prosecution may be commenced either within 12 years or before victim attains 30 years of age.
Prescribes that bill applies to offenses committed before, on or after act, but that act does not

Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) provide extension for compliance to school district able to show financial hardship experienced from complying with prohibition on use of polystyrene. Prohibits property line adjustment on land zoned for exclusive farm use, forest use or mixed farm and forest use to adjust property line that resulted from subdivision or partition authorized by waiver so that any unit of land affected is larger than: two acres if land is high-value farmland or forestland or is within ground water restricted area; or five acres if land is not high-value farmland or forestland or within ground water restricted area. Directs Department of Human Services (DHS) to permit and monitor savings accounts for children age 12 or older in DHS custody, via rulemaking. Entitles children in DHS custody for six months or more, to assistance establishing savings accounts. Prohibits DHS or other legal guardian from establishing accounts on behalf of child. Allows DHS to monitor use of child's money relating to state and federal benefits. Senate Amendment Removes requirement that Department of Human Services (DHS) actively encourage use of savings accounts. Clarifies that assistance establishing accounts is to be provided by DHS. Adds provisions establishing child's capacity to contract, enabling financial institutions to permit youth to make deposits and withdrawals, and to rely on youth's signature. Removes references to child care agencies and foster parents. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

Allows Mortuary and Cemetery Board to grant temporary operating permit for purpose of performing interment in cemetery that does not have a valid license. Restricts granting temporary permit to situations in which there is existing prearrangement sales contract. Directs Board to adopt rules regarding temporary operating permits.
