<a href="#"><u>SB 840 B-Eng.</u></a>	<a href="#"><u>SHSEC</u></a>	<b>Concur</b>	<b>5/29/2015</b>	<b>Gelser</b>
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Authorizes licensed independent practitioner to initiate or approve prehearing detention in hospital or nonhospital facility of person who is subject of civil commitment proceedings. Defines and standardizes "licensed independent practitioner." **House Amendment Standardizes references to be consistent with licensed independent practitioner.** (House Vote: Ayes, 55; Nays, 1-- Post; Excused, 4--Barton, Gallegos, Heard, Piluso.)

<a href="#"><u>SB 908 B-Eng.</u></a>	<a href="#"><u>SJUD</u></a>	<b>Concur</b>	<b>6/2/2015</b>	<b>Prozanski</b>
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Modifies expungement statute. Prohibits offenders from seeking expungement for ten years if probationary sentence was revoked for non-compliance. Prohibits expungement of Assault 3 if victim was under 10 years of age at time of offense. Adds Class B felony possession of controlled substance offenses to list of expungable offenses. Allows one non-motor vehicle violation without re-tolling expungement period. Eliminates repetitive and duplicative language. **House Amendment Replaces "traffic violation" with "motor vehicle violation" to be consistent with original statute.** (House Vote: Ayes, 58; Nays, 2--Barreto, Weidner.)

 Removes State Parks and Recreation Department's authority to exercise power of eminent domain over certain lands situated within boundaries of Willamette River Greenway. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Olsen)

 Allows circuit court judge to authorize execution of search warrant outside of issuing court's judicial district if search relates to elder abuse offense, the object of search is financial records, and proper place for trial on offense is not known. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

 Clarifies that consensual sexual contact between elderly person and employee of facility who is also spouse of elderly person is not sexual abuse. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

**HB 2317 A-Eng.**                      **SJUD**                                      **do pass**    **6/3/2015**    **Prozanski**  
 Provides that prosecution for crimes of rape in the first degree, sodomy in the first degree, unlawful sexual penetration in the first degree and sexual abuse in the first degree may be commenced within 12 years after commission of offense. Specifies that if victim was minor at time of offense, prosecution may be commenced either within 12 years or before victim attains 30 years of age. Prescribes that bill applies to offenses committed before, on or after act, but that act does not operate to revive previously barred prosecutions. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

 Authorizes Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board (Board) to impose fine of not more than \$100 on any permit or license holder regulated by Board for administrative or clerical violation that does not create risk of harm to public. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Olsen)

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HB 2762 A-Eng.      SED      do pass      6/3/2015      Rosenbaum

Requires school district by July 1, 2021 eliminate use of polystyrene foam plates, trays, food containers or food packaging in service of breakfast or lunch at school site unless school district participates in recycling program for polystyrene foam. Requires districts that use polystyrene in service of meals during 2014-2015 school year to establish plan to eliminate use of polystyrene or participate in recycling program for polystyrene by 2021. Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) provide extension for compliance to school district able to show financial hardship experienced from complying with prohibition on use of polystyrene. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 6; Exc., 1 --Gelser)

Defines terms. Modernizes language. Prohibits property line adjustment on land zoned for exclusive farm use, forest use or mixed farm and forest use to adjust property line that resulted from subdivision or partition authorized by waiver so that any unit of land affected is larger than: two acres if land is high-value farmland or forestland or is within ground water restricted area; or five acres if land is not high-value farmland or forestland or within ground water restricted area. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Olsen)

HB 2889 B-Eng.      SHSEC      do pass as amended, print engrossed      6/2/2015      Olsen

Directs Department of Human Services (DHS) to permit and monitor savings accounts for children age 12 or older in DHS custody, via rulemaking. Entitles children in DHS custody for six months or more, to assistance establishing savings accounts. Prohibits DHS or other legal guardian from establishing accounts on behalf of child. Allows DHS to monitor use of child's money relating to state and federal benefits. **Senate Amendment Removes requirement that Department of Human Services (DHS) actively encourage use of savings accounts. Clarifies that assistance establishing accounts is to be provided by DHS. Adds provisions establishing child's capacity to contract, enabling financial institutions to permit youth to make deposits and withdrawals, and to rely on youth's signature. Removes references to child care agencies and foster parents.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

Directs Department of Human Services to provide for participation in extracurricular activities for children in its care, in coordination with agencies and foster parents. Defines "extracurricular activities." Defines "reasonable and prudent parenting standards." **Senate Amendment Specifies youth chooses activity. Clarifies summer camp or church activities alone do not constitute extracurricular activity. Changes "church activities" to "religious services."** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

Removes requirement for contracting agency to reserve moneys for including green energy technology in constructing, reconstructing or renovating public building if contracting agency determines including green energy technology is not appropriate for a particular construction or renovation project. Requires contracting agency to report to Department of Energy amount that would have been spent on green energy technology had contracting agency determined that including green energy technology was appropriate and use that money for green energy technology in a future construction or renovation project. Requires Department of Energy to report annually to Legislative Assembly on contracting agency compliance with reporting mandates. Declares emergency, effective on passage. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

Provides options for name change after marriage or after entering into registered domestic partnership. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

Modifies requirements for composition of boards of directors of regional air quality control authorities. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Olsen)

Deletes language prohibiting the promotion or advertisement of outdoor mass gathering without a permit. Clarifies circumstances when permanent development may occur on land where mass outdoor gathering takes place. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

Limits enforceability of noncompetition agreements to 18 months. Applies to noncompetition agreements entered into on or after January 1, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

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- HB 3242 A-Eng.**      **SBT**      **do pass**      **6/3/2015**      **Monroe**  
 Allows Mortuary and Cemetery Board to grant temporary operating permit for purpose of performing interment in cemetery that does not have a valid license. Restricts granting temporary permit to situations in which there is existing prearrangement sales contract. Directs Board to adopt rules regarding temporary operating permits. Sunsets authority to grant temporary operating permit on January 1, 2018. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 3; Exc., 2 --Beyer, Thomsen)

- HB 3244 A-Eng.**      **SBT**      **do pass**      **6/3/2015**      **Girod**  
 Provides that borrower or borrower's agent may rely on lender's payoff statement for purpose of establishing amount borrower must pay to satisfy obligation under real estate loan agreement unless borrower delivers an amended payoff statement. Provides that lender may recover amount borrower owes that did not appear on payoff statement or amended payoff statement only as unsecured debt or by foreclosing other property securing the obligation. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

- HB 3274 A-Eng.**      **SBT**      **do pass**      **6/3/2015**      **Riley**  
 Directs Oregon Business Development Department to conduct study on methods to expand broadband and telecommunications infrastructure in rural cities and counties. Requires Department to submit report to interim legislative committees by December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

- HB 3455 A-Eng.**      **SBT**      **do pass**      **6/3/2015**      **Girod**  
 Increases membership of All-Terrain Vehicle Advisory Committee from 14 to 16 members, adding one representative of a rural fire protection district and one representative of emergency medical services providers. Directs Parks and Recreation Department to establish and operate outreach program to inform law enforcement agencies, rural fire protection districts and emergency medical services providers about the grant process for moneys from the All-Terrain Vehicle Account. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

- HB 3488**      **SBT**      **do pass**      **6/3/2015**      **Girod**  
 Requires proceeds of fee, commission, or other payment to declarant or other person upon transfer of interest in real property to be used exclusively to benefit property or support activities directly benefiting property residents in order for affordable housing covenant, servitude, easement, condition or restriction to be exempt from prohibition of such fee, commission, or other payment. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

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
