HB 3414 B-Eng.	HTED	dpa PE	4/17/2015	Hoyle
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Creates offense of failure to keep a vehicle in the right lane on roads with posted speed greater than 45 miles per hour. Specifies offense does not occur when traffic is moving slower than the normal flow of traffic. Designates offense as Class B traffic violation punishable by maximum fine of \$1,000. Exempts drivers of vehicles governed by ORS 811.325. Outlines conditions under which driving in the far left lane is allowable. **House Amendment Limits applicability to roads with posted speeds greater than 45 miles per hour. Specifies measure does not apply when traffic is moving slower than the normal flow of traffic.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 -- Gorsek)

HB 3125 B-Eng.	HREV	Not Concur	6/30/2015	Barnhart
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Expands existing property tax exemption for qualified machinery and equipment used in food processing to include machinery and equipment used to process grains, bakery products, dairy products and eggs. Exemption for grains, bakery products, dairy products and eggs effective for property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2016. Modifies definition of "food processor" to include grains, bakery products, dairy products and eggs. Applicable beginning with tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2015, excludes a person engaged in the business of producing any product that contains marijuana or a marijuana extract. Modifies definition of qualified machinery and equipment to include grains, bakery products, dairy products and eggs. Requires qualified machinery and equipment used to process grains and bakery products to have real market value of at least \$100,000 when placed in service in order to qualify for exemption. Applicable beginning with tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2015, allows State Department of Agriculture to fix, assess and collect or cause to be collected fees on food processors in amount necessary to cover costs of certification. Requires State Department of Agriculture to submit a report, on impact of expanding exemption to include grain processing, to interim Legislative revenue committees not later than September 15, 2018. Applies to property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2015. **Senate Amendment Includes bakery products, dairy products and eggs to list of food processors qualifying for existing food processing machinery and equipment five year property tax exemption. Exemption for grains, bakery products, dairy products and eggs effective for property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2016. Defines terms. Requires qualifying bakeries to have been issued a wholesale license by State Department of Agriculture. Prohibits exemption from applying to machinery and equipment used to process bakery products if proceeds from retail sales made at the processing site**

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constitute more than ten percent of all proceeds from sales made at processing site. Requires qualifying machinery and equipment used to process bakery products to have real market value of at least \$100,000 when placed in service. (Senate Vote: Ayes, 28; excused, 2--Olsen, Shields.)

HB 3549 B-Eng. JWM dpa PE 6/30/2015 Witt

Agency: Department of Agriculture House Bill 3549 requires the Oregon Department of Agriculture to establish qualifications for obtaining and maintaining an aerial pesticide applicator certificate, increases certain civil penalties, requires the Pesticide Analytical Response Center to develop standards for response to pesticide related complaints, and requires a biennial report to the Legislative Assembly. Additionally, the bill requires ODA to operate a telephone line to receive and coordinate responses to pesticide related complaints by the public and report to the Legislative Assembly biennially. Beginning January 1, 2016, a 60-foot unsprayed strip along inhabited dwellings or schools for aerial herbicide applicators is established and is to be included as part of the Forest Practices Act. HB 2015 A-Eng. JWM dp 7/1/2015 Kotek

Requires Department of Human Services (DHS) adopt rules for employment-related day care subsidies that allow parents to attend school; permit one year certifications regardless of changes in employment status; and extend benefits to self-employed parents. Reduces payment and co-

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pay system for child care facilities that meet tiered quality standards. Directs DHS to structure co-pays to mitigate financial impact upon program exit. Directs Early Learning Council (ELC) to develop voluntary statewide early learning system and defines requirements. Establishes process for defining "affordable, quality child care." Directs Early Learning Division (ELD) to develop and implement quality improvement system for exempt family providers no later than July 1, 2016. Directs ELC to provide training and technical assistance. Requires ELC plans be integrated with existing early childhood services, intervention plans, and federal and state law. Directs ELD conduct study and report to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Thomsen, Whitsett)

HB 2171 A-Eng. **JTAX** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Barnhart**

Requires the Legislative Revenue Office to conduct a study on restructuring Oregon's state and local revenue system. **House Amendment Replaces bill.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 14)

