28 hours per week, with health benefits at least as favorable as under the terminated contract.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 22; nays, 7--Baertschiger Jr, Hansell, Johnson, Kruse, Olsen, Thatcher, Whitsett; excused, 1--Girod.)

The measure approves the fees adopted by rule for the licensure of Pharmacy Benefit Managers as required by HB 2023 (Ch. 570, Laws 2013). The fees were adopted by DCBS and became effective on July 21, 2014. **House Amendment Removes the existing provisions of the bill as introduces and provides language enumerating and approving the fees for Pharmacy Benefit Managers set by DCBS in rule.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 2 --McLane, Girod; Exc., 4 --Smith, Burdick, Thomsen, Winters)

Allows Oregon Opportunity Grants to be awarded to highest need students when funds are insufficient to award all eligible students. Guarantees second year award to students who reapply and meet eligibility requirements including progress to degree/certification and maintain a certain grade point. Permits development of program to provide additional incentives for students completing 15 or more credits per term. Requires Office of Student Access and Completion to

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inform post-secondary institutions of qualified students attending institution for purpose of providing academic counseling and guidance. Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to report annually to Legislative Assembly regarding academic success and performance of qualified students. Declares emergency, effective on passage. Proposes to change the name of Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC) to Professional Educator Standards Board. Under the adopted amendment the current TSPC name is continued. Updates terms for teacher education programs and institutions. Streamlines licensure structure for teachers and administrators establishing a three tiered system and reducing the total number of different licenses and endorsements from 80 to 38. Increases maximum amount allowed for fees for issuance of license. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

Extends loan term that may be authorized by Environmental Quality Commission from 20 to 30 years. (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 2 --Whitsett, Whitsett; Exc., 4 --Smith, Shields, Thomsen, Winters)

Expands existing property tax exemption for qualified machinery and equipment used in food processing to include machinery and equipment used to process grains. Modifies definition of "food processor" to include grains and exclude a person engaged in the business of producing any product that contains marijuana or a marijuana extract. Modifies definition of qualified machinery and equipment to include grains. Requires qualified machinery and equipment used to process grains, to have real market value of at least \$100,000 when placed in service in order to qualify for exemption. Allows State Department of Agriculture to fix, assess and collect or cause to be collected fees on food processors in amount necessary to cover costs of certification. Requires State Department of Agriculture to submit a report, on impact of expanding exemption to include grain processing, to interim Legislative revenue committees not later than September 15, 2018. SB 242 **JWM** **dp** **6/4/2015** **Gomberg**

Funding for SB 242 is anticipated in the Governor's Budget for the Oregon Employment Department (OED) in Policy Option Package (POP) 111. The bill authorizes OED to intercept tax refunds of individuals who have overpaid unemployment insurance (UI) benefits due to the misreporting of earnings, and of those who fail to pay UI taxes. The bill would also adjust Oregon's short time compensation/work share program so that an individual cannot be denied work share benefits solely because of a change in the reduction of hours from what was previously specified in the employer's work share agreement. (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

SB 243 **JWM** **dp** **6/4/2015** **Gomberg**

Authorizes the Oregon Employment Department (OED) to request to offset unemployment insurance (UI) benefits otherwise payable to an individual when an overpayment of UI benefits remains outstanding; this includes situations where the claimant is not at fault for causing the overpayment, and allows the offset to come from future benefits paid by another state. The bill also increases the period of time that OED can request payment of UI benefit overpayments, from three years to five years, in situations where the overpayment is caused by the claimant. The bill declares an emergency and is effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

SB 255 **JWM** **dp** **6/4/2015** **Gomberg**

Raises limit on fees for annual registration of animal remedy, veterinary biologic or pharmaceutical from \$75 to \$150. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 1 -Thomsen; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

SB 256 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/4/2015** **Rayfield**

Authorizes Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) to adopt certification standards for persons dealing in nursery stock. Requires ODA to consider certification standards adopted by federal government, another state or national association for nurseries when establishing certification standards. Authorizes ODA to establish expedited permitting process for people affected by wildflower and nursery stock statutes that participate and meet standards of ODA certification program. Increases maximum license fee for growers from \$20,000 to \$40,000 and maximum millage rate from no more than five to 10 mills. Authorizes ODA Director to suspend or revoke shipping permit issued if nursery has stock that does not meet interstate shipment cleanliness standards. Increases maximum amount of annual license fee for growers of Christmas trees from \$75 to \$110 for basic charge, from \$3 to \$4.50 per acre. Increases total license fee for growers of Christmas trees from \$5,000 to \$7,000. (Committee Vote: Aye, 19; Nay, 3 --McLane, Whitsett,

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Thomsen; Exc., 2 --Read, Hansell)

SB 462 A-Eng. **HBL** **dp** **6/5/2015** **Kennemer**

Changes provisions of the secured transactions section of the Uniform Commercial Code. Provides that a record is effective as financing statement if record satisfies requirement for financing statement and sufficiently provides name of debtor. Requires financing statement to show name of individual debtor as indicated on unexpired driver license or identification card for sufficiency of name on financing statement. Provides phase-in period for financing statements perfected under current law. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 11)

