Defines terms, and institute methods by which attending physicians may refer a patient who has a terminal disease to a health care practitioner who is authorized to treat patients with investigational products not yet approved by the USDA. Establishes the parameters for health care practitioners and patients eligible for treatment with investigational products, including defining the provisions for qualifying for treatment and paying for treatment. Requires the physician who makes a referral, health care practitioner that administers treatment, and consulting physician to file record with the Oregon Health Authority. Records filed by the health care practitioner that administers treatment must at least provide details that include adverse effects, positive outcomes, cost of treatment, and demographics. Requires OHA to: (1) Adopt rules for the collection of information from physicians who makes a referral, health care practitioners that administers treatment, and consulting physicians; (2) Review, annually, a sample of records of patients who have a terminal disease and receive treatment with an investigational product; (3) Create an annual statistical report that is available to the public; and (4) Provide the annual to report to the Legislative Assembly on or before February 1 of every odd-numbered year. The bill as amended is effective January 1, 2016, and sunsets on January 2, 2022. (Senate Vote: Ayes, 29; excused, 1--Olsen.)

SB 228 **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Keny-Guyer**

Specifies that entity doing business as tanning facility must register each tanning device that is accessible by an individual who is afforded its use as a condition, benefit, or as part of membership in exchange for fee or other compensation. Increases annual registration fee not to exceed \$150 per tanning device. Increases biennial registration fees for institution X-ray machines: \$285 for hospital, \$145 for hospital when inspection of X-ray machine is performed by accredited inspector, \$190 for industrial or podiatry, \$140 for dental, academic, or veterinary, and \$140 for microwave oven repair facility. Creates increase in annual license fees not to exceed \$5,000 for specific license: by-product materials, source materials, or special nuclear materials and their devices. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 15; Nay, 6 --Huffman, Whisnant, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett; Exc., 3 --McLane, Read, Whitsett)

SB 416 **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Taylor**

Requires smoke shops to pay fee adopted by Oregon Health Authority (OHA) by rule. Requires fees for application for certification, renewal every five years, transfer of certification or application for relocation. Specifies fees must be reasonably calculated. Creates effective date of January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 14; Nay, 9 --McLane, Huffman, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters; Exc., 2 --Rayfield, Johnson)

Establishes an Outdoor Education Account in the State Treasury for the purpose of funding a six-day, residential, hands-on outdoor school program or equivalent for fifth and sixth grade students across the state. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Rayfield)

SB 460 A-Eng. **JM91** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Lininger, Olson**

Allows medical marijuana dispensaries to sell up to one quarter ounce of dried leaves and flowers and four immature marijuana plants to persons at least 21 years of age starting October 1, 2015. Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to create rules implementing measure. Allows local governments to pass ordinances prohibiting sales. Sunsets December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Replaces measure.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 10)

SB 519 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Komp**

Requires all community college districts use same system for reporting finances. Requires Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development to select system, which may be existing system, and provide guidelines for implementation. Specifies what system shall include.

SB 586 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Huffman**

Agency: Department of Education Senate Bill 586 increases the maximum age of youth from 20 to 24 years for whom the Youth Development Council may oversee services. The change will likely result in additional community-based programs applying for grant funds in the future. ODE houses the Youth Development Division which supports the Youth Development Council. Using a community engagement process in the 2015-17 biennium, ODE plans to assess the need for grants, develop a funding allocation formula, and produce a grant funding request for the 2017-2019 biennium. To accomplish this work, one permanent full-time Operations and Policy Analyst 3 position (0.75 FTE) is added to ODE. The position will start in October 2015 and cost \$154,229 General Fund. This position will have expertise with the 21-24 year-old population with experience in workforce issues for the population. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Smith)