HB 2178 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Hoyle**

Requires campaign finance statement to be filed in ORESTAR within two business days after single contribution or expenditure of \$2,500 or more is made, if it occurs during 14-day period immediately preceding election. Establishes 15-member Task Force on Campaign Finance Reform. Specifies membership, charge and reporting requirement. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Removes all sections of the bill except those pertaining to the Task Force on Campaign Finance Reform. Modifies membership of the Task Force.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 15; Nay, 9 --McLane, Smith, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters)

HB 2392 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Olson**

Requires replacement electronic benefits transfer card (EBT card) to display names of individual to whom card was issued. Requires use of card for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits and Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. Removes current direct deposit option. Excludes certain SNAP benefits to senior citizens and Social Security Income checks. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

HB 2393 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Olson**

Requires Oregon State Lottery Commission to hold payment of lottery prizes in excess of \$600 to recipients who have received overpayment of supplemental nutritional assistance, public assistance, or medical assistance and for which a warrant has been issued. Specifies 30-day hold on payments. Requires notification of hold to person and agency. Requires disbursement of prize if agency does not initiate garnishment proceeding within 30-days' time or upon notification from agency that garnishment action will not be initiated. Requires development of data match system.

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Prioritizes recovery of past-due child support amounts over recovery of overpayments of support. Applies to warrants issued after effective date of Act. **House Amendment Amendment clarifies that recovery of these overpayments through Lottery prize payments is available for those overpayments for which a final order of overpayment has been issued by the Department of Human Services or Oregon Health Authority under the authority provided by ORS Chapter 183, and not just those for which a warrant has been issued under ORS 411.703.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

HB 2455 A-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Rayfield**

HB 2455 levies a privilege tax on the harvesting of merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands. The bill sets the effective rates for a two calendar year period and those rates are applied to the harvested products by the thousand board feet, with the first 25,000 board feet harvested annually by any taxpayer excluded. There are four individual rates contained in the measure providing funding for the following purposes: **House Amendment The amendment includes the change in the applicable tax year from 2014 and 2015 to 2016 and 2017 where required and replaces the blank in the following lines with the following amounts.**

Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to disseminate to each school district information relating to elevated radon levels. Specifies types of information to be included. Directs each school district to develop a plan for schools where the radon levels are elevated. Specifies criteria for the plans. Directs school district to submit the plan to OHA on or before September 1, 2016. Exempts any school that has been tested for radon on or after January 1, 2006. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Removes appropriation.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 19; Nay, 4 --Whitsett, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

HB 2984 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Parrish**

Agency: Department of Forestry House Bill 2984 requires Clackamas County to establish the Clackamas Forestry Product Cooperative Project as a pilot program for forestry products grown on non-forest land. The bill allows for cities within the county to participate in the project and creates a regulatory system intended to grant immunity, from federal and state antitrust laws, to parties of the project. The intent of the bill is to displace competition through a regulatory system for the commercial production and marketing of forestry products on non-forest land under this program. The agency is also directed to post the report on their website. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

 Agency: Department of Transportation House Bill 3402 increases the speed limit for passenger vehicles and certain other vehicles on segments of Interstate 84, Highway 95, Highway 20, Highway 197, Highway 198, Highway 31, Highway 78, Highway 395, Route 205 and Highway 26. The measure exempts portions of Highway 95, Highway 20 and Highway 197 that fall inside of city limits. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 3 --Rayfield, Devlin, Monroe)

SB 128 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/29/2015** **Krieger**
 Agency: Department of State Police Senate Bill 128 defines "comparable" for the purpose of establishing base pay for OSP telecommunicators as the base pay for telecommunicators employed by the five Oregon public safety answering points with the most employees. The bill's provisions apply to arbitration hearings commenced on or after the bill's effective date. (Committee Vote: Aye, 20; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Thomsen, Whitsett; Exc., 1 --Girod)

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SB 266 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/29/2015** **Gomberg**

The measure defines place-based integrated water resources for purposes of the Act and provides the statutory authority for the Water Resources Department to issue grants to facilitate preparation of place-based integrated water resources strategies consistent with state laws, water resource policy and WRD requirements. The measure authorizes the department to enter into contracts or agreements, provide technical assistance and information for development of strategies and requires those strategies be developed in collaboration with balanced representation of interests; balance current and future in and out of stream needs; include development of actions consistent with existing laws and policies; facilitate implementation of local solutions; be developed in open process; and be developed in consultation with Department. The bill also authorizes the Water Resources Commission to adopt rules. Sunsets Act July 1, 2019. (Committee Vote: Aye, 17; Nay, 6 --McLane, Whitsett, Girod, Johnson, Thomsen, Whitsett; Exc., 1 --Smith)