SB 523 B-Eng. **HHC** **dpa PE** **6/4/2015** **Kennemer**

Requires insurer to notify provider that the enrollee is in a grace period when enrollee fails to pay premium for the qualified health plan, if the provider requests information regarding coverage, eligibility or benefits. Specifies conditions that requires insurer to reimburse provider for services performed during the grace period when coverage is terminated. Specifies requirements may not be waived by agreement or contract. Directs insurer, upon inquiries from provider, to respond that coverage is provided. Requires that a provider request the information from the insurer not more than seven (7) business days before providing the service and that the insurer provides the information to the provider no later than two (2) business days after the request is made. Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to produce written materials for consumers about paying premiums and distribute to providers upon request. **House Amendment Adds the requirement that a provider request the information from the insurer not more than 7 business days before providing the service and that the insurer provides the information to the provider no later than 2 business days after the request is made.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

SB 578 A-Eng. **HBL** **dpa PE** **6/5/2015** **Barreto**

Permits insurer, under certain conditions, to post insurance policy and endorsements on insurer's website in lieu of mailing or delivering insurance policy and endorsements to insured. **House Amendment Provides exemption from the consent and notice requirements of the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 11)

SB 684 A-Eng. **HHC** **dpa PE** **6/4/2015** **Buehler**

Permits the Oregon Medical Board (OMB) to issue a limited license to practice medicine to physicians who are licensed in another state or country and who hold a full-time professor appointment at a school of medicine in Oregon. Specifies that OMB can only issue eight licenses in a four-year period. Operative date is January 1, 2016. Declares an emergency, effective on

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passage. **House Amendment Specifies additional criteria to be used by OMB in issuing a limited license. Specifies that OMB can only issue eight licenses in a four-year period.**

Permits licensed insurance producers to be the licensees for products distributed through non-licensed travel retailers if specific conditions protecting consumers are met, including registration of the agents, training, and consumer disclosures. Becomes operative July 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Changes operative date to July 1, 2016.**

Allows public charter school to implement weighted lottery for historically underserved students. Defines "historically underserved students." Sunsets authorization for weighted lotteries in 2020-21 school year. Mandates review of and report on the implementation of weighted lotteries prior to sunset. Requires consideration of combination of "two or more" factors in determination of traditionally underserved status. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Sunsets authorization for weighted lotteries in 2020-21 school year. Mandates review of and report on the implementation of weighted lotteries prior to sunset. Requires consideration of combination of "two or more" factors in determination of traditionally underserved status.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

Establishes procedures for electing precinct committeepersons (PCP). Requires one PCP for every 250 electors, rather than for every 500 electors, registered in precinct. Provides that write-in candidate may be eligible for election to PCP position if there is no other candidate. Requires write-in candidate to accept successful write-in candidacy before primary election, rather than after election. Prohibits person appointed to position of PCP from voting at election of county central committee officers at organizational meeting for first 60 days after selection. **House Amendment Prohibits person appointed to position of precinct committeeperson (PCP) from voting at election of county central committee officers at organizational meeting for first 60 days after selection.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5; Nay, 4 --McLane, Gilliam, Kennemer, Wilson)

Requires insurance to provide reimbursement for up to 90-day supply of previously dispensed eligible prescription drugs in certain circumstances, as specified. **House Amendment Clarifies language and includes generic drugs.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5; Nay, 1 --Piluso; Exc., 1 --Parrish)

SB 231 B-Eng. **HHC** **dpa PE** **6/8/2015** **Nosse**

Requires certain carriers, Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to report to the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) proportion of carrier's and board's total medical expenses allocated to primary care. Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and DCBS to submit report to Legislative Assembly on the information provided by the carriers and the boards. Requires OHA to convene primary care payment reform collaborative to advise and assist authority in developing Primary Care Transformation Initiative. Specifies membership. Repeals reporting requirement December 31, 2018. Limits the anti-trust exemption to participants in the primary reform collaboration. Specifies actions that are subject to immunity. Specifies OHA's supervision requirements of the collaborative. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Repeals reporting requirement December 31, 2018. Limits the anti-trust exemption to participants in the primary reform collaboration. Specifies actions that are subject to immunity. Clarifies language regarding housing programs administered by Oregon Housing and Community Services. Directs State Housing Council adopt policy to concentrate distribution of funds according to greatest need of persons with low and very low income. **House Amendment Restores language requiring rulemaking on geographic distribution of funds.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)

 Prohibits law enforcement from duplicating or copying data from portable electronic device without warrant or consent. Defines terms. Authorizes court to order law enforcement to purge certain duplicated data if defendant files motion for return of property. Exempts correctional facilities, state hospital, community corrections, and probation officers from prohibition acting in otherwise lawful manner. **House Amendment Changes "appropriate consent" to "lawful consent." Exempts correctional facilities, state hospital, community corrections, and probation officers from prohibition on forensic imaging to the extent those agencies are engaged in otherwise lawful conduct.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 2 --Barton, Sprenger)
