Establishes procedures for electing precinct committeepersons (PCP). Requires one PCP for every 250 electors, rather than for every 500 electors, registered in precinct. Provides that write-in candidate may be eligible for election to PCP position if there is no other candidate. Requires write-in candidate to accept successful write-in candidacy before primary election, rather than after election. Requires certain carriers, Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to report to the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) proportion of carrier's and board's total medical expenses allocated to primary care. Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and DCBS to submit report to Legislative Assembly on the information provided by the carriers and the boards. Requires OHA to convene primary care payment reform collaborative to advise and assist authority in developing Primary Care Transformation Initiative. Specifies membership. Repeals reporting requirement December 31, 2018. Limits the anti-trust exemption to participants in the primary reform collaboration. Specifies actions that are subject to immunity.

Requires insurer to notify provider that the enrollee is in a grace period when enrollee fails to pay premium for the qualified health plan, if the provider requests information regarding coverage, eligibility or benefits. Specifies conditions that requires insurer to reimburse provider for services performed during the grace period when coverage is terminated. Specifies requirements may not be waived by agreement or contract. Directs insurer, upon inquiries from provider, to respond that coverage is provided. Requires that a provider request the information from the insurer not more than seven (7) business days before providing the service and that the insurer provides the information to the provider no later than two (2) business days after the request is made. Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to produce written materials for consumers about paying premiums and distribute to providers upon request. **House Amendment Adds the requirement that a provider request the information from the insurer not more than 7 business days before providing the service and that the insurer provides the information to the provider no later than 2 business days after the request is made.** (House Vote: Ayes, 50; Nays, 1--Post; Excused, 3--Esquivel, Gorsek, Taylor; Excused for Business of the House, 6--Bentz, Buckley, Davis, Hayden, McKeown, Vega Pederson.)

Permits the Oregon Medical Board (OMB) to issue a limited license to practice medicine to physicians who are licensed in another state or country and who hold a full-time professor appointment at a school of medicine in Oregon. Specifies that OMB can only issue eight licenses in a four-year period. Operative date is January 1, 2016. Declares an emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Specifies additional criteria to be used by OMB in issuing a limited license. SB 475 **JWM** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Thomsen**
The measure requires that students in youth care centers within a detention facility receive educational services through the Juvenile Detention Education Program (JDEP). The measure will allow the provider of the educational services within the detention facility to claim the students in the youth care centers as part of the Average Daily Membership (ADM) which is used to calculate the distribution of State School Funds. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Exc., 3 --McLane, Read, Girod)

HB 2266 **SFR** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Hass**
Specifies that vehicle dealers may be exempted from weight-mile taxes when operating a vehicle owned or controlled by the dealer, the vehicle is displaying dealer plates, and is being operated for test driving purposes while unloaded. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Edwards)

HB 2316 C-Eng. **SFR** **do pass as amended, print engrossed** **6/12/2015** **Boquist**
Increases fee amounts charged by justice courts for various filings. Creates perpetuation deposition for material witnesses. **Senate Amendment The amendment allows for court proceedings to be recorded in other means than audio or stenographic only. That allowance is for municipal courts as well as justice courts. The amendment also makes**

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language consistent with HB 3399. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

HB 2448 B-Eng. **SFR** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Baertschiger Jr**

Modifies the conservation program by requiring owners of projects with a cost of at least \$1 million to enter into a performance agreement and receive annual recertification. Requires information to be included in the recertification application. Allows the Department of Energy to inspect such projects. Applies to certifications submitted on or after September 1, 2015 and to tax year 2015 and later. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Edwards)

HB 2478 B-Eng. **SRULES** **do pass as amended** **6/12/2015** **Rosenbaum**

Makes statutory changes to achieve gender neutral language with respect to legally recognized marriages. **Senate Amendment Resolves conflict with Senate Bill 604, 2015.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 3; Nay, 2 --Ferrioli, Boquist)

HB 2492 A-Eng. **SFR** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Edwards**

Authorizes the issuance of pass-through revenue bonds for projects outside of the State of Oregon. Defines term "within this state" relating to the construction of structures by institutions eligible to receive pass-through financing under the authority of the Oregon Facilities Authority. Clarifies measure does not prohibit financing more than one structure. (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

HB 2832 B-Eng. **SBT** **do pass as amended, print engrossed** **6/12/2015** **Monroe**

Requires governing board or entity of public or private postsecondary institution to evaluate contract with third party financial firm based on recommendations from United States Department of Education (DOE) and Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB). Clarifies that third party financial firms are for disbursement and management services of financial aid funds, or for management of financial accounts. Specifies contract may not include revenue sharing, per-use transaction fee on debit card, fee for initial disbursement via paper check or electronic funds transfer and account inactivity fee. Requires contract to be made public and posted on web site of postsecondary institution. Requires public university or community college contracting with third party financial firm to undertake reasonable efforts to establish collaboration agreements with other institutions. **Senate Amendment Defines the financial terms 'account,' 'financial aid funds' and 'financial aid refund disbursement process' for this provision. Clarifies that third party financial firms are for disbursement and management services of financial aid funds, or for management of financial accounts. Removes private right of action provision.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Beyer)

