<a href="#"><u>HB 3464 B-Eng.</u></a>	<a href="#"><u>HB3464</u></a>	<b>Concur, Further Amend &amp; Repass.</b>	6/30/2015	Monnes Anderson
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Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to adopt rules regarding time frames within which a pregnant medical assistance recipient, reimbursed under fee-for-service, needs general or specialty dental care. Specifies services and criteria to be covered and that the fee-for-service time frames are to be the same as pregnant recipients in coordinated care organizations and dental care organizations. Directs OHA to report to the Legislative Assembly no later than February 1, 2017. Repeals the reporting requirement February 1, 2019. Establishes January 1, 2016 as the operative date. **Committee Amendment Adds "an initial dental screening" as criteria for pregnant medical assistance recipient to receive or be referred for specialty dental care. Modifies OHA's time frame fee-for-service reimbursement requirement to be the same as, or shorter than, the time frames for coordinated care and dental care organizations. Changes OHA's reporting requirement from December 1, 2016 to February 1, 2017; and changes the repeal of the reporting requirement from January 2, 2017 to February 1, 2019.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 6)

Directs Department of Revenue to distribute funds previously transferred to the Shared Services Fund. Modifies distribution of income tax revenue estimated from wages associated with Strategic Investment Program projects. Extends allocation of identified income tax revenue from 2019 to 2029. Modifies implementation of sunset by making agreements for eligible projects reached prior to the sunset date eligible for payments for the life of the agreement. **Senate Amendment Replaces the bill. It changes calculations to include 20% of the total annual amount of personal income tax revenue attributable to retained jobs, down from 50%. Caps annual Shared Services Fund payments to any one county at \$16 million. Extends program sunset to July 15, 2024, after which distributions are prohibited. Adds later timelines for calendar year 2105 to allow this year's distribution to be made under the new requirements.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 22; Nay, 2 --Burdick, Girod)

Establishes the 15-member Task Force on Researching the Medical and Public Health Properties of Cannabis and specifies the duties of the Task Force. Requires the Task Force to develop recommendations and report to the Legislature by December 15, 2015, and then again by February 1, 2016. (Committee Vote: Aye, 18; Nay, 6 --McLane, Smith, Whitsett, Johnson, Thomsen, Whitsett)

SB 898 relates to the "fifth year high school" programs where students who have met the requirements for graduation but who stay enrolled in high school while attending a post-secondary institution; and the school district receives funds through the State School Fund and the school formula. This bill suspends adding any further districts to those that already have existing programs and receive State School Fund resources for the 2015-16 school year. School districts could still receive funds for students that have not been in 9-12 for more than four years, or has been in grades 9-12 for more than a total of four years because he/she has not satisfied the diploma requirements, is satisfying the requirements for a modified or extended diploma or has satisfied the requirements for a modified diploma or extended diploma, but not satisfied the requirements for a high school diploma. After the 2015-16 school year the practice returns to the current law without further legislative action. It is anticipated that there will be a review of these types of programs and the Legislature would have the opportunity to address it during the 2016 legislative session. **Senate Amendment Replaces the bill.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 3 --McLane, Whisnant, Girod)

 Changes name of Multimodal Transportation Fund to Connect Oregon Fund. Revises definition of "transportation project" for purposes of Fund to include marine projects and to clarify that definition does not include operating costs or purchase of vehicles (as defined by ORS 801.590). Deletes provisions relating to loans made from Fund. Increases requirement for local project funding from 20 percent to 30 percent of project cost. Includes as part of project selection criteria whether project has useful life expectancy that offers maximum benefit to State. Prohibits Director of Oregon Department of Transportation from appointing member of final project review committee who represents entity that has application under consideration by committee or direct financial interest in application under final review. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 20; Exc., 4 --McLane, Read, Whitsett, Winters)

 Allows Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) to receive electronically transmitted documents necessary to do any of following: issue or transfer vehicle title; register or transfer registration of vehicle; issue registration plate or comply with odometer disclosure requirements. Specifies that, with exceptions, acknowledgement by notary public is not required for such transactions. Authorizes ODOT to adopt rules necessary to carry out provisions of measure. Specifies that automobile dealers may perform, and charge purchaser of vehicle for performing, any of following actions: verifying and clearing titles; perfecting, releasing or satisfying liens or other security interests; complying with federal security requirements or rendering any other service for purpose of complying with state and federal laws. Specifies that purchaser may negotiate amount of document processing fee, not to exceed \$150, if dealer uses integrator or \$115 if dealer does not use integrator. Requires dealer to prepare and submit all documents to complete transaction if fee is collected. **Senate Amendment Clarifies authority of vehicle dealer to elect to prepare, submit, or prepare and submit documents and to collect a document processing fee for following purposes: verify and clear title; perfect, release or satisfy lien or other security interest; comply with federal security requirements or render any other services for purpose of complying with state and federal laws related to sale of vehicle. Specifies that purchaser may negotiate amount of document processing fee, not to exceed \$150, if dealer uses integrator or \$115 if dealer does not use integrator. Requires dealer to prepare and submit all documents to complete transaction if fee is collected.**

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**Conforms definition of "integrator" to ORS 802.600 and deletes references in ORS 802.600 to Chapter 583, Oregon Laws 1997.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 4; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

Requires replacement electronic benefits transfer card (EBT card) to display names of individual to whom card was issued. Requires use of card for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits and Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. Removes current direct deposit option. Excludes certain SNAP benefits to senior citizens and Social Security Income checks. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

Requires Oregon State Lottery Commission to hold payment of lottery prizes in excess of \$600 to recipients who have received overpayment of supplemental nutritional assistance, public assistance, or medical assistance and for which a warrant has been issued. Specifies 30-day hold on payments. Requires notification of hold to person and agency. Requires disbursement of prize if agency does not initiate garnishment proceeding within 30-days' time or upon notification from agency that garnishment action will not be initiated. Requires development of data match system. Prioritizes recovery of past-due child support amounts over recovery of overpayments of support. Applies to warrants issued after effective date of Act. (Committee Vote: Aye, 23; Exc., 1 --Burdick)

HB 2455 levies a privilege tax on the harvesting of merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands. The bill sets the effective rates for a two calendar year period and those rates are applied to the harvested products by the thousand board feet, with the first 25,000 board feet harvested annually by any taxpayer excluded. There are four individual rates contained in the measure providing funding for the following purposes: (Committee Vote: Aye, 24)

Requires the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to develop recommendations for the creation of a premium assistance program for low-income Compact of Free Association (COFA) islanders to enable COFA residents of Oregon to purchase health benefit plans through the health insurance exchange. Directs DCBS to convene an advisory group to advise the department in developing these recommendations. Requires DCBS to report its recommendations to the Legislature by September 15, 2016. Sunsets on January 2, 2018. Takes effect on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 24)

 Provides that State Chief Information Officer (CIO) is the primary advisor to the Governor on information technology (IT) and telecommunications. Provides that State CIO duties are specified by the Governor. Transfers authority for IT and telecommunications policy, including planning, rulemaking, standard setting, and oversight from Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to State CIO. Retains DAS authority and responsibility for statewide IT and telecommunications operations and services but requires those operations and services to be provided in a manner consistent with the rules, policies and standards adopted by the State CIO. Retains DAS authority for IT procurement. Provides authority for State CIO to review IT solicitation documents and all IT procurements over \$1 million, and to direct state agencies to include State CIO as contracting party on behalf of state. Provides authority for State CIO to approve, modify or stop IT projects and approve, suspend or cancel IT contracts over \$1 million. **Senate Amendment Resolves conflicts.** (Committee Vote: Aye, 24)
