<u>SB 379 B-Eng.</u>	<u>SJUD</u>	Concur	5/28/2015	Prozanski
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Updates probate statutes relating to wills and intestate estates. Creates process for introducing writing as will, revocation of will, or addition to will when execution requirements are not met if writing establishes intention by clear and convincing evidence and certain procedural requirements are met. Creates avenue for inheritance for child conceived posthumously when decedent's will or trust provides for posthumous conception, written permission for use of genetic material is given prior to death, and child is in utero within two years of decedent's death. Allows continuation of wills executed by domestic partners should such partners later marry. Defines "generation" as a group of humans that constitute a single step in a line of descent from an ancestor. Replaces "degrees of kinship" language with "generation" descriptions. Allows express limitation or exclusion of individual or class within will. Specifies that termination of parental rights is included as forfeiture of share by parent. Requires diligent search and inquiry prior to property escheating to state. Clarifies statute on rights of child adopted after domestic partners marry. Requires signatures of witness to will to hear or observe testator direct another to sign will, and sign the will within a reasonable time before testator's death. Allows contemporaneously executed affidavits to be counted as signatures. Prohibits electronic documents as formal will. Allows digital statement or list disposing of household items, furniture, furnishings, and personal effects. Prohibits disposal of money, business property, or certificates of title through digital writing. Clarifies statutes on enforcement of no-contest clauses, partial revocation of will, and inheritance under slayer or abuser statutes. **House Amendment Clarifies provisions for inheritance by posthumously conceived child.** (House Vote: Ayes, 50; Absent, 1--Gallegos; Excused, 2--Gorsek, McKeown; Excused for Business of the House, 7--Bentz, Buckley, Davis, Komp, Lininger, Vega Pederson, Speaker Kotek.)

<u>SB 440 B-Eng.</u>	<u>SHC</u>	Concur	5/29/2015	Monnes Anderson
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Requires the Oregon Health Policy Board to develop a strategic plan for collection and use of healthcare data and to establish the Health Plan Quality Metrics Committee (Committee). Directs the Committee to develop health outcomes and quality measures for the coordinated care organizations (CCOs) and plans offered by the Public Employees' Benefit Board and the Oregon Educators Benefit Board and to publish the data. Requires the Oregon Health Authority to give CCOs a three-month advance notice before changing health outcomes and quality measures in their contracts. Eliminates the metrics and scoring committee. Grants exclusive authority for Governor to appoint members of the Health Plan Quality Metrics Committee. Further identifies specific membership composition. Adds Oregon Health Authority to work in collaboration with the committee. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Grants exclusive**

**SB 331 A-Eng. SRULES do pass as amended, print 6/1/2015 Shields
engrossed**

Directs Department of Corrections (DOC) to determine last-known address, only if address is known or available to inmate, and only for inmates who are in custody after effective date of Act, and submit information to Secretary of State (SOS). Directs SOS to adjust population data reported in federal decennial census to reflect residence status of inmates before incarceration. Requires Legislative Assembly or SOS, whichever is applicable, to reapportion state into legislative districts based on adjusted population data. Requires use of adjusted population data to apportion county or municipal boundaries. Clarifies that adjusted population data is only to be used for apportioning state into legislative districts and for no other purpose. **Senate Amendment Requires Department of Corrections to determine last-known address, only if address is known or available to the inmate, and only for inmates who are in custody after effective date of Act. Clarifies that adjusted population data is only to be used for apportioning state into legislative districts and for no other purpose.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Ferrioli)

SB 966 SRULES do pass 6/2/2015 Ferrioli

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to develop and administer, or enter into contract with private entity to develop and administer, training program for members, administrators or directors of boards, commissions and small entities of executive department. Lists requirements of training program. Requires each new member and new administrator or director of board, commission or small entity of executive department to attend training within six months of start of member's service or administrator or director's employment. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Boquist)

Extends by four years period during which universities with institutional governing boards must participate in shared services relating to listed employee benefits and collective bargaining. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Specifies that during period public university is required to participate in shared services, university must provide same scope and overall value of certain employee benefits as required by specified statutes.**

Allows claim against state for wrongful death when death occurred within course and scope of decedent's employment, person responsible for death is convicted of murder or found guilty except for insanity, and decedent was not employed by public body at time of death. Applies only to claims based on crimes committed on or after May 1, 2012. Repeals ability to bring claim on January 2, 2017. Requires revived claim be brought within one year of effective date. Declares emergency; effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Thatcher)

Creates conditions under which protected health information may be disclosed by a healthcare provider without obtaining an authorization from the individual or a personal representative. Specifies information that may be disclosed by healthcare provider for an individual being treated for mental illness. Specifies that healthcare provider making disclosure is not subject to any civil liability. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Adds that healthcare provider who makes disclosure is not subject to any civil liability. Names legislation Susanna Blake Gabay Act.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

Allows district school board to enter into transactions that are expected to reduce cost to district for school facilities. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Clarifies that district school board may enter into an agreement or take any other action that would allow**

Requires Secretary of State conduct audit related to Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC). Details audit requirements. Requires Secretary of State submit report on audit to interim legislative committees on education by January 15, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Requires Secretary of State audit additionally address: TSPC resources, specified licensing and educator oversight responsibilities; recommendations for improvement; TSPC's governance role in setting expectations, ensuring accountability, and acting transparently. Changes required date that report be submitted. Revises teacher leader license requirements.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gelser)

Requires applicant for registration by State Marine Board (Board) as outfitter and guide to submit affidavit disclosing criminal convictions. Permits Board to take action for serious or repeated violations of small watercraft statutes and convictions of certain crimes. Directs Board to revoke registration if outfitter and guide is convicted of certain other crimes. Authorizes Board to take action before operative date. Applies to applications for initial or renewed registration received by

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Board on or after effective date. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote:
Aye, 5)