SB 695 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Hayden**

Repeals sunset on authority of Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to contract with prepaid managed care health services organizations to provide care to medical assistance recipients. Defines prepaid managed care health services organization as managed dental care, mental health or chemical dependency organization that contracts with OHA or coordinated care organization on prepaid, capitated basis. Directs OHA to study effectiveness of dental care organizations in providing dental care and integration of dental care organizations into coordinated care organizations. Allows contract with private entity to conduct study. Requires OHA to report effects to interim committee of Legislative Assembly and appropriates \$150,000 for biennium. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 24)

SB 777 D-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Komp, Hayden**

Agency: Oregon State Treasury The Subcommittee approved a \$664,743 General Fund appropriation to the Oregon State Treasury (OST) and the establishment of one permanent, full-time Operations and Policy Analyst 4 (0.50 FTE) and one permanent full-time Program Analyst 1 (0.25 FTE) for the ABLE program. The measure is effective on the 91st day after adjournment. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --Rayfield, Burdick, Thomsen)

Establishes task force on reserve funds. Directs task force to review existing reserve funds in terms of performance and adequacy. Specifies task force membership, consisting exclusively of legislators. Directs Legislative Fiscal Officer and Legislative Revenue Officer to provide support for the task force. Directs task force to issue report to the Legislative Assembly no later than

SB 860 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Huffman**

Agency: Higher Education Coordinating Commission Senate Bill 860 requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to solicit applications from public universities to participate in a career advising and mentorship pilot program. The bill specifies criteria for selecting two universities to participate in the pilot program, including the requirement that one selected university have less than 10,000 enrolled undergraduate students, and that the other have 10,000 or more undergraduate students. HECC and the selected universities are required to present a final program framework and implementation plan during the 2016 Legislative Session and to submit progress reports on results of the program during the 2017 session. (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Girod, Thomsen; Exc., 3 --McLane, Smith, Burdick)

SB 895 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/1/2015** **Keny-Guyer**

Requires each school and children's facility report annually to Oregon Health Authority (OHA) on number of children in area served by school or facility who are in attendance conditionally because of incomplete immunization schedule. Requires each local health department make available to each school and children's facility in area served data on immunization rate, by disease, of children in area. Allows OHA to assist local health departments in compiling data for specified data. Requires each school and children's facility make available immunization data by disease at main office, online where possible, and through specified paper document or electronic communication. Specifies timeline for providing immunization data. Requires Superintendent of Public Instruction include in school district and school performance report information related to number of children served in district and number of children susceptible to restrictable disease. Repeals section 4, chapter 516, Oregon Laws 2013. Declare emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 15; Nay, 6 --Huffman, Whisnant, Girod, Hansell, Whitsett, Winters; Exc., 3 --McLane, Read, Whitsett)

SB 932 C-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Gallegos**

Agency: Higher Education Coordinating Commission Senate Bill 932 extends eligibility for receiving state financial aid, scholarships, and grants to specified students who qualify for the existing statutory exemption from paying nonresident tuition. Oregon Revised Statutes 351.641 exempts a student who is not a citizen or lawful permanent resident from paying nonresident tuition at state universities if the student: (Committee Vote: Aye, 14; Nay, 8 --McLane, Huffman, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Whitsett, Winters; Exc., 2 --Rayfield, Thomsen)

SB 61 B-Eng. **HREV** **dpa PE** **7/1/2015** **Barnhart**

Modifies list of jurisdictions of incorporation for which income must be included on Oregon corporate excise tax return, if corporation is member of unitary group with Oregon corporation. Directs Department of Revenue to adjust income received in a listed jurisdiction when it does not accurately reflect business activity in Oregon as specified in ORS 314.667. Specifies criteria used to determine listed jurisdictions. Requires Legislative Revenue Office to report to the 2017 Legislature on the cost effectiveness of requiring corporations with subsidiaries in listed jurisdictions to report income in those jurisdictions. **House Amendment Amendment directs Department of Revenue to apply ORS 314.667 in those cases where income reported in listed jurisdiction does not accurately reflect business activity in Oregon.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 9)