HB 2927 A-Eng. **SFR** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Riley**

Increases the High Cost Disabilities (HCD) Grant to \$35 million per school year. First applies to the 2015-16 State School Fund (SSF) distribution. Takes effect on July 1, 2015. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Edwards)

HB 3084 A-Eng. **SRULES** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Beyer**

Authorizes owner of tract within incorporated boundaries of City of Damascus to withdraw tract from city in certain circumstances. Requires filing of request for withdrawal with mayor and governing body, Metro and Department of Land Conservation and Development. Requires determination of absence of undue hardship on operation of city at time of request for withdrawal. Requires public hearing on withdrawal of tract within 30 days of receipt of request and specifies public notification requirement. Authorizes determination on withdrawal within 30 days after receiving public testimony. Details process if withdrawal is approved or rejected. Provides that determination by governing body, or withdrawal of tract due to failure of governing body to make timely determination, may be appealed to circuit court. Prohibits city from annexing withdrawn tract for 10 years. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Nay, 1 --Ferrioli)

HB 3085 A-Eng. **SRULES** **do pass as amended, print engrossed** **6/12/2015** **Beyer**

Requires City of Damascus to surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist on 61 st day after election. Requires city to satisfy all outstanding legal debts and obligations and expend all moneys as provided by law and to convey all real property and tangible and intangible personal property to Clackamas County, no sooner than the 30th day after election. Refers Act to people of City of Damascus for their approval or rejection at next primary election held throughout the state. Requires majority of voters voting on Act to approve law. **Senate Amendment Refers question of disincorporation to voters in City of Damascus, at next primary election. Requires city to surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist on 61st day after election. Requires city, no sooner than the 30th day after election, to satisfy all debts, obligations, liabilities, expenses, transfer real property, tangible and intangible personal property and moneys to Clackamas County.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Nay, 1 --Ferrioli)

Requires City of Damascus to distribute to ad valorem property taxpayers all excess moneys remaining in city funds after satisfying all outstanding legal debts and obligations of city. Takes effect only if House Bill 3085 (2015) disincorporating City of Damascus is approved by majority of people of city voting in next primary election held throughout this state. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Requires City of Damascus satisfy all debts, obligations, liabilities, expenses, transfer real property, tangible and intangible personal property and moneys to Clackamas County, no sooner than 30th day after election. Changes timeline for distribution and property tax years used to calculate amount of money to be distributed to ad valorem property taxpayers of excess moneys remaining in city funds.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Nay, 1 --Ferrioli)

HB 3382 A-Eng.SENRdo pass as amended, print 6/12/2015

Edwards

Defines Willamette Valley Protected District (District). Directs College of Agricultural Sciences (College) at Oregon State University to use field monitoring and research of canola to identify acreages on which canola can be grown within District. Allows State Department of Agriculture (Department) to authorize up to 500 acres for growing canola for commercial purposes within District provided it is on acreage identified by College that was not used for growing canola under chapter 724, Oregon Laws 2013 (Research Area); grown in manner determined to be compatible with growing of other crops; and under same conditions imposed by College for Research Area. Allows Department to assess civil penalty up to \$25,000 against person who grows canola without authorization. Requires Department to develop and report recommendations regarding means for coexistence of production of canola and other crops, including recommendations for legislation, to Legislature no later than November 15, 2018. Requires College to submit specified information for review by experts having sufficient knowledge of vegetable seed production to provide evaluation of research. Requires assessment to include review of published material from certain areas. Sunsets authorization to grow 500 acres of canola for commercial purposes per year in District on January 2, 2020. Extends sunset from January 2, 2019 to July 1, 2019 for law imposing general prohibition on growing of canola in District. **Senate Amendment Stipulates 500 acres for growing canola for commercial purposes grown per year must be on acreage not used for growing canola under chapter 724, Oregon Laws 2013 (Research Area); grown in manner determined to be compatible with growing of other crops; and under same conditions imposed by College of Agriculture Sciences of Oregon State University (College) under Research Area. Requires Department of Agriculture to develop and report recommendations regarding means for coexistence of production of canola and other crops, including recommendations for legislation, to Legislature no later than November 15, 2018. Requires College to submit information for review by experts having sufficient knowledge of vegetable seed production to provide evaluation of research. Requires assessment to include review of published material from certain areas.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Olsen)

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HB 3499 B-Eng. **JWM** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Roblan**
 Establishes advisory group to develop uniform budget coding requirements and reporting requirements. This advisory group on January 2, 2016. The State Board of Education is required to adopt rules related to uniform budget coding requirements no later than January 1, 2016.

HB 3542 A-Eng. **SFR** **do pass** **6/15/2015** **Riley**
 Requires chief sponsor or proponent to submit the policy purpose for measures that create or expand tax credits. Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to identify and prepare analysis on those existing tax credits in which the actual revenue impact has exceeded the initial projected impact by 10% or more and include that information in the biennial report called for in ORS 173.025.
