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Authorizes person who is licensed with concealed carry permit to present valid concealed carry license to peace officer in lieu of presenting firearm for inspection. Removes portions of law stating that failure to present firearm upon request constitutes reason to believe person has committed crime. **House Amendment Removes portions of law stating that failure to present firearm upon request constitutes reason to believe person has committed crime.** (House Vote: Ayes, 49; Excused, 4--Esquivel, Gorsek, Smith Warner, Taylor; Excused for Business of the House, 7--Bentz, Davis, McKeown, Piluso, Vega Pederson, Weidner, Speaker Kotek.)

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Grants the Labor Commissioner discretion over preparation of formal charges in certain situations. Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to report to Legislative Assembly by February 1, 2017, on resolution of complaints in two-year period prior to effective date and on those complaints after implementation of measure. Sunsets provisions of measure October 1, 2017. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **House Amendment Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to report to Legislative Assembly by February 1, 2017, on resolution of complaints in two-year period prior to effective date and on those complaints after implementation of measure. 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Permits insurer, under certain conditions, to post insurance policy and endorsements on insurer's website in lieu of mailing or delivering insurance policy and endorsements to insured. **House Amendment Provides exemption from the consent and notice requirements of the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act.** (House Vote: Ayes, 51; Excused, 3--Esquivel, Gorsek, Taylor; Excused for Business of the House, 6--Bentz, Buckley, Davis, Hayden, McKeown, Vega Pederson.)

Prohibits law enforcement from duplicating or copying data from portable electronic device without warrant or consent. Defines terms. Authorizes court to order law enforcement to purge certain duplicated data if defendant files motion for return of property. Exempts correctional facilities, state hospital, community corrections, and probation officers from prohibition acting in otherwise lawful manner. **House Amendment Changes "appropriate consent" to "lawful consent." Exempts correctional facilities, state hospital, community corrections, and probation officers from prohibition on forensic imaging to the extent those agencies are engaged in otherwise lawful conduct.** (House Vote: Ayes, 44; Nays, 4--Barton, Boone, Gilliam, Rayfield; Excused, 4--Esquivel, Gorsek, Smith Warner, Taylor; Excused for Business of the House, 8--Bentz, Davis, Hayden, McKeown, Nathanson, Piluso, Vega Pederson, Speaker Kotek.)

Requires chief sponsor or proponent to submit the policy purpose for measures that create or expand tax credits. Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to identify and prepare analysis on those existing tax credits in which the actual revenue impact has exceed the initial projected impact by 10% or more and include that information in the biennial report called for in ORS 173.025.

Alters definition of "public official." Prohibits Governor, First Partner, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General and Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries from receiving money or other consideration for speaking engagement or presentation. Requires Deputy Secretary of State, First Partner and all policy advisors and attorneys employed by Governor's office to file statement of economic interest. Increases civil penalty for willful abuse of official position by public official. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 3; Exc., 2 --Ferrioli, Beyer)

Allows Oregon Opportunity Grants to be awarded to highest need students when funds are insufficient to award all eligible students. Guarantees second year award to students who reapply and meet eligibility requirements including progress to degree/certification and maintain a certain grade point. Permits development of program to provide additional incentives for students completing 15 or more credits per term. Requires Office of Student Access and Completion to inform post-secondary institutions of qualified students attending institution for purpose of providing academic counseling and guidance. Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to report annually to Legislative Assembly regarding academic success and performance of qualified students. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 17; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Girod, Whitsett; Exc., 4 --Smith, Shields, Thomsen, Winters)

Authorizes Department of Environmental Quality to use money in Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund to buy or refinance debt obligations of public agencies for all projects otherwise eligible for financial assistance through Fund. Extends loan term that may be authorized by Environmental Quality Commission from 20 to 30 years. (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 2 --Whitsett, Whitsett; Exc., 4 --Smith, Shields, Thomsen, Winters)
