<u>HB 2375 B-Eng.</u>	<u>HCPGE</u>	Concur	6/25/2015	Fagan
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Requires state contracting agency to use solicitation template and contract form developed by the Attorney General and the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) as basis for all public procurements and contracts. Allows exception for unique procurements if agency receives approval from the Attorney General or DAS. Requires person conducting procurements for state agency to complete training or have professional experience. Requires DAS to establish training and experience requirements. Directs Secretary of State (SOS) and State Treasurer to develop and use own forms and templates and establish training and experience standards for own staff conducting procurements or administering public contracts no later than December 31, 2017. Requires person that conducts procurement or administers public contract for SOS or State Treasurer to meet established standards by December 31, 2018. Requires DAS to develop recommendations for promoting best practices, and to report to Legislative Assembly by November 30, 2015. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. **Senate Amendment Permits state contracting agency, in accordance with Public Contracting Code, to negotiate terms and conditions of contract form and template, but may not vary from terms and conditions without advice of Attorney General or legal counsel approved by Attorney General, if state contracting agency anticipates form or template will result in public contract price that exceeds \$150,000. Requires SOS and State Treasurer establish standards for education and training to conduct procurement or administer a public contract not later than December 31, 2017. Requires person that conducts procurement or administers public contract for SOS or State Treasurer to meet established standards by December 31, 2018.** (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Olsen.)

HB 2402 A-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **6/25/2015** **Rayfield**
 Establishes Task Force on State Department of Fish and Wildlife Funding (Task Force). Requires Task Force to identify and recommend alternative funding sources and opportunities for Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). Requires Task Force to report to Legislative Assembly within 30 days after final meeting or when Senate President or Speaker of the House designate. Sunsets Task Force on December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Replaces the bill. Establishes the membership and duties of the Task Force on Funding for Fish, Wildlife and Related Outdoor Recreation and Education. The Legislative Administration Committee will staff the Task Force. Establishes the Fish, Wildlife and Related Outdoor Recreation and Education Fund.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --McLane, Smith)

HB 2545 **JWM** **dp** **6/25/2015** **Doherty**
 Requires school district to provide lunch free of charge to students who are eligible for reduced price lunches. Directs the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to reimburse school district for actual amount student would have been required to pay. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Smith, Williamson)

HB 2653 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/25/2015** **Gorsek**
 Requires Oregon State University (OSU) Extension Service, in consultation with State Department of Agriculture, to create best practices for beekeeping in residential areas. Provides method of dissemination for best practices. Allows local governments to adopt ordinances relating to beekeeping consistent with best practices. Allows local governments to charge reasonable fees for registering hives in residential areas. Makes findings related to beekeeping in urban and residential areas. (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --McLane, Smith)

HB 3012 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **6/25/2015** **Krieger**
 Establishes Oregon Hatchery Research Center (OHRC) Fund. Requires moneys in OHRC Fund to be used for research projects recommended by OHRC. Requires unexpended and unobligated balance in OHRC Fund as of July 1 of each year to be transferred to Hatchery Construction Fund. Establishes Hatchery Construction Fund, designates uses of fund and sunsets fund January 2, 2026. Establishes surcharge on angling licenses and additional commercial ad valorem catch fee on salmon and steelhead beginning January 1, 2016, and ending December 31, 2026. Directs moneys received to be deposited in Oregon Hatchery Research Center Fund. **House Amendment Removes the surcharge from applying to juvenile angling licenses.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Rayfield, Smith)

HB 3099 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **6/25/2015** **Holvey**
 Provides that State Chief Information Officer (CIO) is the primary advisor to the Governor on information technology (IT) and telecommunications. Provides that State CIO duties are specified by the Governor. Transfers authority for IT and telecommunications policy, including planning, rulemaking, standard setting, and oversight from Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to State CIO. Retains DAS authority and responsibility for statewide IT and telecommunications operations and services but requires those operations and services to be provided in a manner consistent with the rules, policies and standards adopted by the State CIO. Retains DAS authority for IT procurement. Provides authority for State CIO to review IT solicitation documents and all IT procurements over \$1 million, and to direct state agencies to include State CIO as contracting party on behalf of state. Provides authority for State CIO to approve, modify or stop IT projects and approve, suspend or cancel IT contracts over \$1 million. **House Amendment Makes further changes to existing statutes to transfer the duties, functions and powers of DAS and the DAS Director for statewide IT and telecommunications operations and service delivery to the State CIO. Modifies proposed changes to ORS 184.477 to give the State CIO flexibility in enforcing terms and conditions of IT contracts. Deletes specific proposed changes to ORS 279A.050 and ORS 291.047 to revert back to existing statutory language. Deletes specific proposed changes to ORS 279A.050 and modifies definitions proposed in ORS 291.039 to maintain existing Secretary of State (SOS) and Oregon State Treasury (OST) independent authorities and exemptions. Modifies ORS 291.038 to require SOS and OST to work with the State CIO to develop and adopt IT related plans, policies and standards for their offices that are, to the extent possible, compatible with plans, rules, policies and standards adopted by the State CIO for all other state agencies within the executive branch. Requires SOS and OST to submit specified documents and reports to the Legislative Fiscal Office. Deletes specific proposed changes to chapter 782, Oregon Laws 2009 to maintain current placement of the Oregon Broadband Advisory Council within the Oregon Business Development Department.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Rayfield, Smith)
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HB 3166 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **6/25/2015** **Sprengr**

Requires Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC) to administer pilot program for purpose of identifying non-core courses and alternative authorization requirements. Details requirements of pilot program. Requires TSPC to submit to Legislative Assembly preliminary report on pilot program no later than September 15, 2018, and final report no later than September 15, 2020. Sunsets measure December 31, 2020. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

House Amendment Removes authorization for funds from the Network of Quality Teaching and Learning. (Committee Vote: Aye, 19; Nay, 2 --Whitsett, Whitsett; Exc., 3 --McLane, Rayfield, Smith)

HB 3459 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **6/25/2015** **Hack**

Allows State Fish and Wildlife Commission to issue order allowing angling of fish or taking of shellfish without licenses or tags for two days up to four times per year. Establishes Oregon Fishing Experience Enhancement Subaccount in Fish and Wildlife Account. Directs use of funds in Subaccount. Establishes nine member Oregon Outdoor Activities Investment Planning Task Force. Directs Task Force to develop plan for increasing angling activities for Oregon residents under 17 and establish a 50-year strategic plan for increasing availability of high-quality outdoor recreational activities. Requires Task Force to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources no later than September 15, 2016. Disbands Task Force on December 31, 2016. **House Amendment Removes all sections of the bill except the section increasing the number of free fishing days the State Fish and Wildlife Commission can allow to 8 days.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Rayfield, Smith)

HB 3525 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/25/2015** **Komp**

Creates 12-member Task Force on Immigration Consultant Fraud. Requires study on violations of prohibition on acting as an immigration consultant without bar license and practice of immigration consultants attempting to obstruct persons from reporting violations. Requires Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office to provide staff. Requires report to the Legislature no later than September 15, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Rayfield, Smith)

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