SB 307 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/29/2015** **Boone**

Requires continuing care retirement communities to establish a procedure for residents to request gender of individual assigned to assist with activities of daily living. Requires facility honor request except in case of significant difficulty or cost. Requires written explanation and documentation of rationale for denial. Requires DHS establish complaint procedure for failures to comply. Requires DHS investigate each complaint and provide written report to resident and facility within seven days of completion. Adds residents of continuing care retirement communities to the client portfolio of the Long Term Care Ombudsman. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Winters)

SB 608 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/29/2015** **Keny-Guyer**

Defines "palliative care" as patient- and family-centered medical care that optimizes quality of life by anticipating, preventing and treating suffering caused by serious illness; addressing physical, social and spiritual needs; and facilitating autonomy, access, information and choices. Establishes nine-member Palliative Care and Quality of Life Interdisciplinary Advisory Council (Council) in Oregon Health Authority (OHA). Requires Council to advise on establishment, maintenance, operation and evaluation of palliative care initiatives. Specifies Council as individuals with collective expertise in interdisciplinary palliative care, expertise in nursing, social work and pharmacy, clergy or individuals with spiritual expertise, with at least two board-certified physicians or nurses having expertise in palliative care. Requires OHA to post information on website. Permits website information to include continuing education for health care providers, palliative care delivery in home and facilities, best practices for cultural competency, consumer education and referral information for culturally competent care. Requires health facilities to establish system for identifying patients or residents that could benefit from palliative care, provide information and facilitate access to palliative care. 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SB 698 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **6/29/2015** **Nathanson**

Agency: Oregon Health Authority Senate Bill 698 creates the position of State School Nursing Consultant in the Oregon Health Authority to coordinate and collaborate with the Oregon Department of Education's school nurse specialist in providing leadership and integration in the delivery of nursing services in schools. The bill also establishes the 14-member Task Force on School Nursing charged with examining and recommending sustainable funding sources for school health services. The task force is required to submit a report to an interim Legislative committee by September 15, 2016. The task force sunsets on December 31, 2016. The bill requires the Governor to consider diversity in relation to race, ethnicity, languages, and disability status in appointing members to the task force. SB 567 B-Eng. **HREV** **dpa PE** **6/30/2015** **Read**

Directs Department of Revenue to retain un-receipted income tax revenue from capital gains income. Defines method of calculating excess capital gains revenue as the deference between the average revenue over the most recent two tax years compared to average revenue in the three previous years. If the most recent revenue exceeds the previous period, the excess is deposited in the Education Stability Fund. Deposit occurs prior to June 30 of odd numbered years. No deposits can be made prior to June of 2019. **House Amendment Sets base period for calculation at three years instead of two. Clarifies that estimate is based on tax liability, not collections. States that no deposit is be made under the bill prior to June of 2019.**

SB 80 B-Eng. **HREV** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Barnhart**

Abolishes Oregon University System, office of the Chancellor of the Oregon University System and State Board of Higher Education. States that all public universities have institutional governing boards. Abolishes Oregon University System Fund and subaccounts, Higher Education Donation Fund, Higher Education Academic Modernization Account and Oregon University System Capital

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Construction, Deferred Maintenance and Capital Repair Project Fund. Transfers moneys remaining in accounts or funds to Public University Fund. Limits use of transferred moneys to purposes listed in original funds or accounts. Adds the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to the list of entities authorized to take action with respect to the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, and specifies that the Higher Education Coordinating Commission replaces the references to the State Board of Higher Education. Resolves conflicts. **House Amendment**
The amendment resolves conflicts with SB 215, SB 224, SB 342, SB 493, SB 777, HB 2408, HB 2411, HB 2412, HB 3069, HB 3303, and HB 3524. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Nay, 1 --Whitsett; Exc., 1 --Read)

SB 113 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Smith Warner**

Agency: Higher Education Coordinating Commission Senate Bill 113 requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to convene two stakeholder work groups to 1) determine the most appropriate method for public institutions of higher education to report employment data, and 2) identify how each public university and community college calculates part-time faculty member hours to determine if a part-time faculty member is eligible for health care benefits. (Committee Vote: Aye, 14; Nay, 9 --McLane, Huffman, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters; Exc., 1 --Smith)

