<u>SB 416</u>	<u>JWM</u>	dp	7/1/2015	Hoyle
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Requires smoke shops to pay fee adopted by Oregon Health Authority (OHA) by rule. Requires fees for application for certification, renewal every five years, transfer of certification or application for relocation. Specifies fees must be reasonably calculated. Creates effective date of January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 14; Nay, 9 --McLane, Huffman, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters; Exc., 2 --Rayfield, Johnson)

<u>SCR 20</u>	<u>HRULES</u>	A	7/3/2015	Hoyle
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Establishes limitations and deadlines for legislative measures for 2016 session of Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly. Limits Senate and House members to no more than two measure drafts. Limits Senate and House committees to no more than three drafts. Limits Governor and Chief Justice to no more than five measure drafts. Exempts Joint Committee on Ways and Means, Senate President, and House Committee on Rules from limitations. Requires all draft requests be submitted to Legislative Counsel on or before November 24, 2015 and all drafts to be filed at Senate or House desk no later than 5 p.m. on January 11, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 7; Exc., 2 --McLane, Rayfield)

Third Reading Of Senate Bills:

SB 774 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/3/2015** **Keny-Guyer**

Agency: Department of Human Services Senate Bill 774 directs the Home Care Commission (HCC) to adopt a statewide plan to address increasing participation in the home care registry, increasing the number of home care workers, continuing creation of a career ladder to help home care workers become more skilled and gain certifications, conducting orientation sessions for home care workers, and developing an outreach and marketing strategy. The bill encourages implementation of a single online application for all home care workers to apply to the registry and assignment of a universal provider number to each home care worker. The bill requires DHS to report, beginning in 2015, to an interim legislative committee by December 1st each year on the status of implementing an online application and assigning unique provider numbers to home care workers. An existing HCC subcommittee is charged with investigating the feasibility and benefits of certifying home care workers, ways to remove barriers to entry in the workforce, strategies for creating a career ladder, and ways to increase the number of home care workers on the registry. The bill requires the HCC to report the findings of this investigation to an interim legislative committee by November 16, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 6 --McLane, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett)

SB 844 A-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/3/2015** **Lininger**

Establishes the 15-member Task Force on Researching the Medical and Public Health Properties of Cannabis and specifies the duties of the Task Force. Requires the Task Force to develop recommendations and report to the Legislature by December 15, 2015, and then again by February 1, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 6 --McLane, Smith, Whitsett, Johnson, Thomsen, Whitsett)

SB 898 B-Eng. **JWM** **dp** **7/3/2015** **Komp**

SB 898 relates to the "fifth year high school" programs where students who have met the requirements for graduation but who stay enrolled in high school while attending a post-secondary institution; and the school district receives funds through the State School Fund and the school formula. This bill suspends adding any further districts to those that already have existing programs and receive State School Fund resources for the 2015-16 school year. School districts could still receive funds for students that have not been in 9-12 for more than four years, or has been in grades 9-12 for more than a total of four years because he/she has not satisfied the diploma requirements, is satisfying the requirements for a modified or extended diploma or has satisfied the requirements for a modified diploma or extended diploma, but not satisfied the requirements for a high school diploma. After the 2015-16 school year the practice returns to the current law without further legislative action. It is anticipated that there will be a review of these types of programs and the Legislature would have the opportunity to address it during the 2016 legislative session. SB 159 B-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/3/2015** **Buckley**
 Revises procedures for the preparation of the Governor's and the Legislatively Adopted budgets. Clarifies and updates language regarding state budget processes. **House Amendment Resolves conflicts.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Exc., 2 --Gomberg, Whitsett)

SB 900 C-Eng. **JWM** **dpa PE** **7/3/2015** **Lively**
 Agency: Oregon Health Authority Senate Bill 900 requires OHA to post to its website, at least annually, health care information to empower consumers to make economically sound and medically appropriate decisions. The bill requires OHA to apply for donations, gifts, and grants to pay the cost of posting this information. The bill specifies that OHA's obligation to post this information to its website is limited to the funds appropriated for this purpose or collected from donation, gifts and grants. (Committee Vote: Aye, 20; Nay, 2 --Shields, Steiner Hayward; Exc., 2 -Gomberg, Whitsett)