SB 213 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Smith Warner**

Codifies Early Learning Council's responsibility to develop funding for Early Learning Hubs as specified. Requires the Early Learning Council to develop metrics for the Hubs. Provides the Council authority to provide similar services and responsibilities as a Hub if there is no locally developed Hub. Requires annual reports by September 15th. Requires specified evaluation and report with recommendations to Legislature by February 1, 2019. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 17; Nay, 6 --McLane, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Johnson, Whitsett; Exc., 1 --Rayfield)

SB 416 **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Taylor**

Requires smoke shops to pay fee adopted by Oregon Health Authority (OHA) by rule. Requires fees for application for certification, renewal every five years, transfer of certification or application for relocation. Specifies fees must be reasonably calculated. Creates effective date of January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 14; Nay, 9 --McLane, Huffman, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters; Exc., 2 --Rayfield, Johnson)

SB 439 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Sprenger**

Establishes an Outdoor Education Account in the State Treasury for the purpose of funding a six-

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day, residential, hands-on outdoor school program or equivalent for fifth and sixth grade students across the state. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Rayfield)

SB 460 A-Eng. **JM91** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Lininger, Olson**

Allows medical marijuana dispensaries to sell up to one quarter ounce of dried leaves and flowers and four immature marijuana plants to persons at least 21 years of age starting October 1, 2015. Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to create rules implementing measure. Allows local governments to pass ordinances prohibiting sales. Sunsets December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Replaces measure.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 10)

SB 519 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Komp**

Requires all community college districts use same system for reporting finances. Requires Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development to select system, which may be existing system, and provide guidelines for implementation. Specifies what system shall include. Requires department to place data from system on website and ensure timely public access. Takes effect July 1, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Nay, 1 --Thomsen; Exc., 2 --McLane, Johnson)

SB 586 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Huffman**

Agency: Department of Education Senate Bill 586 increases the maximum age of youth from 20 to 24 years for whom the Youth Development Council may oversee services. The change will likely result in additional community-based programs applying for grant funds in the future. ODE houses the Youth Development Division which supports the Youth Development Council. Using a community engagement process in the 2015-17 biennium, ODE plans to assess the need for grants, develop a funding allocation formula, and produce a grant funding request for the 2017-2019 biennium. To accomplish this work, one permanent full-time Operations and Policy Analyst 3 position (0.75 FTE) is added to ODE. The position will start in October 2015 and cost \$154,229 General Fund. This position will have expertise with the 21-24 year-old population with experience in workforce issues for the population. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Smith)

SB 695 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Hayden**

Repeals sunset on authority of Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to contract with prepaid managed care health services organizations to provide care to medical assistance recipients. Defines prepaid managed care health services organization as managed dental care, mental health or chemical dependency organization that contracts with OHA or coordinated care organization on prepaid, capitated basis. Directs OHA to study effectiveness of dental care organizations in providing dental care and integration of dental care organizations into coordinated care

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organizations. Allows contract with private entity to conduct study. Requires OHA to report effects to interim committee of Legislative Assembly and appropriates \$150,000 for biennium. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 24)

SB 777 D-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Komp, Hayden**

Agency: Oregon State Treasury The Subcommittee approved a \$664,743 General Fund appropriation to the Oregon State Treasury (OST) and the establishment of one permanent, full-time Operations and Policy Analyst 4 (0.50 FTE) and one permanent full-time Program Analyst 1 (0.25 FTE) for the ABLE program. The measure is effective on the 91st day after adjournment. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --Rayfield, Burdick, Thomsen)

SB 800 **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Heard**

Establishes task force on reserve funds. Directs task force to review existing reserve funds in terms of performance and adequacy. Specifies task force membership, consisting exclusively of legislators. Directs Legislative Fiscal Officer and Legislative Revenue Officer to provide support for the task force. Directs task force to issue report to the Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 24)

SB 860 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Huffman**

Agency: Higher Education Coordinating Commission Senate Bill 860 requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to solicit applications from public universities to participate in a career advising and mentorship pilot program. The bill specifies criteria for selecting two universities to participate in the pilot program, including the requirement that one selected university have less than 10,000 enrolled undergraduate students, and that the other have 10,000 or more undergraduate students. HECC and the selected universities are required to present a final program framework and implementation plan during the 2016 Legislative Session and to submit progress reports on results of the program during the 2017 session.
